6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:				
7	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 28 of section 38-14.1-02 of the North Dakota				
8	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:				
9	28. "Soil classifier" means a professional soil classifier as defined in subsection 4 of				
10	section 43-36-01an individual registered with the board of soil classifiers in				
11	accordance with chapter 43-36.1.				
12	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subdivision t of subsection 1 of section 38-14.1-14 of the North				
13	Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:				
14	t. A soil survey of all the suitable plant growth material within the permit area. Such				
15	survey must also locate and identify prime soils in the permit area. The survey				
16	must be made by a professional soil classifier as described in subsection 4 of

- 4 Upon a showing of good cause, the governor may remove any member of the board of soil
- 5 classifiers for misconduct, incompetency, or neglect of duty.
- 6 <u>43-36.1-06. Election of chairman Meetings.</u>
- 7 1. Annually, the board of soil classifiers shall elect one member to serve as the chairman.
- 8 <u>2.</u> The chairman shall call all meetings of the board and shall call a special meeting

21	amount established by the board of soil classifiers, but not exceeding five hundred dollars.

23	A soil classifier registered under this chapter shall pay to the board of soil classifiers an					
24	annual fee, in an amount established by the board, but not exceeding three hundred dollars.

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- Upon the request of an applicant, the board may administer a practical examination on
 a date other than that required by subsection 2. The board may charge an additional
 fee for an examination offered under this subsection.
 - 4. The passing grade on a practical examination is seventy percent.
- 5. If an individual does not receive a passing grade on a practical examination, the
 individual may retake the examination, provided there is a waiting period of at least six
 months from the date of the previous attempt. The board may charge an additional fee
 for an examination offered under this subsection.
- 9 6. If an individual does not receive a passing grade after three attempts, the individual is
 10 barred from retaking the examination for a period of three years.

- 12 <u>Upon completion of all requirements set forth in this chapter and payment of the registration</u>
- 13 fee, the board of soil classifiers shall issue a numbered certificate of registration that is signed
- by the chairman. A certificate of registration is prima facie evidence that the individual named in
- the certificate of registration is entitled to all the rights and privileges of a soil classifier during
- 16 the term for which the certificate of registration is valid.

43-36.1-18. Expiration - Renewal.

- A certificate of registration issued under this chapter expires on December thirty-first of each year.
- Before November first of each year, the board of soil classifiers shall notify each
 individual registered under this chapter of the expiration date set forth in this section
 and the amount of the fee required for renewal of the certificate of registration.

- b. By first-class mail if requested by the soil classifier.
- 4. Any renewal occurring after December thirty-first is subject to a late fee in the amount
 of twenty-five dollars.
