- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-52.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to insurance coverage of cancer treatment medications; to require a
- 3 report regarding coverage of cancer treatment medications; and to provide an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-52.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 Coverage of cancer treatment medications.
- 8 1. As used in this section:
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 a. "Cancer treatment medications" means prescription drugs and biologics that are
 used to kill, slow, or prevent the growth of cancerous cells.
 - <u>b.</u> <u>"Patient-administered" includes oral administration and self-injection.</u>
- d. "Policy" means a medical benefits coverage under a contract for insurance
 pursuant to section 54-52.1-04 or under a self-insurance plan pursuant to section
- 14 <u>54-52.1-04.2.</u>

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- 15 <u>2. For all policies that become effective after June 30, 2015, and which do not extend</u>
- past June 30, 2017, the board shall provide medical benefits coverage under a policy
- that provides the copayment, deductible, and coinsurance amounts for
- 18 <u>patient-administered cancer treatment medications do not exceed the amounts for</u>
- cancer treatment medications that are injected or are intravenously administered by a
- 20 <u>health care provider, regardless of the formulation or benefit category.</u>
- 21 3. The policy may not increase a copayment, deductible, or coinsurance amount for
- 22 covered cancer treatment medications that are injected or intravenously administered
- in order to avoid compliance with subsection 2. The policy may provide for an increase
- in a copayment, deductible, and coinsurance amount for covered cancer treatment

1	medications if the increase is applied generally to other medical or pharmaceutical
2	benefits under the policy and is not done to circumvent subsection 2. The policy may
3	not reclassify benefits with respect to cancer treatment medications in a manner that is
4	inconsistent with this section.
5	SECTION 2. PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM - COVERAGE OF CANCER
6	TREATMENT MEDICATIONS. Pursuant to section 54-03-28, the public employees retirement
7	system shall prepare and submit for introduction a bill to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly to
8	repeal the expiration date for section 1 of this Act and to extend the coverage of cancer
9	treatment medications to apply to all group and individual health insurance policies. The public
10	employees retirement system shall append to the bill a report regarding the effect of the cancer
11	treatment medication coverage requirement on the system's health insurance programs,
12	information on the utilization and costs relating to the coverage, and a recommendation
13	regarding whether the coverage should continue.
14	SECTION 3. EXPIRATION DATE. Section 1 of this Act is effective through July 31, 2017,
15	and after that date is ineffective.
