ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2004

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state department
2 of health; to amend and reenact section 14-02.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code as
3 amended in section 1 of Senate Bill No. 2368, as approved by the sixty-third legislative
4 assembly, and the new section to chapter 14-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code as created
5 by section 3 of Senate Bill No. 2368, as approved by the sixty-third legislative assembly, relating
6 to the state's compelling interest in the unborn human life from the time the unborn child is
7 capable of feeling pain; to repeal chapter 23-17.5 and section 23-46-05 of the North Dakota
8 Century Code, relating to health care provider cooperative agreements and state financial
9 assistance for emergency medical services; ~~and~~ to provide legislative intent; and to provide for
10 a legislative management study.

11 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

12 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
13 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
14 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
15 other income, to the state department of health for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
16 state department of health, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015,

SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO

SIXTY-FOURTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding items approved by the sixty-second legislative assembly for the 2011-13 biennium and 2013-15 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

1 The 2013-15 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the
2 2015-17 biennium. The state department of health shall report to the appropriations committees
3 of the sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium
4 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

5 **SECTION 3. FAMILY VIOLENCE GRANTS - CONTINGENT FUNDING.** The grants line
6 item in section 1 of this Act includes \$80,000 from the general fund for family violence services
7 and prevention grants. This funding is contingent on the state department of health certifying to
8 the director of the office of management and budget that federal funds available to the
9 department for family violence grants have been reduced due to federal sequestration. The
10 department may spend these funds to the extent that federal funds are reduced.

11 **SECTION 4. ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND PROTECTION FUND.** The estimated
12 income line item included in section 1 of this Act includes \$272,310, or so much of the sum as
13 may be necessary, to be made available to the state department of health from the environment
14 and rangeland protection fund, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30,
15 2015. This amount includes \$50,000 for a grant to the North Dakota stockmen's association
16 environmental services program.

17 ~~**SECTION 5. TOBACCO PREVENTION AND CONTROL TRUST FUND.** The estimated~~
18 ~~income line item included in section 1 of this Act includes \$383,000 from the tobacco prevention~~
19 ~~and control trust fund, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.~~

20 **SECTION 5. INTENT - INDIRECT COST RECOVERIES.** Notwithstanding section
21 54-44.1-15, the state department of health may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its operating
22 account.

23 **SECTION 6. FOLLOWUP COLORECTAL SCREENING GUIDELINES.** The grants line item
24 included in section 1 of this Act includes \$160,200 from the general fund for recommended
25 followup colorectal screenings. These funds may be spent for the cost of recommended
26 followup colorectal screenings of up to \$1,800 per screening for the biennium beginning July 1,
27 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

28 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 14-02.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code as
29 amended in section 1 of Senate Bill No. 2368, as approved by the sixty-third legislative
30 assembly, is amended and reenacted as follows:

1 **14-02.1-01. Purpose.**

2 ~~The purpose of this section is to protect the state's compelling interest in the unborn human~~
3 ~~life from the time the unborn child is capable of feeling pain.~~ The purpose of this chapter is to
4 protect unborn human life and maternal health within present constitutional limits. It reaffirms
5 the tradition of the state of North Dakota to protect every human life whether unborn or aged,
6 healthy or sick.

7 **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** The new section to chapter 14-02.1 of the North Dakota
8 Century Code as created by section 3 of Senate Bill No. 2368, as approved by the sixty-third
9 legislative assembly, is amended and reenacted as follows:

10 **Determination of postfertilization age - Abortion of unborn child of twenty or more**
11 **weeks postfertilization age prohibited.**

12 1. The purpose of this section is to protect the state's compelling interest in the unborn
13 human life from the time the unborn child is capable of feeling pain.

14 2. Except in the case of a medical emergency, an abortion may not be performed or
15 induced or be attempted to be performed or induced unless the physician performing
16 or inducing the abortion has first made a determination of the probable postfertilization
17 age of the unborn child or relied upon such a determination made by another
18 physician. In making the determination, the physician shall make those inquiries of the
19 woman and perform or cause to be performed the medical examinations and tests as
20 a reasonably prudent physician, knowledgeable about the case and the medical
21 conditions involved, would consider necessary to perform in making an accurate
22 diagnosis with respect to postfertilization age.

23 ~~2.3.~~ Except in the case of a medical emergency, a person may not perform or induce or
24 attempt to perform or induce an abortion upon a woman when it has been determined,
25 by the physician performing or inducing or attempting to perform or induce the abortion
26 or by another physician upon whose determination that physician relies, that the
27 probable postfertilization age of the woman's unborn child is twenty or more weeks.

28 **SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY.** The legislative management shall
29 consider studying, during the 2013-14 interim, funding provided by the state for autopsies and
30 state and county responsibility for the cost of autopsies, including the feasibility and desirability
31 of counties sharing in the cost of autopsies performed by the state department of health and the

1 university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences. The legislative management
2 shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to
3 implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fourth legislative assembly.

4 **SECTION 10. REPEAL.** ~~Section~~Chapter 23-17.5 and section 23-46-05 of the North Dakota
