

**SENATE BILL NO. 2032**

Introduced by

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 17-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating  
2 to the oil and gas development strategic planning authority; and to provide a continuing  
3 appropriation.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 17-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as  
6 follows:

7 **17-10-01. Oil and gas development strategic planning authority.**

8 The oil and gas development strategic planning authority is governed by the industrial  
9 commission. The industrial commission shall appoint a director and the director may hire  
10 employees or contract for services for the completion of the director's duties within the limits of  
11 legislative appropriations.

12 **17-10-02. Oil and gas development strategic planning.**

13 The authority shall develop and maintain a current comprehensive strategic plan to identify  
14 the current and future regional infrastructure needs of counties and communities affected by oil  
15 and gas development through the collection and analysis of information and opinions of state  
16 and local governmental entities and stakeholders involved in and affected by oil and gas  
17 development.

18 **17-10-03. Duties of the director.**

19 The director shall collect information from available resources and through studies directed  
20 by the industrial commission, analyze information from all available sources, and create a  
21 strategic plan to address and prioritize the current and future impacts and infrastructure needs  
22 of the state and counties and communities affected by oil and gas development. The director  
23 shall consult and cooperate with state and local governmental entities, oil and gas industry  
24 representatives, landowners, mineral owners, and other stakeholders involved in and affected

1 by oil and gas development. For the plan, the director must include an analysis of all current  
2 funding, programs, and incentives used to address impacts and infrastructure needs.

3 As directed by the industrial commission, the director shall analyze any changes or  
4 additions to funding, programs, and incentives to meet impacts and infrastructure needs. The  
5 director shall make recommendations to the industrial commission to make the most efficient  
6 use of state and local resources to meet the current and future impacts and infrastructure needs  
7 of the state and counties and communities affected by oil and gas development. The director  
8 may make recommendations for future areas of study and improved gathering of information.  
9 The director shall update the plan and recommendations based on changing conditions.

10 **17-10-04. Oil and gas development strategic planning authority administrative fund -**  
11 **Continuing appropriation.**

12 There is created an oil and gas development strategic planning authority administrative  
13 fund.

14 1. Revenue to the fund must include:

15 a. Moneys received from the state's oil and gas research council administrative  
16 budget.

17 b. Moneys received from any federal agency for the purpose of this section.

18 c. Moneys donated to the authority for the purpose of this section.

19 d. Moneys received from the state's oil and gas impact fund.

20 e. Such other moneys as may be deposited in the fund for use in carrying out the  
21 purposes of the authority.

22 2. This fund must be maintained as a special fund and all moneys transferred into the  
23 fund are appropriated on a continuing basis and must be used and disbursed solely for  
24 the purpose of defraying the administrative costs incurred by the authority.

25 3. Utilizing funds from the oil and gas research fund, the industrial commission shall  
26 contract for or hire staffing necessary to effectively administer the authority.

27 **17-10-05. Reporting requirements.**

28 The authority shall deliver a written report on its activities to the legislative council each  
29 biennium. The authority is not subject to the requirements of chapter 54-60.1, but to ensure  
30 public accountability, the authority shall provide an annual report to the industrial commission  
31 detailing activities and expenditures incurred during the preceding year.
