- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-02.5 and 15.1-21-02.6 of the
- 2 North Dakota Century Code, relating to eligibility requirements for the North Dakota academic
- 3 scholarship.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02.5 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 6 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 15.1-21-02.5. North Dakota academic scholarship.
- 8 Any resident student who graduates from a high school during or after the 2010-11 school
- 9 year is eligible to receive a North Dakota academic scholarship provided the student:
- Completed four units of English language arts from a sequence that includes literature,
 composition, and speech;
- 12 2. Completed three units of mathematics, including:
- a. One unit of algebra II, as defined by the superintendent of public instruction; and
- Done unit of mathematics for which algebra II, as defined by the superintendent of
 public instruction, is a prerequisite;
- 16 3. Completed three units of science, including:
- 17 a. One unit of physical science;
- b. One unit of biology; and
- 19 c. (1) One unit of any other science; or
- 20 (2) Two one-half units of any other science;
- 4. Completed three units of social studies, including:
- a. One unit of United States history;
- b. (1) One-half unit of United States government and one-half unit of economics;
- 24 or

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	(2) One unit of problems of democracy; and
C.	One unit or two one-half units of any other social studies, which may include
	civics, civilization, geography and history, multicultural studies, North Dakota

(1) 6 scale, as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, based only 7 on the units required by subsections 1 through 7; and 8 Obtained a grade of at least "C" in each unit or one-half unit; 9 9. Received a composite score of at least twenty-four on an ACT; and 10 10. Fulfilled any one unit requirement set forth in subsections 1 through 7 by means 11 of an advanced placement course and examination; or 12 Fulfilled any one-half unit requirement set forth in subsections 1 through 7 by b. 13 means of a dual-credit course. 14 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is 15 amended and reenacted as follows: 16 15.1-21-02.6. North Dakota scholarship - Amount - Applicability. 17 (1)___The state board of higher education shall provide to any student certified as 18 being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either a North 19 Dakota academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and technical 20 education scholarship in the amount of seven hundred fifty dollars for each 21 semester during which the student is enrolled full time at an accredited 22 institution of higher education in this state and maintains a cumulative grade 23 point average of 2.75. 24 b.___ (2) The state board of higher education shall provide to any student certified as 25 being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either a North 26 Dakota academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and technical 27 education scholarship in the amount of five hundred dollars for each quarter 28 during which the student is enrolled full time at an accredited institution of 29 higher education in this state and maintains a cumulative grade point 30 average of 2.75.

1 (1) The state board of higher education shall provide to any student who 2 graduates from high school during or after the 2012-13 school year and who 3 is certified as being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either 4 a North Dakota academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and 5 technical education scholarship, in the amount of one thousand two hundred 6 fifty dollars, for each semester during which the student is enrolled full time 7 at an accredited institution of higher education in this state and maintains a 8 cumulative grade point average of 2.75. 9 The state board of higher education shall provide to any student who 10 graduates from high school during or after the 2012-13 school year and is 11 certified as being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either a 12 North Dakota academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and technical 13 education scholarship, in the amount of eight hundred thirty-three dollars, 14 for each quarter during which the student is enrolled full time at an 15 accredited institution of higher education in this state and maintains a 16 cumulative grade point average of 2.75. 17 2. The state board shall monitor each scholarship recipient to ensure that the student 18 meets the academic and other requirements of this section. Upon determining that a 19 recipient student has failed to meet the requirements of this section, the board shall 20 provide notification to the student within ten days. 21 AExcept as provided in this subsection, a student is not entitled to receive more 22 than six thousand dollars under this section. 23 A student who graduates from high school during or after the 2012-13 school 24 year is entitled to receive up to ten thousand dollars under this section. 25 The state board of higher education shall forward the scholarship directly to the 26 institution in which the student is enrolled. 27 5. a. (1)This section does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive 28 semesters. 29 (2) This section does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive 30 quarters.

1 However, a scholarship under this section is valid only for six academic years 2 after the student's graduation from high school and may not be applied to 3 graduate programs. 4 A scholarship under this section is available to any eligible resident student who fulfills 6. 5 the requirements of section 15.1-21-02.4 or 15.1-21-02.5 and who graduates from: 6 a. A high school in this state; 7 A high school in a bordering state under chapter 15.1-29; or b. 8 A nonpublic high school in a bordering state while residing with a custodial parent 9 in this state. 10 7. _For purposes of North Dakota scholarship eligibility under this section, "full-time" 11 means enrollment in at least twelve credits during a student's first two semesters 12 and enrollment in at least fifteen credits during each semester thereafter or 13 enrollment in the equivalent number of credits, as determined by the state board 14 of higher education, with respect to students in a guarter system. 15 If a student requires fewer than fifteen credits to graduate, the student may 16 retain scholarship eligibility by enrolling in fewer than fifteen but at least 17 twelve credits during the semester, or the equivalent number of credits, as 18 determined by the state board of higher education, with respect to students 19 in a quarter system. 20 Students who graduated from high school during the 2009-10 or the 21 2010-11 school year and who have completed six semesters may retain 22 scholarship eligibility by enrolling in only twelve credits during each of the 23 student's final two semesters, or the equivalent number of credits, as 24 determined by the state board of higher education, with respect to students 25 in a quarter system. 26 The requirement that a student be enrolled in at least fifteen credits, as set (3) 27 forth in subdivision a, does not apply in the case of a student participating in 28 a clinical, practicum, internship, cooperative program, or similar external 29 experience, provided the external experience is equivalent to at least twelve 30 units, or such similar amount as determined by the state board of higher

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education, with respect to students in a quarter system, and considered to be a "full time" placement for purposes of meeting graduation requirements.
