- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 23-01 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to an eating disorder training program; and to provide for a report to the
- 3 legislative management regarding eating disorders.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 23-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
6 and enacted as follows:

## 7 Eating disorder training program.

8 The state department of health shall establish a training program to assist in early

9 <u>recognition and intervention of eating disorders. The program must be consistent with standards</u>

10 and practices of one or more nationally recognized organizations dealing with mental health and

11 <u>eating disorders. The department shall provide training program access information in the</u>

12 <u>department's regular communication with professionals who will benefit from this training</u>,

13 including physicians, physician assistants, nurses, dentists, dental hygienists, psychiatrists,

14 psychologists, social workers, and counselors and with schools that train these professionals.

## 15 SECTION 2. NORTH DAKOTA MENTAL HEALTH PLANNING COUNCIL STUDY OF

16 **EATING DISORDERS - REPORT TO THE LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT.** During the 2011-12

17 biennium, the department of human services' North Dakota mental health planning

18 <u>council</u>neuropsychiatric research institute shall study the issue of eating disorders in the state.

- 19 This study must include collection of data regarding the number of incidents of diagnosed eating
- 20 disorders in the state; an assessment of the adequacy of eating disorder training provided to
- 21 public school educators; an evaluation of the adequacy of the curriculum relating to eating
- 22 disorders in the state's medical and nursing education programs as well as in the continuing
- 23 education requirements for health care providers; a determination of strategies by which the
- 24 state can increase awareness of eating disorders, including symptoms, effects, and preventive

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1 interventions; an assessment of the cost of treatment incurred by eating disorder patients which 2 is borne by the state's medical assistance program as well as by private health plans and 3 employers; an assessment of issues concerning access to care within the state for individuals 4 with eating disorders; and recommendations for strategies to improve education regarding 5 prevention of, early detection of, and treatment of eating disorders and an estimate of the fiscal 6 impact on the state and private payers for the implementation of such strategies; and 7 consideration of how the department of human services' North Dakota mental health planning-8 council and other state entities may identify other issues related to the objectives of this study. 9 The North Dakota mental health planning councilneuropsychiatric research institute shall make 10 its report of this study and any related recommendations to the legislative management before 11 August 1, 2012.
