- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact sections 26.1-36-09.14 and 54-52.1-04.13 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to health insurance and public employees retirement system
- 3 uniform group insurance coverage of telemedicine.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 26.1-36-09.14 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 6 enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>26.1-36-09.14. Telemedicine reimbursement parity Definitions.</u>
- 8 1. As used in this section:

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- g. "Health care facility" means any office or institution at which health care services
 or treatment of diseases are provided. The term includes hospitals; clinics;
 ambulatory surgery centers; outpatient care facilities; nursing homes; nursing,
 basic, long-term, or assisted living facilities; laboratories; and offices of any health
 care provider.
 - b. "Health care provider" includes an individual licensed under chapter 43-05,
 43-06, 43-12.1 as a registered nurse or as an advanced practice registered
 nurse, 43-15, 43-17, 43-26.1, 43-28, 43-32, 43-37, 43-40, 43-41, 43-42, 43-44,
 43-45, 43-47, 43-58, or 43-60.
 - c. "Policy" means a major medical expense policy, contract, or evidence of coverage on a group, individual, blanket, franchise, or association basis.
- d. "Store-and-forward technology" means electronic information, imaging, and
 communication that is transferred, recorded, or otherwise stored in order to be
 reviewed at a distant site at a later date by a health care provider or health care
 facility without the patient present in real time. The term includes interactive
 audio, video, and data communication.

1		<u>e. "Telemedicine":</u>		
2			<u>(1)</u>	Means the use of interactive audio, video, or other telecommunications
3				technology that is used by a health care provider or health care facility to
4				deliver health care services at a site other than the site at which the patient
5				is located; and that is delivered over a secure connection that complies with
6				the requirements of state and federal laws.
7			<u>(2)</u>	Includes the use of electronic media for consultation relating to the health
8				care diagnosis or treatment of a patient in real time or through the use of
9				store-and-forward technology.
0			<u>(3)</u>	Does not include the use of audio-only telephone, email, or facsimile
11				transmissions.
2	<u>2.</u>	An insurance company, nonprofit health service corporation, or health maintenance		
3		organization may not deliver, issue, execute, or renew a policy unless the policy		
4		provides coverage for health care services provided by a health care provider or		
5		health care facility by means of telemedicine which are the same as the policy

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- 1 **SECTION 2.** Section 54-52.1-04.13 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
- 2 enacted as follows:
- 3 <u>54-52.1-04.13. Insurance reimbursement parity for telemedicine services.</u>
- 4 The board shall provide medical benefits coverage under a contract for insurance pursuant
- 5 to section 54-52.1-04 or under a self-insurance plan pursuant to section 54-52.1-04.2 which
- 6 provides reimbursement parity for telemedicine services in the same manner as provided under
- 7 section 26.1-36-09.4.
