

**HOUSE BILL NO. 1274**

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-32-08, 43-32-12, 43-32-13, and 43-32-14,  
2 subsection 3 of section 43-32-16, and sections 43-32-17, 43-32-19.1, 43-32-20, 43-32-20.1,  
3 43-32-21, 43-32-26, 43-32-27, 43-32-27.1, 43-32-30, and 43-32-34 of the North Dakota Century  
4 Code, relating to the powers and duties of the state board of psychologist examiners; to direct  
5 the state board of psychologist examiners to provide education; to provide a penalty; and to  
6 provide an appropriation.

7 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 **43-32-08. Rules.**

11 The board may adopt rules as necessary to enable the board to carry into effect the  
12 provisions of this chapter. The rules may include a code of ethics for licensees and registrants.  
13 The board shall adopt rules defining what programs of study are substantially psychological in  
14 nature; what educational programs are acceptable for the licensing of psychologists and applied  
15 behavior analysts and for registering registered applied behavior analysts; and what educational  
16 programs are acceptable for the licensing of industrial-organizational psychologists. ~~The~~  
17 ~~educational program rules for industrial-organizational psychologists must take into account the~~  
18 ~~availability of professionally accredited programs in the field of industrial-organizational~~  
19 ~~psychology.~~

20 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
21 amended and reenacted as follows:

22 **43-32-12. Application and fee for licensure and registration.**

23 The board shall adopt rules establishing the amount of the application fee for licensure and  
24 registration ~~by written and oral examination and by reciprocity.~~ A fee is not refundable, in whole

1 or in part, except for failure of the board to hold examinations at the time originally announced,  
2 in which event the entire fee must be refunded upon demand by the applicant.

3 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 **43-32-13. Annual license and registration fee.**

6 Before ~~January first~~November fifteenth of each year, every licensee and registrant shall pay  
7 to the secretary of the board an annual fee determined by the board ~~not to exceed one hundred~~  
8 ~~fifty dollars~~by rule. The secretary of the board, upon receipt of payment of the annual fee, shall  
9 issue the licensee or registrant a certificate of annual renewal. An individual may not hold out as  
10 an industrial-organizational psychologist, an applied behavior analyst, a registered applied  
11 behavior analyst, or a psychologist until the annual fee is paid. The board may deny renewal of  
12 the license or registration of an individual who violates this section. Annually, the board shall  
13 mail or electronically mail a renewal notice to each licensee and registrant at the address or  
14 electronic mail address on file with the board.

15 **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
16 amended and reenacted as follows:

17 **43-32-14. Payment of delinquent annual fee - Reinstatement.**

18 An individual whose license or registration issued under this chapter ~~was revoked~~has  
19 expired for failure to pay the annual fee must be reinstated and the license or registration  
20 renewed if, within one year from the date of ~~revocation~~expiration, the individual pays to the  
21 secretary of the board the amount of the annual fees in default and a late fee in the amount of  
22 ~~twenty dollars~~established by the board by rule.

23 **SECTION 5.** Subsection 3 to section 43-32-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is created  
24 and enacted as follows:

25 3. The board may establish by rule, fees for administrative services which are consistent  
26 with the state's open record laws.

27 **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
28 amended and reenacted as follows:

29 **43-32-17. License required for practice - Titles.**

30 1. Except as otherwise provided under this chapter, a person may not engage in the  
31 practice of psychology unless that person is licensed as a psychologist or is registered

1 as a psychology resident under this chapter. Except as otherwise provided by this  
2 chapter, a person may not engage in the practice of industrial-organizational  
3 psychology unless that person is licensed as a psychologist or  
4 industrial-organizational psychologist or is registered as a psychology resident or  
5 industrial-organizational psychology resident under this chapter. Except as otherwise  
6 provided under this chapter, a person may not engage in the practice of applied  
7 behavior analysis unless that person is licensed as an applied behavior analyst or is  
8 registered and supervised as an applied behavior analyst as provided under this  
9 chapter.

10 2. A person may not use the title "psychologist" or similar title unless that person is  
11 licensed as a psychologist. A person may not use the titles "industrial psychologist",  
12 "organizational psychologist", or "industrial-organizational psychologist" unless that  
13 person is licensed as a psychologist or industrial-organizational psychologist. A person  
14 may not use the title "applied behavior analyst" or similar title unless that person is  
15 licensed as an applied behavior analyst. A person may not use the title "registered  
16 applied behavioral analyst" or similar title unless that person is registered and  
17 supervised as a registered applied behavior analyst.

18 3. A person may not use the title "psychology resident" or similar title unless that person  
19 is registered as a psychology resident. A person may not use the titles "industrial  
20 psychology resident", "organizational psychology resident", or  
21 "industrial-organizational psychology resident" unless that person is registered as a  
22 psychology resident or industrial-organizational psychology resident.

23 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-19.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
24 amended and reenacted as follows:

25 **43-32-19.1. Licensing applicant or registering applicants licensed or registered in**  
26 **other jurisdictions.**

27 1. The board may grant a license or registration to an applicant; who is licensed or  
28 registered in good standing in another jurisdiction; that imposes requirements for  
29 licensure or registration and who passes the oral examination on the law and rules  
30 regulating the practice of psychology, industrial-organizational psychology, or applied  
31 behavior analysis and meets one of the following requirements:

- 1           a. ~~The applicant is licensed in a jurisdiction that imposes requirements for licensure~~  
2           ~~which are at least as stringent as the requirements imposed in this state.~~Meets  
3           ~~standards established by the board; or~~
- 4           b. ~~The~~Is an applicant for licensure as a psychologist who holds a certificate of  
5           professional qualification in psychology issued by an entity approved by the  
6           board, such as the association of state and provincial psychology boards or its  
7           successor.
- 8           2. As a condition to qualify for licensure or registration under subsection 1, the board  
9           may require the applicant pass an oral examination on the laws and rules regulating  
10           the practice of psychology, industrial-organizational psychology, or applied behavior  
11           analysis, as appropriate to the licensure or registration sought by the applicant.
- 12           3. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of this chapter, the board may issue a license  
13           or registration as authorized under chapter 43-51.
- 14           4. ~~The board shall~~may grant a provisional license or registration to an applicant ~~to be an~~  
15           ~~applied behavior analyst or registered applied behavior analyst~~ while the application is  
16           pending, ~~provided~~if the applicant is:
- 17           a. ~~Licensed~~ licensed or registered and is in good standing in another jurisdiction; ~~or~~  
18           b. ~~Certified in good standing with the national behavior analyst certification board.~~
- 19           The board may not grant a provisional license or registration under this  
20           subsection if in another jurisdiction, within the previous five years, the applicant  
21           had a disciplinary action against the applicant's license or registration.
- 22           5. Except as otherwise provided under this chapter, and in accordance with rules  
23           adopted by the board, the board shall issue a limited practice certificate to an applicant  
24           who is licensed or registered in another jurisdiction to practice psychology,  
25           industrial-organizational psychology, or applied behavior analysis. A limited practice  
26           certificate issued under this subsection authorizes the practice of psychology,  
27           industrial-organizational psychology, or applied behavior analysis in this state for no  
28           more than thirty days in a calendar year.

29           **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
30           amended and reenacted as follows:

1           **43-32-20. Licensing - Written and oral examination - Qualifications of applicants.**

2           The board shall issue a license to each applicant who files an application upon a form and  
3 in a manner the board prescribes, submits the required fee, and meets the requirements of  
4 subsection 1 or 2.

5           1. An applicant for licensure as a psychologist shall demonstrate all of the following:

6           a. The applicant will adhere to the American psychological association ethical  
7 principles of psychologists and code of conduct adopted by the board by rule.

8           b. The applicant has received, from a school or college, a doctorate degree in a  
9 program ~~which meets any of the following requirements:~~

10           (1) ~~The program is accredited by the American psychological association or the~~  
11 ~~Canadian psychological association.~~

12           (2) ~~The program is designated as a doctoral program in psychology by the~~  
13 ~~association of state and provincial psychology boards.~~

14           (3) ~~The program~~that is accredited as a doctoral program in psychology by an  
15 accrediting body approved by the board by rule, which may include the  
16 American psychological association, Canadian psychological association, or  
17 the association of state and provincial psychology boards.

18           c. The applicant has passed the examinations, written, or oral, or both, as the board  
19 determines necessary.

20           d. The applicant has completed at least two full years of supervised professional  
21 experience, one year of which must be an internship program, and one year of  
22 which may be postdoctoral. Both years of experience must comply with the  
23 board's rules.

24           2. An applicant for licensure as an industrial-organizational psychologist shall  
25 demonstrate all of the following:

26           a. The applicant will adhere to the American psychological association ethical  
27 principles of psychologists and code of conduct adopted by the board by rule.

28           b. The applicant has received, from a school or college, a doctorate degree in a  
29 program of studies accredited by ~~the American psychological association or an~~  
30 accrediting body approved by the board by rule, which may include the American  
31 psychological association.

1           c. The applicant has passed the examinations, written, or oral, or both, as the board  
2           determines necessary.

3           d. The applicant has completed the professional experience requirements  
4           established by the board. The requirements may not exceed the professional  
5           experience requirements for psychologists. If the professional experience  
6           requirements include a supervised experience requirement:

7           (1) The board must allow an applicant to submit to the board a personalized  
8           plan for supervised experience which may include distance-supervision by a  
9           qualified industrial-organizational psychologist.

10          (2) The board may adopt rules to establish who is qualified to perform  
11          supervision, supervision requirements, and reporting.

12          **SECTION 9. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-20.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
13          amended and reenacted as follows:

14          **43-32-20.1. Postdoctoral supervised psychological employment.**

15          This section applies to postdoctoral supervised employment in the practice of psychology  
16          and industrial-organizational psychology. ~~Supervision may only be performed by a psychologist~~  
17          ~~or industrial-organizational psychologist with~~Before starting supervised employment, a  
18          psychologist with at least three years of post-license practice experience must be identified as  
19          the primary supervisor. The primary supervisor must have a competency in supervision in  
20          professional psychology in the general area of practice being supervised.

21          ~~Supervision must include at least two hours of regularly scheduled direct supervision a~~  
22          ~~week for full-time employment, one hour of which must be with the supervisor on a one-to-one~~  
23          ~~basis occur weekly and consist of at least one hundred hours of direct supervision, either~~  
24          ~~face-to-face or through distance communications. The remaining hour~~At least fifty of the hours  
25          of supervision must be with the primary supervisor. Additional hours of supervision may be with  
26          other professionals designated by the supervisor and competent in the area of practice being  
27          supervised. The board may adopt rules to prorate the two hours per week of supervision for  
28          individuals preparing for licensure on a part-time basis.

29          The board may adopt rules regarding postdoctoral psychology and industrial-organizational  
30          psychology supervision requirements and reporting.

1       **SECTION 10. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
2 amended and reenacted as follows:

3       **43-32-21. Consideration of application and notice to applicant.**

4       Upon investigation of the application and other evidence submitted, the board, ~~not less than~~  
5 ~~thirty days before the examination~~, shall notify each applicant that the application and evidence  
6 submitted for licensing is satisfactory and accepted, or unsatisfactory and rejected. If rejected,  
7 the notice must state the reasons for rejection and explain the right to a hearing under chapter  
8 28-32, if a hearing is requested within thirty days.

9       **SECTION 11. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-26 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
10 amended and reenacted as follows:

11       **43-32-26. Issuance and display of license.**

12       The board is the sole agency empowered to examine competence in the practice of  
13 psychology. A license certificate of license or registration issued by the board must show the full  
14 name of the licensee, have a serial number, be signed by the president of the board, and be  
15 attested by the secretary under the board's adopted seal. The license issued by the board  
16 under this chapter must be prominently displayed at the principal place of business at which the  
17 licensee practices.

18       **SECTION 12. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
19 amended and reenacted as follows:

20       **43-32-27. Denial - Revocation or suspension of license or registration - Grounds.**

- 21       1. The board, after notice, hearing, and an affirmative vote of at least a majority of board  
22 members, may withhold, deny, revoke, or suspend any license or registration issued or  
23 applied for under this chapter and may otherwise discipline a licensee, a registrant, or  
24 an applicant upon proof the applicant, registrant, or licensee:
- 25       a. Has been convicted of an offense determined by the board to have a direct  
26 bearing upon an individual's ability to serve the public as ~~a psychologist or~~  
27 ~~industrial-organizational psychologist~~ in the practice of psychology or applied  
28 behavior analysis, or if the board finds, after the conviction of any offense, that an  
29 individual is not sufficiently rehabilitated under section 12.1-33-02.1.
- 30       b. Is unable to practice psychology or applied behavior analysis with reasonable  
31 skill and safety to clients or patients by reason of illness, inebriation, misuse of

- 1                   drugs, narcotics, alcohol, chemicals, or any other substance, or as a result of any  
2                   mental or physical condition.
- 3                   c. Has impersonated another individual holding a ~~psychology or-~~  
4                   ~~industrial-organizational psychology~~ license or registration issued under this  
5                   chapter or allowed another person to use the licensee's license or registration.  
6                   d. Has used fraud or deception in applying for a license or registration or in taking  
7                   an examination under this chapter.
- 8                   e. Has allowed the licensee's or registrant's name or license or registration issued  
9                   under this chapter to be used in connection with any person who performs  
10                  psychological or applied behavior analysis services outside of the area of that  
11                  person's training, experience, or competence.
- 12                  f. Is legally adjudicated insane or mentally incompetent. The record of the  
13                  adjudication is conclusive evidence of that fact.
- 14                  g. Has engaged in any form of unethical conduct as defined in ethical principles of  
15                  ~~psychologists and code of conduct of the American psychological association-~~  
16                  adopted by the board by rule.
- 17                  h. Has become grossly negligent in the practice of psychology or  
18                  ~~industrial-organizational psychology~~applied behavior analysis.
- 19                  i. Has willfully or negligently violated this chapter.
- 20                  j. Has engaged in an act in violation of rules adopted by the board.
- 21                  k. Has had a license or registration revoked or suspended or was disciplined in  
22                  another jurisdiction.
- 23                  2. The board may assess costs incurred by the board related to investigations and  
24                  disciplinary actions. By rule, the board may set fines for minor infractions of this  
25                  chapter.
- 26                  3. An individual whose license or registration has been revoked under this section may  
27                  not reapply for licensure or registration for at least two years after the date of  
28                  revocation.
- 29                  4. Other than the term "in good standing", by rule, the board shall define terms related to  
30                  license status, such as "revoked", "suspended", "inactive", and "probationary".

1       **SECTION 13. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-27.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
2 amended and reenacted as follows:

3       **43-32-27.1. Complaints - Investigations.**

- 4       1. A person aggrieved by the actions of a licensee, registrant, or psychology resident  
5 may file a written ~~complaint~~statement with the board citing the specific allegations of  
6 misconduct by the licensee. The board shall notify the licensee, registrant, or  
7 psychology resident of the ~~complaint~~allegation and request a written response ~~from~~  
8 the licensee. The board may establish procedural exceptions for processing multiple  
9 ~~complaints~~allegations from the same ~~complainant~~person.
- 10       2. The board ~~may investigate a complaint on the board's own motion~~shall determine if  
11 the information in an allegation warrants investigation as a complaint, without requiring  
12 the identity of the ~~complainant~~source of the information to be made a matter of public  
13 record, if the board concludes that good cause exists for preserving the confidentiality  
14 of the ~~complainant~~source.
- 15       3. A licensee, registrant, or psychology resident who is the subject of an investigation by  
16 the board shall cooperate fully with the investigation. Cooperation includes responding  
17 fully and promptly to any reasonable question raised by or on behalf of the board  
18 relating to the subject of the investigation and providing copies of patient or client  
19 records if reasonably requested by the board and accompanied by the appropriate  
20 release.
- 21       4. In order to pursue an investigation, the board may subpoena and examine witnesses  
22 and records, including patient and client records, and may copy, photograph, or take  
23 samples of the records. The board may require the licensee, registrant, or psychology  
24 resident to give statements under oath, to submit to a physical or psychological  
25 examination, or both, by a physician or other qualified evaluation professional selected  
26 by the board, if requiring an examination is in the best interest of the public. The  
27 patient and client records released to the board are not public records. The board may  
28 adopt rules to assign, define duties, and compensate an investigator to assist the  
29 board to process a complaint.
- 30       5. Unless a patient or client release is on file allowing the release of information at the  
31 public hearing, patient and client records acquired by the board in the board's

1 investigation are confidential and closed to the public. All board meetings at which  
2 patient or client testimony or records are taken or reviewed are confidential and closed  
3 to the public. If patient or client testimony or records are not taken or reviewed, the  
4 remainder of the meeting is an open meeting unless a specific exemption is otherwise  
5 applicable.

6 **SECTION 14. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **43-32-30. Persons exempt from this chapter.**

9 This chapter does not apply to:

- 10 1. A student or intern pursuing a course of study in psychology, industrial-organizational  
11 psychology, or applied behavior analysis at a school or college, if the activities and  
12 services are a part of the individual's supervised course of study and are under the  
13 supervision of a licensed psychologist, industrial-organizational psychologist, or  
14 applied behavior analyst. The student or intern may not use the title "psychologist",  
15 "industrial-organizational psychologist", "licensed behavior analyst", or "registered  
16 applied behavior analyst" ~~and the~~. The student or intern status and the supervisor  
17 must be clearly stated.
- 18 2. ~~A nonresident licensed, registered, or certified in the state of the individual's residence~~  
19 ~~who does not practice psychology, industrial-organizational psychology, or applied~~  
20 ~~behavior analysis in this state for a period of more than thirty days in any calendar~~  
21 ~~year.~~
- 22 3. A lecturer, from any school or college, who uses an academic or research title when  
23 lecturing to institutions or organizations. However, the lecturer may not engage in the  
24 practice of psychology, applied behavior analysis, or industrial-organizational  
25 psychology unless the lecturer is licensed or registered under this chapter.
- 26 4.3. An individual employed by a public school if that individual's activities and services are  
27 restricted to the practice of psychology in the district or service unit of employment.  
28 This exemption applies only if the individual has received a master's degree in school  
29 psychology from an accredited graduate training program. Standards must be  
30 established by mutual consent of the board and the superintendent of public  
31 instruction.

- 1     ~~5.4.~~   A person certified, licensed, or registered in this state in another health care  
2           profession, or as a member of the clergy functioning in a ministerial capacity, whose  
3           scope of practice is consistent with the accepted standards of that person's  
4           profession. A person claiming an exemption under this subsection may not represent  
5           to be rendering psychological or applied behavior analysis services.
- 6     ~~6.5.~~   An applicant licensed to practice psychology or industrial-organizational psychology in  
7           another jurisdiction, pending disposition of the applicant's application in this state, if  
8           the applicant notifies the board on a form provided by the board of the applicant's  
9           intent to practice pending disposition of the application and the applicant adheres to  
10          the requirements of this chapter and the rules adopted by the board.
- 11    ~~7.6.~~   A person employed by an agency, a nonprofit corporation, or an institution if that  
12          person is currently exempt from licensure. A person exempt under this subsection  
13          continues to be exempt if the person continues employment in the same position with  
14          the agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution that applied for and received the  
15          exemption.
- 16    ~~8.7.~~   An individual providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual in a public  
17          school setting.
- 18    ~~9.8.~~   An individual providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual served by a  
19          public or private service agency licensed by the state to provide residential,  
20          habilitative, vocational, or social support services as defined by the board when  
21          performed as part of an individual support plan supervised by a professional employee  
22          meeting the requirements of that agency's licensure standards, provided the  
23          professional employee does not represent to the public as a registrant ~~or an~~, applied  
24          behavior analyst, or psychologist.
- 25    ~~10.9.~~ An individual who is implementing applied behavior analysis services to an immediate  
26          family member or as a paid or volunteer caregiver implementing procedures  
27          established by the family or by the individual served in any setting, if the individual or  
28          caregiver does not represent as a registrant or an applied behavior analyst.
- 29    ~~11.10~~ An individual licensed as an occupational therapist or an occupational therapy  
30          assistant pursuant to chapter 43-30 within the body of knowledge and scope of  
31          professional practice of occupational therapy.

1       **SECTION 15. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-34 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
2 amended and reenacted as follows:

3       **43-32-34. Applied behavior analysis - Renewal - Fees.**

- 4       1. The board shall issue a license or registration to each applicant who files an  
5 application for registration as a registered applied behavior analyst or for licensure as  
6 an applied behavior analyst upon a form and in a manner the board prescribes;  
7 submits the required fee established by the board; and demonstrates the applicant  
8 meets the requirements of subsection 2.
- 9       2. An applicant under this section shall demonstrate the applicant:
- 10       a. Has met board-approved education requirements, such as the education  
11 requirements of the board-certified behavior analyst standards;
- 12       b. Has passed a board-approved demonstration of professional competence, such  
13 as a standardized examination specific to the profession such as the  
14 board-certified behavior analyst examination;
- 15       c. Is credentialed as a behavior analyst by a board-approved credentialing entity,  
16 such as the behavior analyst certification board; and
- 17       d. Has established supervision requirements as determined by the board for  
18 practice when applying as a registered applied behavior analyst.
- 19       3. The board may withhold, deny, revoke, or suspend a license or registration for applied  
20 behavior analyst applied for or issued under this chapter and otherwise may discipline  
21 a license or registration holder or applicant in the same manner provided under  
22 section 43-32-27.
- 23       4. A complaint regarding or board investigation of a licensed or registered applied  
24 behavior analyst is filed or conducted in the same manner as provided under section  
25 43-32-27.1.
- 26       5. ~~If an individual employed in the state on August 1, 2011, in the practice of applied~~  
27 ~~behavior analysis submits to the board a written request before January 1, 2013, the~~  
28 ~~required license or registration application fee, and a written statement from the~~  
29 ~~applicant's employer that the applicant's employment remains satisfactory, the board~~  
30 ~~shall issue to that applicant:~~

- 1           a. ~~A license as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant is employed in a position-~~  
2                     ~~granted license exemption by the board and submits a letter of endorsement from-~~  
3                     ~~the licensed psychologist supervisor.~~
- 4           b. ~~A license as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant has a master's degree in-~~  
5                     ~~psychology and is employed as a behavior analyst as verified in writing by the-~~  
6                     ~~applicant's employer. Acceptable work titles for an applicant under this-~~  
7                     ~~subdivision include behavior analyst, behavior interventionist, and behavior-~~  
8                     ~~modification specialist.~~
- 9           c. ~~Registration as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant has a bachelor's-~~  
10                    ~~degree; provides a board approved plan of supervision from a licensed-~~  
11                    ~~psychologist or applied behavior analyst; and is employed as a behavior analyst-~~  
12                    ~~as verified in writing by the applicant's employer. Acceptable work titles for an-~~  
13                    ~~applicant under this subdivision include behavior analyst, behavior interventionist,~~  
14                    ~~and behavior modification specialist.~~

15           **SECTION 16. STATE BOARD OF PSYCHOLOGIST EXAMINERS - EDUCATION.** During  
16 the 2015-17 biennium, the state board of psychologist examiners shall provide in-state,  
17 comprehensive training for state agencies and boards regarding current regulator best practices  
18 relating to professions regulated by the state.

19           **SECTION 17. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general  
20 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$20,000, or so much of the  
21 sum as may be necessary, to the state board of psychologist examiners for the purpose of  
22 providing training as directed under section 16 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1,  
23 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
