- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 15.1-37 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to early childhood education programs; to amend and reenact sections
- 3 15.1-09-58 and 15.1-37-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to early childhood
- 4 education programs; and to provide an appropriation.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-09-58 of the North Dakota Century Code is

7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **15.1-09-58.** Prekindergarten program - Authorization - Support.

9 The board of a school district may establish a prekindergartenan early childhood education

10 program and may receive and expend any statesupport that program with:

- 11 <u>1.</u> Local tax revenues, other than those necessary to support the district's kindergarten
- 12 program and the provision of elementary and high school educational services;
- 13 <u>2.</u> <u>State</u> moneys specifically appropriated for the program, any federal;
- 14 <u>3.</u> <u>Federal</u> funds specifically appropriated or approved for the program, and any gifts; and
- 15 <u>4.</u> <u>Gifts</u>, grants, and donations specifically given for the program.

16 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-37-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

17 amended and reenacted as follows:

18 **15.1-37-01. Early childhood education program - Approval.**

19 Any person or school district operating an early childhood education program may request

20 approval of the program from the superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent shall

- 21 approve an early childhood education program if the program:
- 1. Is taught by individuals who are licensed to teach in early childhood education by the
- education standards and practices board <u>or approved to teach in early childhood</u>
- 24 <u>education by the education standards and practices board;</u>

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1	2.	Follows a developmentally appropriate curriculum; and			
2	3.	3. Is in compliance with all municipal and state health, fire, and safety requirements.			
3	Per student funding will not be provided to individuals or school districts offering a				
4	prekindergarten program; and				
5	<u>4.</u>	Limits its enrollment to children who have reached the age of four before August first			
6		of the year of enrollment.			
7	SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 15.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is created				
8	and enacted as follows:				
9	Early childhood education program - Facilities.				
10	A school district may operate an early childhood education program in a public school				
11	building if space is available or in any other setting that meets all local and state health, fire, and				
12	safety laws.				
13	SEC	SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 15.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
14	and enacted as follows:				
15	Early childhood education program - Requirements.				
16	To receive a grant for an early childhood education program operated under this chapter, a				
17	district shall:				
18	<u>1.</u>	Establish an early childhood education advisory council, in accordance with section 5			
19		of this Act;			
20	<u>2.</u>	Utilize an application process for the admission of students to the program;			
21	<u>3.</u>	Give admission priority to students who come from families with income levels that			
22		meet the eligibility requirements for free or reduced lunch programs;			
23	<u>4.</u>	Limit the size of each early childhood education class to twenty students:			
24	<u>5.</u>	Ensure that the adult-to-student ratio in each class does not exceed one to ten;			
25	<u>6.</u>	Provide a half-day or a full-day program with a duration at least equal to ninety full			
26		days of instruction;			
27	<u>7.</u>	Admit only those students whose parents permit the collection and dissemination of			
28		data regarding the cognitive, physical, and social development of the student; and			
29	<u>8.</u>	Meet the criteria for program approval established in section 15.1-37-01.			
30	SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 15.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is created				
31	and enacted as follows:				

1	School district early childhood education program - Advisory council -				
2	Establishment.				
3	<u>1.</u>	1. The superintendent of each school district operating an early childhood education			
4		program shall establish an early childhood education advisory council consisting of at			
5	least:				
6		a. <u>The dire</u>	ctor of a head start program serving the school district or the director's		
7		<u>designee</u>			
8		<u>b.</u> <u>An indivi</u>	dual who is a licensed child care or preschool provider located within		
9		the scho	ol district;		
10		<u>c.</u> <u>An indivi</u>	dual who owns or operates a business located within the school district;		
11		d. <u>The may</u>	or of the city in which the school district is headquartered or the mayor's		
12		<u>designee</u>	e; and		
13		e. <u>The pare</u>	ent of a child enrolled in the district's early childhood education program.		
14	<u>2.</u>	<u>The superintendent or the superintendent's designee shall serve as the chairman.</u>			
15	<u>3.</u>	3. The advisory council shall meet at the call of the chairman and shall provide advice			
16		and recommendations to the school district regarding matters such as coordination			
17	and cooperation with private sector early childhood education providers and head start				
18	programs, the admission of eligible children, opportunities to jointly address staff				
19	training needs, issues encountered by working families, communication and outreach				
20	services, facility usage, transportation, and any other matters that impact the provision				
21	of early childhood education services within the district.				
22	SEC	ION 6. APPF	OPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general		
23	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,500,000, or so much of the				
24	sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of				
25	providing grants to four school districts offering early childhood education programs, for the				
26	biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. The superintendent of public				
27	instruction shall distribute the grants during the second year of the biennium, according to the				
28	number of students each school district has in approved early childhood education programs.				
29	The grant payment per student may not exceed fifty percent of the per student payment rate				
30	established in section 15.1-27-04. The superintendent of public instruction may use up to				

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- 1 \$50,000 of the amount appropriated by this section to cover administrative costs and monitoring
- 2 expenses incurred as a result of the program.
