

**SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4015**

1 A concurrent resolution urging Congress and the President to pursue peace in Iraq and  
2 Afghanistan and disengage American combat forces from duty in these countries.

3 **WHEREAS**, the goals of the United States in the foreign wars in Iraq and Afghanistan have  
4 been to reduce terrorist activity directed at the United States and to create a peaceful  
5 environment for the citizens of those countries; and

6 **WHEREAS**, the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan are now the longest wars in the United States  
7 history; and

8 **WHEREAS**, American forces on duty in Iraq and Afghanistan have served bravely in the  
9 midst of the continued civil disorder in Iraq and the sectarian war in Afghanistan, and merit the  
10 respect and support of all people; and

11 **WHEREAS**, now over 1 million American families have had a family member serve in these  
12 overseas wars, and more than 4,000 Americans have died in these wars, ~~without any~~  
13 ~~appreciable increase in security from terrorism, and with only limited advancement toward the~~  
14 ~~goal of security for the citizens of those countries;~~ and

15 **WHEREAS**, the continued cost of these wars in both the lives and health of American  
16 forces and civilians and the cost to the United States government and our citizens of more than  
17 \$10 billion per month cannot be sustained indefinitely ~~and is causing great harm to the social~~  
18 ~~and economic structure of the United States;~~ and

19 **WHEREAS**, ~~the deaths of civilians in these countries killed by attacks from both insurgents~~  
20 ~~and allied military operations harm efforts to decrease terrorist activities and to promote~~  
21 ~~peaceful conditions in those countries by continuing to be used as a tool for terrorist recruitment~~  
22 ~~and by creating fear and uncertainty for the civilian populations of those countries;~~ and

23 **WHEREAS**, the efforts of nongovernmental organizations to ~~bring community-based health,~~  
24 ~~education, and economic development to Afghanistan and Pakistan, such as those of the~~  
25 ~~Central Asian Institute, Afghanistan Samsortya—establishing nurseries and replanting orchards—~~

1 ~~in Afghanistan, Women for Afghan Women—providing advocacy and assistance to survivors of~~  
2 ~~personal violence in Afghanistan, The Organization of Women's Freedom in Iraq—working to~~  
3 ~~end violence against women in Iraq, and many others promote peace and the interests of~~  
4 ~~United States and its allies far more effectively than military operations in those countries and~~  
5 end violence against women in Iraq, bring community-based health, education, and economic  
6 development to Afghanistan and Iraq, and promote peace should be supported;

7 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE**  
8 **HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:**

9 That the Sixty-second Legislative Assembly urges Congress and the President to  
10 ~~immediately halt offensive military action and~~ pursue peace in Iraq and Afghanistan ~~without the~~  
11 ~~use of United States military forces and to disengage and safely withdraw American forces from~~  
12 ~~those countries at the earliest opportunity and to instead support, through an appropriate~~  
13 ~~expenditure of funds, peaceful, nonmilitary methods for decreasing the global risk of terrorist~~  
14 ~~activities and to specifically expend funds to improve the lives of the people of Iraq and~~  
15 ~~Afghanistan using nonviolent, peaceful methods~~with the combined efforts of nongovernmental  
16 organizations and the United States military forces, to disengage and safely withdraw American  
17 forces from those countries at the appropriate time, and to support, through reasonable  
18 expenditures of funds, peaceful methods for decreasing the global risk of terrorist activities; and

19 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this resolution  
20 to the President of the United States and to each member of the North Dakota Congressional  
21 Delegation.
