1	A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to study the feasibility and
2	desirability of state, federal, and tribal collaboration in providing services for tribal youth in the
3	state who are adjudicated in tribal courts;
4	WHEREAS, there is a disparity in the level of services provided to youth who are
5	adjudicated of delinquent acts in tribal courts and for those who are adjudicated in state courts
6	in the state; and
7	WHEREAS, within the state system, a two-tiered system involving the juvenile court and the
8	Division of Juvenile Services within the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation provides
9	individual case management services to delinquent youth in the form of assessments,
0	evaluations, counseling, educational services, treatment, and rehabilitation; and
11	WHEREAS, in most instances, delinquent youth in the tribal system are placed in detention
2	without any of the benefit of services provided to youth in the state system; and
13	WHEREAS, during the 2013-14 interim, testimony presented to the the Tribal and State
4	Relations Committee urged collaboration between tribal and state courts in formal and informal
15	juvenile dispositions to ensure that assessments are completed and services are provided;
6	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE OF NORTH
7	DAKOTA, THE CONCURRING THEREIN:
8	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Management study the feasibility and
9	desirability of state, federal, and tribal collaboration in providing services for tribal youth in the
20	state who are adjudicated in tribal courts; and
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Management reports its findings and
22	recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
23	the Sixty-fifth Legislative Assembly.
