- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact sections 40-21-16.1, 40-21-16.2, and 40-21-16.3 of
- 2 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to canvassing city elections; and to amend and
- 3 reenact sections 40-08-08, 40-08-16, 40-09-07, and 40-09-10 of the North Dakota Century

4 Code, relating to city elections: to repeal section 40-09-07 of the North Dakota Century Code,

5 relating to the bond and oath of a city commissioner; and to declare an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 40-08-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is

8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 40-08-08. Vacancies on council - How filled.

10 If a vacancy occurs in a city council office by death, resignation, or otherwise, the city 11 council may call a special city election to fill the vacancy for the unexpired term, or may, after 12 fifteen days of the date of the vacancy appoint a person from the ward in which the council 13 member previously holding was elected or appointed to fill the vacancy until the next city 14 election, at which election the unexpired term must be filled. Upon petition of five percent of the 15 qualified electors of the ward, as determined by the total number of votes cast in that ward in 16 the last <u>city</u> general election, the council shall call a special election to fill a vacancy occurring 17 more than six months before the next city election, if the petition has been submitted within 18 fifteen days and before four p.m. of the fifteenth day of the date of the vacancy or of the 19 vacancy being filled by appointment. If the petition is mailed, it must be in the possession of the 20 council or its representative before four p.m. on the fifteenth day after the vacancy occurs or 21 after the vacancy was filled by appointment. 22 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 40-08-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is

23 amended and reenacted as follows:

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1 40-08-16. Vacancy in office of mayor - Filled by election or by council - President of 2 council to be acting mayor. 3 If a vacancy occurs in the office of mayor, the city council may call a special city election to 4 fill such vacancy for the unexpired term or may, after fifteen days from the date of such vacancy, 5 elect one of its members to act as mayor. The member so elected shall possess all the rights 6 and powers of the mayor until the next election and until a mayor is elected and gualified. Upon 7 petition of five percent of the qualified electors, as determined by the total number of votes cast 8 in the city in the last city general election, the council shall call a special election to fill a vacancy 9 occurring more than six months prior to the next city election, provided such petition is 10 submitted within fifteen days of the date of such vacancy. During the interim between the date 11 when a vacancy occurs in the office of mayor and election and gualification of a successor, the 12 president of the city council shall be the acting mayor. 13 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 40-09-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is-14 amended and reenacted as follows: 15 40-09-07. Bond and oathOath of commissioner. 16 Each commissioner, before entering upon the duties of office, shall furnish a bond in the 17 penal sum of three thousand dollars conforming to the provisions of law applicable to the bonds-18 of state officers. In, in addition to the oath prescribed by the Constitution of North Dakota, each 19 commissioner shall take an oath that the commissioner is not under any direct or indirect 20 obligation to appoint or elect any person to the office of police officer, firefighter, or any other 21 office, position, or employment under the city government. Each commissioner elected shall-22 qualify under the provisions of this section within ten days after the receipt of the 23 commissioner's certificate of election. 24 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 40-09-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 25 amended and reenacted as follows: 26 40-09-10. How Filling vacancies in board filled. 27 If a vacancy occurs in the office of a city commissioner or president of the board of city 28 commissioners, the board may call a special city election to fill such vacancy for the unexpired 29 term, or may, after fifteen days from the date of such vacancy appoint a person to fill such 30 vacancy until the next city election, at which election the unexpired term shall be filled. Upon 31 petition of five percent of the qualified electors, as determined by the total number of votes cast

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- 1 in the city in the last <u>city</u> general election, the commission shall call a special city election to fill a
- 2 vacancy occurring more than six months prior to the next city election, provided such petition
- 3 has been submitted within fifteen days of the date of such vacancy.
- SECTION 4. Section 40-21-16.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted
 as follows:
- 6 <u>40-21-16.1. City canvassing board Composition.</u>
- 7 <u>TheFor any city election not held in conjunction with a county election, the city canvassing</u>
- 8 board must be composed of the city auditor, city attorney or appointed replacement, mayor or
- 9 council president, and two members of the city commission or council. An individual who served
- 10 on an election board during the election may not serve as a representative on the canvassing
- 11 board for that same election. The city canvassing board must be comprised of at least five
- 12 <u>members.</u>
- 13 SECTION 6. Section 40-21-16.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted
 14 as follows:
- 15 <u>40-21-16.2. Qualifications of members of city canvassing board Replacements -</u>
- 16 <u>Quorum.</u>
- 17 <u>A member of the city canvassing board who has any thing of value bet or wagered on the</u>
- 18 result of the election may not serve on the board. When a member of the city canvassing board
- 19 is a candidate or husband, wife, father, mother, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son, daughter,
- 20 son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother, or sister, whether by birth or marriage, of the whole or the
- 21 <u>half-blood, of any candidate for any office for which that member canvasses the votes, the</u>
- 22 member must be removed from that portion of the canvass. If any of the members of the board
- 23 are disqualified or cannot serve for any other reason, the city auditor shall appoint alternates to
- 24 serve in the place of those members of the board who are disqualified. A majority of the
- 25 <u>confirmed members of the board or their duly appointed alternates constitute a quorum and</u>
- 26 <u>may make the canvass provided for in this chapter and certify the results.</u>
- 27 SECTION 7. Section 40-21-16.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted
- 28 as follows:

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1	40-21-16.3. Time of city canvassing board meeting - Oath - Reconsideration of
2	<u>canvass.</u>
3	
4	canvassing board shall meet and, after taking the oath of office, proceed to open and publicly
5	canvass the returns. After the initial meeting of the board as provided in this section, any two or
6	more members may call a meeting of the board and, upon approval of a majority of the
7	members, the board shall recanvass all or part of the results of the election and may correct any
8	previous canvass or certification, or both, in regard to the election.
9	SECTION 5. REPEAL. Section 40-09-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
10	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
