- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 20.1-03-12 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to hunting fees; and to amend and reenact section 20.1-03-07.1
- 3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to nonresident waterfowl hunting.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 20.1-03-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 20.1-03-07.1. (Effective through July 31, 2013) Nonresident waterfowl hunting license
 required.

9 Except as provided in sections 20.1-02-05, 20.1-03-07.2, and 20.1-03-07.3, a nonresident 10 may not hunt waterfowl unless that individual first obtains a nonresident waterfowl hunting 11 license. However, a nonresident may hunt cranes after first obtaining a nonresident waterfowl 12 hunting license or a nonresident small game hunting license. Except as otherwise provided in 13 this section, the nonresident waterfowl hunting license entitles the nonresident to hunt waterfowl 14 for any period of fourteen consecutive days or any two periods of seven consecutive days each. 15 A license authorizing the fourteen-day hunting period allows hunting in a specified waterfowl 16 hunting zone. A license authorizing two 7-day hunting periods allows hunting in a specified zone 17 during each period. Upon payment of the fee for a statewide nonresident waterfowl hunting 18 license, a nonresident may hunt waterfowl in any zone. Forty dollars of the fee for a statewide 19 nonresident waterfowl license must be used for the private land open to sportsmen program. 20 The governor, in the governor's proclamation, shall specify various waterfowl hunting zones for 21 which nonresident waterfowl hunting licenses will be available, and may specify the number of 22 licenses which may be issued in each zone and the manner in which they are to be issued. A 23 nonresident is entitled to purchase only one nonresident waterfowl hunting license per year. The

fourteen-day and two 7-day hunting period restrictions do not apply to nonresidents hunting in
