- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 16.1-01-04 of the North Dakota-
- 2 Century Code, relating to residency and the eligibility to vote.for an Act to amend and reenact
- 3 section 16.1-02-05, subsection 9 of section 16.1-02-12, and sections 16.1-02-13, 16.1-05-04,
- 4 <u>16.1-05-07, 16.1-07-06, and 39-06-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to eligibility</u>
- 5 to vote; and to repeal sections 16.1-05-06 and 58-04-09 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 6 relating to eligibility to vote.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 16.1-01-04 of the North Dakota 9 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 1. Every citizen of the United States who is eighteen years or older; a resident of this-11 state; and has resided in the precinct at least thirty days next preceding the deadline. 12 established for the distribution of absentee ballots for any election, except as 13 otherwise provided in regard to residency in chapter 16.1-14, is a qualified elector. 14 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-02-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is 15 amended and reenacted as follows: 16 16.1-02-05. Entry of new voters into the central voter file - Query of the central voter 17 file for double voting - Challenges - Postelection verification. 18 1. Within forty-five days following an election, the county auditor shall enter the name 19 and required information of each individual who voted at the last election who is not 20 already contained in the central voter file and update any required information 21 requested and obtained at the last election for any individual contained in the central 22 voter file. 23 2. The secretary of state, with the assistance of the county auditors, within eighty-five 24 days following an election, shall query the central voter file to determine if any

	individual voted more than once during the preceding election. The secretary of state
	shall immediately notify the county auditor and state's attorney in each affected county
	for further investigation.
3.	Upon return of any nonforwardable mail from an election official, the county auditor
	shall ascertain the name and address of that individual. If the individual is no longer at
	the address recorded in the central voter file, the county auditor shall transfer the voter
	to the correct precinct in the central voter file or notify the county of the voter's new
	residence so the voter record can be transferred to the correct county. If a notice
	mailed at least sixty days after the return of the first nonforwardable mail is also
	returned by the postal service, the county auditor shall designate the individual as
	"inactive" in the central voter file.
4.	Within forty-five days after an election, the county auditor shall send a notice to each
	individual who was challenged on election day according to section 16.1-05-06. If a
	notice is returned as not deliverable, the county auditor shall attempt to determine the
	reason for the return. A county auditor who does not receive or obtain satisfactory-
	proof of an individual's eligibility to vote shall notify immediately the state's attorney to
	conduct an investigation of the individual's eligibility to vote in that election.

8	4.	The unique identifier generated and assigned to the individual.
9	5.	The county, legislative district, city or township, school district, county commissioner
10		district, if applicable, precinct name, and precinct number in which the individual
11		resides. A ballot-style code identifying this information may be used in place of the
12		information required by this subsection.
13	6.	Any other information requested of and obtained from the individual deemed
14		necessary by the secretary of state for the proper administration of the pollbook.

9	SEC	CTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-05-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is
10	amende	ed and reenacted as follows:
11	<b>16.</b> 1	I-05-07. Poll clerks to check identification and verify eligibility - Poll clerks to
12	request	, correct, and update incorrect information contained in the pollbook.
13	1.	Before delivering a ballot to an individual according to section 16.1-13-22, the poll
14		clerks shall requestrequire the individual to show identification, which includes the
15		individual's residential address and date of birth. The identification may include:
16		a. AnA driver's license or nondriver photo identification card issued by the
17		department of transportation or other official form of identification issued by the
18		state;
19		b. An official form of identification issued by a tribal government;
20		c. A form of identification prescribed by the secretary of state, if the individual does
21		not possess an official form of identification provided for under subdivision a or b;
22		or
23		d. A combination of any of the forms of identification under subdivisions a through c.
24	2.	If an individual offering to vote does not have or refuses to show an appropriate form-
25		of identification, the individual may be allowed to vote without being challenged-
26		according to section 16.1-05-06 if the individual provides to the election board the
27		individual's date of birth and if a member of the election board or a clerk knows the
28		individual and can personally vouch that the individual is a qualified elector of the
29		precinct.
30	3.	If an individual offering to vote does not meet either of the options set forth in-
31		subsection 1 or 2, the election board shall challenge the individual's right to vote and

1		the individual may not vote unless the individual executes a voter's affidavit, as-
2		provided in section 16.1-05-06.
3	4.	-a. When verifying an individual's eligibility or when entering the name of an
4		individual into the pollbook, poll clerks shall request, correct, and update any
5		incorrect or incomplete information about an individual required to be included in
6		the pollbook generated from the central voter file.
7		b. If the individual's name is contained in the pollbook generated from the central
8		voter file, the poll clerks shall verify the individual's residential address and
9		mailing address, if different from the individual's residential address.
10		c. If the individual's name is not contained in the pollbook generated from the
11		central voter file but the individual is determined eligible to vote, the poll clerks
12		shall record the individual's name in the pollbook. The poll clerks shall request
13		and obtain any additional information for the individual required to be included in
14		the pollbook.
15	<del>5.<u>3.</u></del>	Poll clerks shall direct an individual who is attempting to vote in the incorrect precinct
16		to the proper precinct and voting location.
17	SEC	CTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-07-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
18	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
19	16.1	I-07-06. Application form.
20	1.	Application for an absent voter's ballot must be made on a form, prescribed by the
21		secretary of state, to be furnished by the proper officer of the county, city, or school
22		district in which the applicant is an elector, on any form, approved by the secretary of
23		state, or any blank containing the following information:
24		a. The applicant's name.
25		b. The applicant's current or most recent North Dakota residential address.
26		c. The applicant's mailing address.
27		d. The applicant's current contact telephone number.
28		e. The election for which the ballot is being requested.
29		f. The date of the request.
30		g. An affirmation that the applicant has resided, or will reside, in the precinct for at
31		least thirty days next preceding the election.

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1		h. The applicant's signature.
2		i. A space for the voter to indicate the voter's status as a citizen living outside the
3		United States, a uniformed service member living away from the voter's North
4		Dakota residence, or a family member of the uniformed service member living
5		away from the voter's North Dakota residence.
6		j. The applicant's birth date and year.
7		k. The applicant's motor vehicle operator's license or nondriver identification
8		number <del>, if available</del> .
9		If the applicant is unable to sign the applicant's name, the applicant shall mark (X) or
10		use the applicant's signature stamp on the application in the presence of a
11		disinterested individual. The disinterested individual shall print the name of the
12		individual marking the X or using the signature stamp below the X or signature stamp
13		and shall sign the disinterested individual's own name following the printed name
14		together with the notation "witness to the mark".
15	2.	The application for a qualified elector serving on active duty as a uniformed service
16		member or a family member who is a qualified elector and stationed at a location other
17		than that individual's voting residential address must include the following additional
18		information if the voter desires to vote by facsimile or electronic mail:
19		a. Facsimile telephone number; or
20		b. Electronic mail address.
21	3.	The application for a qualified elector living outside the United States must include a
22		facsimile telephone number or electronic mail address if the voter desires to vote by
23		facsimile or electronic mail.
24	4.	Except for the applicant's date of birth and motor vehicle driver's license or nondriver
25		photo identification card number, the application is an open record under section
26		<u>44-04-18.</u>
27	SEC	TION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
28	amende	d and reenacted as follows:

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## 39-06-03.1. Nondriver photo identification card issued by director - Release of information - Penalty - Public awareness.

- 3 1. The director shall issue a nondriver color photo identification card to any North Dakota 4 resident who fulfills the requirements of this section. An application for an identification 5 card must be made on a form furnished by the director. Within thirty days from receipt 6 of a complete application that includes the applicant's social security number, unless 7 the applicant is a nonimmigrant who is not eligible for a social security number, the 8 director shall determine whether to issue and, if appropriate, issue a nondriver photo 9 identification card to an applicant. If the person is under the age of eighteen or at least 10 the age of eighteen and under the age of twenty-one, the photo must be against the 11 same color background required on a motor vehicle operator's license for an operator 12 of that age. Subject to subsection 1 of section 39-06-19, identification cards expire 13 eight years from the date of issue and may be renewed. The application must contain 14 such other information as the director may require to improve identity security. The 15 director may require an applicant for an identification card to provide a social security 16 card and proof of residence address.
- To confirm the identity, date of birth, and legal presence of the applicant, the director or
   examining officer shall require satisfactory evidence be provided by the applicant.
   Satisfactory evidence includes a certified copy of the applicant's birth certificate or
   other evidence reasonably calculated to permit the determination of the date of birth,
   identification, and legal presence of the applicant by the director or examining officer.
  - 3. The fee is eight dollars. Fees collected pursuant to this section must be paid monthlyinto the highway fund in the state treasury. Except as provided in subsection 9, the director may not charge a fee to provide a nondriver photo identification card to an eligible applicant.
- 4. Any information obtained by the director from an applicant for the issuance, renewal,
  or replacement of an identification card issuable pursuant to this chapter may only be
  released in accordance with the provisions of section 39-16-03.
- 29 5. It is a class B misdemeanor for any person, except the director or the director's
  30 authorized agent, to print or otherwise produce or reproduce cards or their

1		components, which may be utilized as identification cards issued pursuant to this
2		section.
3	6.	The director may advertise the availability and the use of the card.
4	7.	Identification cards issued pursuant to this section are sufficient identification for all
5		identification purposes.
6	8.	The director shall cancel any card upon determining that the holder is not entitled to
7		the issuance of the card under the laws of this state, or the holder has failed to give
8		the required or correct information to the director, or has committed fraud in making
9		the application, or the fee was in the form of an insufficient or no-account check. Upon
10		cancellation, the holder shall surrender the card to the director. When a cancellation is
11		in effect, any law enforcement officer may take custody of the card.
12	9.	A duplicate card may be obtained by making an application and paying an eight dollar
13		fee. For a cardholder who has reached the age of eighteen or twenty-one, a
14		replacement card may be obtained by making an application and paying an eight
15		dollar fee.
16	10.	The director may not withhold the issuance of a nondriver color photo identification
17		card without reasonable cause.
18	11.	An individual who possesses a driver's license may not obtain a nondriver photo
19		identification card.
20	SEC	CTION 8. REPEAL. Sections 16.1-05-06 and 58-04-09 of the North Dakota Century
21 Code are repealed.
