1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 54-01-29 of the North Dakota Century Code,

2 relating to negotiation for the transfer of excess lands around Lake Sakakawea and Lake-

3 Oahe.for an Act to create and enact section 54-01-29.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,

4 relating to the encouragement of federal legislation to return lands and mineral rights to the

5 <u>state.</u>

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. Section 54-01-29 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as
 follows:
 <u>54-01-29. Negotiation for the transfer of excess lands Generally.</u>
 <u>1.</u> The state board of university and school lands shall negotiate with the United States
 army corps of engineers for the return of excess lands around Lake Sakakawea above
 elevation 1,854 feet mean sea level and excess lands around Lake Oahe above 1,617
 feet mean sea level to the state for transfer to the appropriate persons.
- <u>14</u> <u>2.</u> If the United States army corps of engineers transfers land surrounding Lake
 <u>15</u> Sakakawea or Lake Oahe to the state government, the ownership of land located
 <u>within a Native American reservation is to be determined by the tribe and the</u>
 <u>ownership of land not located within a reservation is to be determined by the</u>
 <u>appropriate county. The state board of university and school lands shall accept</u>
- 19 <u>temporary transfer of the land.</u>
 20 SECTION 1. Section 54-01-29.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted

21 as follows:

22 <u>54-01-29.1. Federal legislation encouraged to return lands and mineral rights to the</u>

1	Uplands of the Oahe Reservoir in Emmons and Morton Counties in North Dakota above the
2	elevation of 1,620 feet [493.78 meters] are defined as access lands to the operation of the
3	Oahe Dam. The North Dakota legislative assembly encourages Congress to pass federal
4	legislation to return those lands and mineral rights to the state of North Dakota and the North
5	Dakota legislative assembly encourages the governor of North Dakota to work with the North
6	Dakota congressional delegation and Congress to secure enactment of necessary federal
7	legislation.
