- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to prevention of bullying in schools.for an Act to create and enact six
- 3 <u>new sections to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the prevention of</u>
- 4 <u>bullying in public schools.</u>

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 7 and enacted as follows: 8 School bullying prevention - Prohibition - Implementation - Immunity. 9 As used in this section: 1. 10 "Bullying" means conduct occurring or received at school, including through <del>a.</del> 11 technology or electronic means: 12 (1) That is so severe, pervasive, or objectively offensive that it substantially 13 interferes with or impairs a student's educational opportunities or 14 benefits: 15 <u>That has the effect of substantially disrupting the orderly operation of the</u> <del>(2)</del> 16 school; or 17 (3) That places a student in actual and reasonable fear of harm to the 18 student's person or damage to the student's property. 19 "School" includes a classroom or other location on school premises, a b. 20 schoolbus or other school-related vehicle, a schoolbus stop, an activity or-21 event sponsored by a school, whether or not it is held on school premises. 22 and any other program or function where the school is responsible for the 23 child.

3	<u> <u> </u></u>	<u>a.</u>	Not later than June 30, 2012, each school district shall adopt a policy prohibiting
4			bullying at school. The school district shall involve parents and guardians, school
5			employees, volunteers, students, administrators, law enforcement, domestic
6			violence sexual assault organizations as defined by subsection 3 of section
7			14-07.1-01, and community representatives in the process of creating any policy
8			that is adopted subsequent to the effective date of this Act. The school district
9			shall submit the policies created under this section to the department of public
10			instruction. Policies created under this section shall be periodically reviewed and
11			may be revised as necessary.
12		<u>b.</u>	The policy prohibiting bullying shall include, without limitation:
13			(1) A statement prohibiting bullying of a student;
14			(2) A definition of bullying which includes, at a minimum, the definition as
15			provided in this section;
16			(3) A provision that there will be consequences and appropriate remedial
17			actions for persons committing acts of bullying, or engaging in reprisal or
18			retaliation:
19			(4) Procedures for reporting and documenting acts of bullying, including a
20			provision for reporting anonymously. However, formal disciplinary action
21			shall not be taken solely on the basis of an anonymous report. The
22			procedures shall identify the appropriate school personnel responsible
23			for receiving a report and investigating a complaint, as well as a
24			schedule for document retention;
25			(5) Procedures for prompt investigation of reports or complaints of serious
26			violations. These procedures shall include a requirement that school
27			personnel notify local law enforcement immediately if the initial school
28			investigation creates a reasonable suspicion that a crime may have
29			occurred;
30			(6) A provision that prohibits reprisal or retaliation against a person who
31			reports or makes a complaint of bullying;

1	(7) A provision that the school will develop a strategy for protecting a victim
2	from additional bullying, and from retaliation following a report;
3	(8) A provision that there will be consequences and appropriate remedial
4	action for a person who is found to have made a false accusation, report,
5	<u>or complaint;</u>
6	(9) A method for discussing the district's bullying policy with students; and
7	(10) A statement of how the policy is to be publicized, including notice that
8	the policy applies to participation in functions sponsored by the school.
9	<u>c.</u> <u>To assist local school districts in developing a policy under this subsection,</u>
10	the department of public instruction, North Dakota school boards association,
11	and education standards and practices board shall not later than
12	December 31, 2011, develop model policies applicable to kindergarten
13	through grade twelve and teacher preparation program standards on the
14	identification and prevention of bullying. Upon request, the department may
15	provide training and technical assistance to districts in carrying out this
16	section.

2	pursuant to any other applicable civil or criminal law. This section does not create
3	or alter any civil cause of action for monetary damages against any person or
4	school district nor does it constitute grounds for any claim or motion raised by
5	either the state or defendant in any proceedings. A school employee, volunteer, or
6	student, or a student's parent or guardian who promptly, reasonably, and in good
7	faith reports an incident of bullying to the appropriate school official designated by
8	the school district or accredited nonpublic school is immune from civil or criminal
9	liability relating to such report and to participation in any administrative or judicial
10	proceeding resulting from or relating to the report.
11	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is
12	created and enacted as follows:
13	Bullying - Definition.
14	As used in this Act:
15	1. "Bullying" means:
16	a. Conduct that occurs in a public school, on school district premises, in a district
17	owned or leased schoolbus or school vehicle, or at any public school or school
18	district sanctioned or sponsored activity or event and which:
19	(1) Is so severe, pervasive, or objectively offensive that it substantially
20	interferes with the student's educational opportunities;
21	(2) Places the student in actual and reasonable fear of harm;
22	(3) Places the student in actual and reasonable fear of damage to property of
23	the student; or
24	(4) Substantially disrupts the orderly operation of the public school; or
25	b. Conduct that is received by a student while the student is in a public school, on
26	school district premises, in a district owned or leased schoolbus or school
27	vehicle, or at any public school or school district sanctioned or sponsored activity
28	or event and which:
29 20	(1) Is so severe, pervasive, or objectively offensive that it substantially
30 21	interferes with the student's educational opportunities;
31	(2) Places the student in actual and reasonable fear of harm;

1	(3) Places the student in actual and reasonable fear of damage to property of	
2	the student; or	
3	(4) Substantially disrupts the orderly operation of the public school.	
4	2. "Conduct" includes the use of technology or other electronic media.	
5	SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is created	
6	and enacted as follows:	
7	Bullying - Prohibition by policy.	
8	1. Before July 1, 2012, each school district shall adopt a policy providing that while at a	
9	public school, on school district premises, in a district owned or leased schoolbus or	
10	school vehicle, or at any public school or school district sanctioned or sponsored	
11	activity or event, a student may not:	
12	a. Engage in bullying; or	
13	b. Engage in reprisal or retaliation against:	
14	(1) A victim of bullying;	
15	(2) An individual who witnesses an alleged act of bullying;	
16	(3) An individual who reports an alleged act of bullying; or	
17	(4) An individual who provides information about an alleged act of bullying.	
18	2. The policy required by this section must:	
19	a. Include a definition of bullying that at least encompasses the conduct described	
20	in section 1 of this Act;	
21	b. Establish procedures for reporting and documenting alleged acts of bullying,	
22	reprisal, or retaliation, and include procedures for anonymous reporting of such	
23	acts:	
24	c. Establish procedures, including timelines, for school district personnel to follow in	
25	investigating reports of alleged bullying, reprisal, or retaliation;	
26	d. Establish a schedule for the retention of any documents generated while	
27	investigating reports of alleged bullying, reprisal, or retaliation;	
28	e. Set forth the disciplinary measures applicable to an individual who engaged in	
29	bullying or who engaged in reprisal or retaliation, as set forth in subsection 1;	

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1	f. Require the notification of law enforcement personnel if an investigation by	
2	school district personnel results in a reasonable suspicion that a crime might	
3	have occurred;	
4	g. Establish strategies to protect a victim of bullying, reprisal, or retaliation; and	
5	h. Establish disciplinary measures to be imposed upon an individual who makes a	
6	false accusation, report, or complaint pertaining to bullying, reprisal, or retaliation.	
7	3. In developing the bullying policy required by this section, a school district shall involve	
8	parents, school district employees, volunteers, students, school district administrators,	
9	law enforcement personnel, domestic violence sexual assault organizations as defined	
10	by subsection 3 of section 14-07.1-01, and community representatives.	
11	4. Upon completion of the policy required by this section, a school district shall:	
12	a. Ensure that the policy is explained to and discussed with its students;	
13	b. File a copy of the policy with the superintendent of public instruction; and	
14	c. Make the policy available in student and personnel handbooks.	
15	5. Each school district shall review and revise its policy as it determines necessary and	
16	shall file a copy of the revised policy with the superintendent of public instruction.	
17	SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is created	
18	and enacted as follows:	
19	Professional development activities.	
20	Each school district shall include, in professional development activities, information	
21	regarding the prevention of bullying and shall provide information regarding the prevention of	
22	bullying to all volunteers and nonlicensed personnel who have contact with students.	
23	SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is created	
24	and enacted as follows:	
25	Bullying prevention programs.	
26	Each school district shall provide bullying prevention programs to all students from	
27	kindergarten through grade twelve.	
28	<b>SECTION 5.</b> A new section to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is created	
29	and enacted as follows:

2	1.	This Act does not prevent a victim from seeking redress pursuant to any other
3		applicable civil or criminal law. This Act does not create or alter any civil cause of
4		action for monetary damages against any person or school district, nor does this Act
5		constitute grounds for any claim or motion raised by either the state or a defendant in
6		any proceedings.
7	2.	Any individual who promptly, reasonably, and in good faith reports an incident of
8		bullying, reprisal, or retaliation to the school district employee or official designated in
9		the school district bullying policy is immune from civil or criminal liability resulting from
10		or relating to the report or to the individual's participation in any administrative or
11		judicial proceeding stemming from the report.
12	3.	A school district and its employees are immune from any liability that might otherwise
13		be incurred as a result of a student having been the recipient of bullying, if the school
14		district implemented a bullying policy, as required by section 2 of this Act and
15		substantially complied with that policy.

17	and ena	acted as follows:

19	1.	This Act does not prevent a victim from seeking redress pursuant to any other
20		applicable civil or criminal law. This Act does not create or alter any civil cause of
21		action for monetary damages against any person or nonpublic school, nor does this
22		Act constitute grounds for any claim or motion raised by either the state or a defendant
23		in any proceedings.
24	2.	Any individual who promptly, reasonably, and in good faith reports an incident of
25		bullying, reprisal, or retaliation to the nonpublic school employee or official designated
26		in the school's bullying policy is immune from civil or criminal liability resulting from or
27		relating to the report or to the individual's participation in any administrative or judicial
28		proceeding stemming from the report.
29	3.	A nonpublic school and its employees are immune from any liability that might
30		otherwise be incurred as a result of a student having been the recipient of bullying, if

1	the school implemented a bullying policy, similar to that required by section 2 of this
2	Act and substantially complied with that policy.
