FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Senate Amendments ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1425

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 39-06 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to an enhanced operator's license; and to provide a penalty.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 39-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 6 Enhanced operator's license Penalty.
- For an additional fee of forty-five dollars, the director shall issue enhanced features on any
- 8 operator's license, permit, or nondriver photo identification. These enhanced features must
- 9 allow for approval by the secretary of the United States department of homeland security for the
- 10 purpose of entering the United States. The features must denote citizenship and identity, and
- 11 contain technology and security features approved by the secretary of the United States
- 12 <u>department of homeland security. The department may not issue a license, permit, or</u>
- 13 identification with enhanced features to an individual who is under sixteen years of age, is not a
- 14 resident of this state, or is not a citizen of the United States of America. The applicant for
- 15 enhanced features must present to the department satisfactory proof of the applicant's full legal
- 16 name, United States citizenship, identity, date of birth, social security number, resident's
- address, and a photographic identity document. The operator's license, permit, or identification
- 18 with enhanced features must include reasonable security measures to prevent counterfeiting
- 19 and to protect against unauthorized disclosure of personal information regarding an applicant
- 20 <u>which is contained in the license, permit, or identification. The enhanced features may include</u>
- 21 radio frequency identification technology that is limited to a randomly assigned number, which
- 22 must be encrypted if agreed to by the United States department of homeland security and which
- 23 does not include biometric data or any information other than the citizenship status of the
- 24 applicant. An applicant must sign an acknowledgment of understanding of the radio frequency

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- 1 <u>identification technology and its use for the sole purpose of verifying United States citizenship</u>
- 2 <u>before being issued an enhanced license, permit, or identification. The use of a license, permit,</u>
- 3 or identification with enhanced features may not be required of an applicant by any person and
- 4 <u>violation of this prohibition is a class B misdemeanor.</u>
