

**FIRST ENGROSSMENT
with House Amendments
ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2193**

1 A BILL for an Act to provide for the establishment of an autism spectrum disorder database; to
2 provide for a department of human services study and report to the legislative management; to
3 provide an appropriation; and to provide an expiration date.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1.**

6 **Autism spectrum disorder database - Rulemaking - Confidentiality.**

- 7 1. The state department of health shall establish and administer an autism spectrum
8 disorder database. The database must include a record of all reported cases of autism
9 spectrum disorder in the state and any other information determined relevant and
10 appropriate by the department in order to complete epidemiologic surveys of the
11 autism spectrum disorder, enable research and analysis of the autism spectrum
12 disorder, and provide services to individuals with an autism spectrum disorder.
- 13 2. The state department of health shall establish criteria regarding who is qualified to
14 report a case of autism spectrum disorder to the database. In establishing this criteria,
15 the department shall require that the reporter be a doctoral-level professional and be
16 appropriately licensed, credentialed, and experienced in the field of autism spectrum
17 disorder, including intellectual testing and other formal evidenced-based assessments
18 for autism spectrum disorders. The department shall consult with experts in
19 establishing this criteria.
- 20 3. The database established under this section must:
- 21 a. Include the reported individual's diagnoses under the American psychiatric
22 association's Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, Fifth Edition;
23 and

1 b. Include a complete physical evaluation of the reported individual, performed by a
2 licensed physician.

3 4. The state health council shall adopt rules to provide for mandatory reporting to the
4 autism spectrum disorder database and to establish reporting requirements, including
5 timeliness requirements.

6 5. The state department of health shall keep confidential all records of the database
7 which could be used to identify a reported individual; however, the department may
8 provide these records to other state agencies as necessary to effect the purposes of
9 this database without regard to the confidential nature of the records. If the
10 department provides confidential records of the database to a state agency, the
11 department shall notify the receiving agency of the confidential nature of the records
12 and the receiving agency shall treat these records as confidential.

13 **SECTION 2. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER**

14 **MEDICAID WAIVER.** The department of human services, by January 1, 2014, shall seek
15 approval from the federal centers for medicare and medicaid services to expand the
16 department's autism spectrum disorder medicaid waiver to cover twenty additional individuals
17 from birth through age thirteen and to provide appropriate behavior intervention and treatment
18 services that may include evidence-based and promising practices, case management services,
19 technology and technology-based support, in-home support, equipment and supplies, home
20 monitoring, respite care, residential supports and services, and behavioral consultation.

21 **SECTION 3. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION - AUTISM SPECTRUM**

22 **DISORDER EDUCATIONAL TRAINING AND SUPPORT.** The department of public instruction
23 shall provide training and support to general education classroom teachers and other school
24 staff regarding the most effective methods of educating and providing services and support to
25 individuals with autism spectrum disorder.

26 **SECTION 4. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER**

27 **STUDY AND REPORT TO THE LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT.** During the 2013-14 interim, in
28 consultation with clinicians who have expertise in the evaluation, diagnosis, and treatment of
29 autism spectrum disorder, the department of human services shall study autism spectrum
30 disorder services, including the most feasible service delivery system for individuals not served
31 in the developmental disability system who have an autism spectrum disorder. Before August 1,

1 2014, the department of human services shall report to the legislative management the
2 outcome and recommendations of this study.

3 **SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH - AUTISM**

4 **SPECTRUM DISORDER DATABASE.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general
5 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$148,132, or so much of the
6 sum as may be necessary, to the state department of health for the purpose of establishing and
7 administering an autism spectrum disorder database, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013,
8 and ending June 30, 2015. The state department of health is authorized one full-time equivalent
9 position for this purpose.

10 **SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - STATE**

11 **AUTISM COORDINATOR.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the
12 state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$265,136, or so much of the sum as may
13 be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of hiring a state autism
14 coordinator who would be responsible for implementing a resource and service center to
15 provide information and services for individuals with autism spectrum disorder, developing a
16 statewide outreach plan, conducting regional meetings and an annual conference, and
17 developing a protocol for use after screenings, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and
18 ending June 30, 2015. The department of human services is authorized one full-time equivalent
19 position for this purpose.

20 **SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - STATEWIDE**

21 **AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER TRAINING EFFORT.** There is appropriated out of any
22 moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of
23 \$250,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services
24 for the purpose of implementing a statewide autism spectrum disorder training effort, including
25 physician training, regional training, school staff training, and parent training, for the biennium
26 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

27 **SECTION 8. EXPIRATION DATE.** This Act is effective through June 30, 2015, and after that
28 date is ineffective.
