1 A concurrent resolution urging Congress to return to the riparian landowner land controlled by
2 the Army Corps of Engineers which is not necessary for authorized purposes.

3 **WHEREAS**, the economy and well-being of the residents of North Dakota are dependent
4 upon agriculture; and

5 **WHEREAS**, the United States, through the Army Corps of Engineers, has acquired certain
6 lands around the Missouri River water system, including Lake Oahe and Lake Sakakawea; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the Army Corps of Engineers has failed to control weeds and manage this land
8 properly; and

9 **WHEREAS**, the failure to control weeds on land managed by the Army Corps of Engineers
10 is a public nuisance and jeopardizes the public health, safety, and general welfare of the
11 residents of North Dakota; and

12 **WHEREAS**, in South Dakota, certain land that is not necessary for flood control by the
13 Army Corps of Engineers has been returned to the state and is managed by the state;

14 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE**
15 **HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:**

16 That the Sixty-second Legislative Assembly urges the Congress of the United States to
17 return to the riparian landowner land controlled by the Army Corps of Engineers which is not
18 necessary for authorized purposes; and

19 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this resolution
20 to the Commanding General of the Army Corps of Engineers and each member of the North
21 Dakota Congressional Delegation.
