- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 14-09 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the duty to report a missing child or the death of a child; and to
- 3 provide a penalty.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 14-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
6 and enacted as follows:

7 <u>Missing child - Duty to report - Penalty.</u>

8 For purposes of this section and section 2 of this Act, "caretaker" means the individual 1. 9 who is responsible for the physical control of a child and who is the child's biological or 10 adoptive parent, the spouse of the child's biological or adoptive parent, or an individual 11 acting in the stead of a child's parent at the request of the parent or another with 12 authority to make the request. "Caretaker" does not include an individual who is 13 charged with the enforcement of compulsory attendance provisions under section 14 15.1-20-03. 15 A caretaker who is responsible at that time for the care of a child under the age of 2. 16 thirteen years and who is unable to make contact with or otherwise verify the 17 whereabouts and safety of that child for a period of twenty-four hours after the caretaker knows or reasonably should have known the child is missing is guilty of a 18 class C felony if the caretaker willfully or negligently fails to report the child as missing 19 20 to law enforcement immediately within a reasonable time after this twenty-four-hour 21 period expires. 22 A caretaker who is responsible at that time for the care of a child at least thirteen years 3. 23 of age but under the age of seventeen years and who is unable to make contact with 24 or otherwise verify the whereabouts and safety of that child for a period of forty-eight

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1	hours after the caretaker knows or reasonably should have known the child is missing		
2	is guilty of a class B misdemeanor if the caretaker willfully or negligently fails to report		
3	the child as missing to law enforcement immediately within a reasonable time after the		
4	forty-eight-hour period expires.		
5	SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 14-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
6	and enacted as follows:		
7	Death of a child - Duty to report - Penalty.		
8	<u>1.</u>	<u>A ca</u>	aretaker of a child in the caretaker's care is guilty of a class C felony if the
9	caretaker willfully fails to:		
10		<u>a.</u>	Report the child's death to a law enforcement agency within two hours after
11			learning about the child's death; or
12		<u>b.</u>	Report the location of the child's corpse to a law enforcement agency within two
13			hours after learning the location of the corpse.
14	<u>2.</u>	<u>Thi</u>	s section does not apply to the death of a child which occurs while the child is
15	under the care of a health care professional or emergency medical personnel.
