- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 43-17-07.3 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to certification of medical psychologists; to amend and reenact subsection 3 of section-
- 3 26.1-14-02, subsection 1 of section 43-15-01, subsection 26 of section 43-15-01, section
- 4 43-15-31.1, subsection 4 of section 43-15-31.5, and sections 43-17-01, 43-17-02, 43-17-02.2,
- 5 43-32-01, 43-32-08, and 43-32-32 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to certification of
- 6 medical psychologists; and to provide a penalty.for an Act to provide for a report to the

7 <u>legislative management regarding medical psychologist licensure.</u>

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 26.1-14-02 of the North Dakota

7	order of a physician, a physician assistant, medical psychologist, or nurse-
8	practitioner authorized to prescribe such a drug.
9	b. The term does not include the regular ongoing delivery of a drug to the patient in-
10	a health care setting and other parenteral administration of a drug.

20	physician, medical psychologist, optometrist, dentist, veterinarian, or other practitioner.

9		cognitive, nervous, emotional, or behavioral disorder.

5	SECTION 1. SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AND HEALTH SCIENCES ADVISORY COUNCIL -
6	STUDY OF MEDICAL PSYCHOLOGIST LICENSURE - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE
7	MANAGEMENT. During the 2015-16 interim, the university of North Dakota school of medicine
8	and health sciences advisory council shall study the feasibility and desirability of licensing
9	medical psychologists. The study must include evaluation of whether licensure of medical
10	psychologists would integrate behavioral health into primary care and whether the practice of
11	medical psychology would result in safe and effective treatment of patients with behavioral
12	health concerns. If the school of medicine and health sciences advisory council determines it is
13	feasible and desirable to license medical psychologists in this state, the study must include
14	consideration of licensure requirements, scope of practice, which licensure board would be best
15	suited to license medical psychologists, and terminology. Before July 1, 2016, the school of
16	medicine and health sciences advisory council shall report the outcome of the study,
17	recommendations, and related proposed legislation to a legislative management committee
18	charged with studying human services-related topics.
