- 1 A BILL for an Act to establish a demonstration plant incentive grant program to produce-
- 2 transportation biofuel from sugar-based feedstock; and to provide a contingent appropriation.for
- 3 an Act to provide for the department of commerce to conduct a sugar-based feedstock biofuel
- 4 <u>demonstration plant feasibility study; and to provide an appropriation.</u>

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

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7	INCENTIVE GRANT PROGRAM - INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION. During the 2011-13 biennium,-
8	the industrial commission shall establish and administer a program to provide a grant to a
9	qualified applicant for the purpose of assisting the applicant with the costs associated with
10	acquiring or constructing facilities for, and operating, a demonstration plant to determine the
11	technological and economic attributes of producing transportation biofuel from multiple sugar-
12	based feedstock. A grant awarded under this program may not exceed \$7,000,000.
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14	certifying to the office of management and budget that an applicant has qualified for a grant,
15	there is appropriated out of any moneys in the resources trust fund in the state treasury, not
16	otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$7,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to-
17	the industrial commission for the purpose of providing a sugar-based feedstock biofuel
18	demonstration plant incentive grant in accordance with the provisions of section 1 of this Act, for-
19	the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.
20	SECTION 1. SUGAR-BASED FEEDSTOCK BIOFUEL DEMONSTRATION PLANT
21	FEASIBILITY STUDY.
22	1. During the 2011-13 interim, the department of commerce shall conduct a sugar-based
23	feedstock biofuel demonstration plant feasibility study.
24	2. The feasibility study must:

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1	a. Address the cost of a sugar-based feedstock biofuel demonstration plant;
2	b. Determine the nature and scope of existing and potential markets, both domestic
3	and international, for sugar-based feedstock biofuel;
4	c. Review federal laws, regulations, policies, and guidelines regarding biofuels; and
5	d. Examine the potential for obtaining loans, grants, and other incentives in order to
6	further the development of a sugar-based feedstock biofuel demonstration plant.
7	3. The department of commerce shall report its findings and recommendations, together
8	with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-third
9	legislative assembly.
10	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general
11	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,000, or so much of the sum
12	as may be necessary, to the department of commerce for the purpose of conducting a
13	sugar-based feedstock biofuel demonstration plant feasibility study as provided under section 1
14	of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.
