- 2 54-35.2-04, and 54-35.2-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to transforming the
- 3 advisory commission on intergovernmental relations into legislative management appointed
- 4 task forces on intergovernmental issues.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-35.2-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 54-35.2-01. Advisory commission Task force on intergovernmental relationsissues -9 Membership - Terms - Meetings. 10 1. The advisory commissionlegislative management may from time to time appoint task 11 forces on intergovernmental relations consists of twelve members: 12 The North Dakota league of cities executive committee shall appoint two-a. 13 members of the commission. 14 b. The North Dakota association of counties executive committee shall appoint two-15 members of the commission. 16 The North Dakota township officers association executive board of directors shall C. 17 appoint one member of the commission. 18 The North Dakota recreation and park association executive board shall appoint d. 19 one member of the commission. 20 e. 2		appoint to each task force representatives of political subdivisions, the governor	
3		or the governor's designee, and members of the legislative assembly. The	
4	I	majority of the members of any task force appointed must be members of the	
5		legislative assembly. Task force appointees as representatives of political	
6		subdivisions may be selected from nominees of the North Dakota league of	
7		cities, association of counties, township officers association, recreation and park	
8		association, and school boards association.	
9	2.	The legislative management shall designate the chairman and vice chairman and the	
10		study directive of the commissioneach task force.	
11	3.	All members of the commission shall serve for a term of two years, beginning July first	
12		of each odd-numbered year, and may be reappointed for additional terms.	
13	4.	If any member of the commission resigns or ceases to be a member of the class the	
14		member represents, that person's membership on the commission ceases	
15		immediately and the appropriate appointing authority may appoint a new member for-	
16		the remainder of the term.	
17	5.	The commissionEach task force shall meet at least semiannuallyat the call of its

31	amended and reenacted as follows:			

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1 **54-35.2-05.** Reports.

2 The advisory commissionEach task force on intergovernmental relationsissues shall report

- 3 its findings and recommendations and any proposed legislation necessary to implement the
- 4 recommendations to the legislative management at the time and in the manner reports are-
- 5 made by interim committees of the legislative management. The legislative management may
- 6 accept, reject, or amend the report of the advisory commission on intergovernmental relations.
- 7 The legislative management shall include the report, or any portion of it, as accepted, rejected,
- 8 or amended, in the legislative management's final report. Copies of the report of the advisory-
- 9 commission on intergovernmental relations, as accepted, rejected, or amended by the
- 10 legislative management, must be available to counties, cities, townships, appropriate state-
- 11 departments and agencies, and the publicby the deadline provided by the legislative
- 12 <u>management when the task force was appointed</u>.
