- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 39-12-24 of the North Dakota Century Code,_
- 2 relating to cooperative <u>regional permit</u> agreements with regional states on excess size or weight
- 3 vehicles.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. Section 39-12-24 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as6 follows:

9	<u>1.</u>	In addition to any other powers granted by law, the colonel of the North Dakota			
10		highway patrol, or the colonel's designee, The superintendent and the director of the			
11		department of transportation, or the director's designee, are hereby authorized to			
12		negotiate and may enter into appropriate cooperative regional permit agreements with			
13		other states concerningany state that has enacted a law authorizing the agreement for			
14	1	the regional operation or movement of nondivisible oversize or overweight vehicles			
15		and to facilitate the uniform application, administration, and enforcement of applicable			
16		laws concerning suchnondivisible oversize or overweight vehicles.			
17	2.	A cooperative The agreement under this section may include the establishment of a

11			transportation may also impose additional standards concerning such regional		
12			permits as they deem appropriate, and as required in the agreement;

15			the applicable standards and requirements of such states, pursuant to the terms

5		authorized to appoint employees and officials of other states as agents of the			
6		department for the limited purpose of enforcing the laws of North Dakota under the			
7		terms of the cooperative agreements entered into under this section. The colonel of			
8		the North Dakota highway patrol or the colonel's designee, and the director of the			
9		department of transportation, or the director's designee, may promulgate such rules			
10		and regulations as are necessary for the implementation of the provisions of this			
11		section.			
12	<u>6.5.</u>	AnyThe agreement entered into under the provisions of this section shall contain			
13		provisionsmust provide that express the understanding that any employees and			
14		officials of any other statestate that is party to the agreement who administer or			
15		enforce the laws of North Dakota under the terms of such agreement, or who			
16		otherwise act under the terms of such the agreement, shall may not be eligible for			
17		compensation, employee rights, or benefits from the state of North Dakota and			
18		shallmay not be considered to be employees or officials of the state of North Dakota.			
19	<u>7.6.</u>	A cooperative The agreement under this section may also provide for uniformity			
20		concerninguniform procedures and standards for nondivisible oversize and overweight			
21		vehicles and regional permits, including enforcement procedures, safety inspection			
22		standards, operational standards, permit and application form procedures, and driver			
23		qualifications, and such other matters that may be pertinent to said matters.			
24	7.	The North Dakota highway patrol shall deposit all fees it may collect for regional			
25		permits on behalf of any state included in the agreement into a fund established as the			
26		regional permit fund. All moneys collected by the North Dakota highway patrol as fees			
27		for the issue of a regional permit and deposited into the regional permit fund are			
28		appropriated on a continuing basis for the purpose of paying each state included in the			
29		agreement for each state's respective share of the total fees collected for the regional			
30		permit. The North Dakota highway patrol shall deposit all moneys collected on behalf			

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1		of North Dakota for regional permits issued under this section into the state highway
2		fund in accordance with section 39-12-02.
3	8.	Notwithstanding any provision of this section to the contrary, all existingNorth Dakota
4		statutes and rules and regulations prescribing size or weight vehicle requirements, or
5		relating to permits for suchoversize or overweight vehicles, shall continue to beremain
6		in full force and effect until amended or repealed by law, and any cooperative the
7		agreement entered under this section must comply with suchNorth Dakota statutes
8		and rules and regulations.
