1 A BILL for an Act providing an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the legislative branch

2 of state government; to provide for applications, transfers, and cancellation of unexpended

3 appropriations; to amend and reenact sections 54-03-20 and 54-35-10 of the North Dakota

4 Century Code, relating to legislative compensation; to provide an effective date; and to declare

5 an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from the insurance
regulatory trust fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the legislative branch of state government
for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that branch, for the fiscal period beginning with the
effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

18	SECTION 4. TRANSFERS. Notwithstanding section	54-16-05, the director of t	he office of	
19	management and budget and the state treasurer shall make transfers of funds between line			
20	items of appropriations for the legislative management and legislative council as may be			
21	requested by the chairman of the legislative management or the chairman's designee upon the			
22	finding by the chairman or designee that the nature of studies and duties assigned to the			
23	legislative management or legislative council requires the transfers in properly carrying on the			
24	legislative management's and legislative council's functions and duties. The director of the office			
25	of management and budget and the state treasurer shall similarly make transfers of funds			
26	between the line items for the sixty-third and sixty-fourth legislative assemblies, upon request by			
27	the chairman of the legislative management or the chairman's designee upon the finding by the			
28	chairman or designee that the transfers are required for the legislative assembly to carry on its			
29	functions and duties.			
30	SECTION 5. APPLICATION, TRANSFER AUTHOR	ITY, AND CANCELLATIO	N OF	
31	UNEXPENDED APPROPRIATIONS. Sections 54-16-04	and 54-44.1-11 do not app	ply to	

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1 chapter 1 of the 2011 Session Laws. The director of the office of management and budget and 2 the state treasurer shall make transfers of funds between the line items and the agencies of the 3 legislative branch within section 1 of that chapter as requested by the chairman of the legislative 4 management or the chairman's designee. The office of management and budget shall cancel 5 unexpended appropriations for the legislative assembly and legislative council enacted prior to 6 the 2011-13 biennium as directed by the chairman of the legislative management or the 7 chairman's designee. 8 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 54-03-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows: 10 54-03-20. Compensation and expense reimbursement of members of the legislative 11 assembly. 12 1. Each member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive as compensation for 13 services the sum of one hundred fifty-sevensixty-two dollars for each calendar day 14 during any organizational, special, or regular legislative session and for each day that 15 member attends a meeting of a legislative committee between the organizational 16 session and the regular session as authorized by legislative rule. 17 2. Each member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive reimbursement for a. 18 lodging, which may not exceed per calendar month the amount established under 19 this subdivision by the director of the office of management and budget for 20 lodging in state and which may not exceed the rate provided in section 44-08-04 21 for each calendar day during the period of any organizational, special, or regular 22 session. On August first of each even-numbered year, the director of the office of 23 management and budget shall set the maximum monthly reimbursement for the 24 subsequent two-year period at an amount equal to thirty times sixty-five percent 25 of the daily lodging reimbursement in effect on that date as provided under 26 subdivision d of subsection 2 of section 44-08-04. 27 b. Notwithstanding subdivision a: 28 A member of the legislative assembly may elect to be reimbursed for less (1) 29 than the amount to which the legislator is entitled under this subsection by

claiming the lesser amount on a voucher submitted with the receipt required by section 44-08-04.

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- (2) The legislative management may establish guidelines that may result in a reduced maximum reimbursement for a single dwelling in which two or more legislators share lodging and the total rent for that dwelling exceeds the amount to which a legislator is entitled under subdivision a.
- 5 3. Members of the legislative assembly who receive reimbursement for lodging are a. 6 also entitled to reimbursement for travel for not to exceed one round trip taken 7 during any calendar week, or portion of a week, the legislative assembly is in 8 session, between their residences and the place of meeting of the legislative 9 assembly, at the rate provided for state employees with the additional limitation 10 that reimbursement for travel by common carrier may be only at the cost of coach 11 fare and may not exceed one and one-half times the amount the member would 12 be entitled to receive as mileage reimbursement for travel by motor vehicle.
- 13 A member of the legislative assembly who does not receive reimbursement for b. 14 lodging and whose place of residence in the legislative district that the member 15 represents is not within the city of Bismarck is entitled to reimbursement at the 16 rate provided for state employees for necessary travel for not to exceed one 17 round trip taken per day between the residence and the place of meeting of the 18 legislative assembly when it is in session and may receive reimbursement for 19 lodging at the place of meeting of the legislative assembly as provided in section 20 44-08-04 for each calendar day for which round trip travel reimbursement is not 21 claimed, provided that the total reimbursement may not exceed the maximum 22 monthly reimbursement allowed under subdivision a of subsection 2.
- The amount to which each legislator is entitled must be paid following the
 organizational session in December and following each month during a regular or
 special session.
- If during a special session, the legislative assembly adjourns for more than three days,
 a member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive compensation during those
 days only while in attendance at a standing committee if the legislator is a member of
 that committee, a majority or minority leader, or a legislator who is not on that
 committee but who has the approval of a majority or minority leader to attend.

1	6.	A day, or portion of a day, spent in traveling to or returning from an organizational,
2		special, or regular session or a legislative committee meeting must be included as a
3		calendar day during a legislative session or as a day of a legislative committee
4		meeting for the purposes of this section.
5	7.	a. In addition, each member is entitled to receive during the term for which the
6		member was elected, as compensation for the execution of public duties during
7		the biennium, the sum of four hundred fortyfifty-three dollars a month, paid
8		monthly.
9		b. If a member dies or resigns from office during the member's term, the member
10		may be paid only the allowances provided for in this section for the period for
11		which the member was actually a member.
12		c. The majority and minority leaders of the house and senate and the chairman of
13		the legislative management, if the chairman is not a majority or minority leader,
14		are each entitled to receive as compensation, in addition to any other
15		compensation or expense reimbursement provided by law, the sum of three
16		hundred sixteentwenty-five dollars per month during the biennium for their
17		execution of public duties.
18	8.	Attendance at any organizational, special, or regular session of the legislative
19		assembly by any member is a conclusive presumption of entitlement as set out in this
20		section and compensation and expense allowances must be excluded from gross
21		income for income tax purposes to the extent permitted for federal income tax
22		purposes under section 127 of the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 [Pub. L. 97-34;
23		95 Stat. 202; 26 U.S.C. 162(i)].
24	9.	Before each regular legislative session, the legislative management shall make
25		recommendations and submit any necessary legislation to adjust legislative
26		compensation amounts.
27	SEC	TION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 54-03-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is

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Each member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive as compensation for
 services the sum of one hundred sixty-twosixty-seven dollars for each calendar day
 during any organizational, special, or regular legislative session and for each day that
 member attends a meeting of a legislative committee between the organizational
 session and the regular session as authorized by legislative rule.

- 8 2. Each member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive reimbursement for a. 9 lodging, which may not exceed per calendar month the amount established under 10 this subdivision by the director of the office of management and budget for 11 lodging in state and which may not exceed the rate provided in section 44-08-04 12 for each calendar day during the period of any organizational, special, or regular 13 session. On August first of each even-numbered year, the director of the office of 14 management and budget shall set the maximum monthly reimbursement for the 15 subsequent two-year period at an amount equal to thirty times sixty-five percent
- of the daily lodging reimbursement in effect on that date as provided under
 subdivision d of subsection 2 of section 44-08-04.

19	SEC	TION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
20	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
21	54-3	5-10. Compensation of members and leadership.
22	1.	The members of the legislative management and the members of any committee of
23		the legislative management are entitled to be compensated for the time spent in
24		attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees at the rate
25		of one hundred fifty-sevensixty-two dollars per day and must also be paid for
26		expenses incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of their official
27		duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.
28	2.	In addition to the compensation provided in subsection 1, the chairman of the
29		legislative management is entitled to receive an additional five dollars for each day
30		spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees,
31		and the chairman of each of the legislative management's committees is entitled to

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- receive five dollars for each day spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative
 management or of the committee which the person chairs.
- 3 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 54-35-10. Compensation of members and leadership.

- 6 1. The members of the legislative management and the members of any committee of 7 the legislative management are entitled to be compensated for the time spent in 8 attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees at the rate 9 of one hundred sixty-twosixty-seven dollars per day and must also be paid for 10 expenses incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of their official 11 duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers. 12 2. In addition to the compensation provided in subsection 1, the chairman of the 13 legislative management is entitled to receive an additional five dollars for each day
- 14 spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees,
- 15 and the chairman of each of the legislative management's committees is entitled to
- receive five dollars for each day spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative
 management or of the committee which the person chairs.
- 18 **SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE.** Sections 6 and 8 of this Act become effective on July 1,
- 19 2013, and sections 7 and 9 become effective on July 1, 2014.
- 20 **SECTION 11. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
