4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES 6 AND EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION. 7 -<u>The legislative management shall consider studying, during the 2013-14 interim, the</u> 1. 8 development, delivery, and administration of comprehensive early childhood services 9 and early childhood education in this state. The study must include an examination of 10 the availability, guality, and cost of services offered by existing public and private-11 sector providers, the projected need for services during the coming ten years to twenty-12 years, and the ability of public and private sector providers to address the expansion 13 of facilities or the creation of additional facilities. 14 2. The legislative management may appoint a committee, workgroups, task forces, and 15 subcommittees, as necessary, to provide or obtain information required in conjunction 16 with this study. 17 3. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, 18 together with any legislation reguired to implement the recommendations, to the 19 sixty-fourth legislative assembly. 20 SECTION 1. The superintendent of public instruction shall study the development, delivery, and

6	2.	The superintendent of public instruction may appoint a committee, work groups, task
7		forces, and subcommittees, as necessary, to provide or obtain information required in
8		conjunction with this study.
9	3.	Before June 1, 2014, the superintendent of public instruction shall provide a final
10		report, together with recommendations, to the legislative management.
