- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 39-06.1-06 and section
- 2 39-21-44.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to covering a load in a vehicle and fee
- 3 for a violation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 2 of section 39-06.1-06 of the North Dakota
- 6 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 2. For a moving violation as defined in section 39-06.1-09, a fee of twenty dollars, except for:
- 9 a. A violation of section 39-10-26, 39-10-26.2, 39-10-41, or 39-10-42, a fee of fifty dollars.
- b. A violation of section 39-10-05 involving failure to yield to a pedestrian or
 subsection 1 of section 39-10-28, a fee of fifty dollars.
- 13 c. A violation of section 39-21-41.2, a fee of twenty-five dollars.
- d. A violation of subsection 1 of section 39-12-02 or section 39-08-23, a fee of one hundred dollars.
- e. A violation of subdivision d of subsection 1 of section 39-12-04, a fee of one
 hundred dollars.
- f. A violation of subsection 1 of section 39-04-37 by an individual by becoming a resident of this state, a fee of one hundred dollars.
- g. A violation of subsection 2 of section 39-10-21.1, a fee of two hundred fifty dollars.
- h. A violation of section 39-10-59, a fee of one hundred dollars.
- i. A violation of section 39-09-01, a fee of thirty dollars.
- j. A violation of section 39-09-01.1, a fee of thirty dollars.

- 1 k. A violation of section 39-10-46 or 39-10-46.1, a fee of one hundred dollars.
- 2 <u>I. A violation of section 39-21-44.1 for not securely covering a load of soil, sand,</u>
 3 rock, rock chips, or gravel, a fee of one hundred dollars.
- **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-21-44.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

6 39-21-44.1. Vehicle to be constructed to prevent sifting or leaking loads.

- 1. No vehicle An individual may be driven or moved not operate a vehicle on any highway unless it is so the vehicle is constructed or loaded as to prevent itskeep the contents from dropping, sifting, leaking, or otherwise escaping therefrom within or on the vehicle, except that sand may be dropped for the purpose of securing traction, or and water or other substance may be sprinkled on a roadway in cleaning or maintaining the roadway.
- 2. No personAn individual may not operate on any highway any vehicle with any load unless the load and any covering thereonon the vehicle is securely fastened so as to prevent saidthe covering or load from becoming loose, detached, or in any manner a hazard to other users of the highway.
- 3. An individual may not operate a vehicle with a registered gross weight that exceeds twenty thousand pounds [9071.84 kilograms] on any highway if the vehicle is used to haul a load of soil, sand, rocks, rock chips, or gravel without a secure cover that keeps the load within or on the vehicle, unless the vehicle is owned or operated by the state or a political subdivision.
