Engrossed SB 2290 creates a residential property tax credit for a resident's primary residence.

Section 1 of engrossed SB 2290 creates a state reimbursed property tax credit for a resident's primary residence equal to 50% of the true and full value up to \$25,000 per residence.

The residential property tax credit authorized in Section 1 of engrossed SB 2290 is expected to increase state general fund expenditures by an estimated \$126 million in the 2013-15 biennium.
