- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact sections 43-20-14, 43-20-15, and 43-28-02.1 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to advanced practice dental hygienists and practice on Indian
- 3 reservations; to amend and reenact sections 43-20-01.1, 43-20-01.2, 43-20-01.4, 43-20-02.1,
- 4 43-20-03, 43-20-05, 43-20-08, 43-20-10, 43-20-11, 43-20-12.2, 43-20-12.3, and 43-28-06 and
- 5 subsection 9 of section 43-28-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to advanced
- 6 practice dental hygienists and the practice of dental-related fields on Indian reservations; to
- 7 provide a penalty; and to provide for a report to the legislative management and the
- 8 administrative rules committee; and to provide for application.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 12 **43-20-01.1. Definitions.**
- As used in this chapter and chapter 43-28, unless the context otherwise requires:
- 1. "Advanced practice dental hygiene" means the performance of one or more of the following procedures:
- 16 <u>a.</u> Oral evaluation and assessment of dental disease and the formulation of an
 17 <u>individualized treatment plan and charting:</u>
- b. Cavity preparation and restoration for primary and permanent teeth;
- 19 <u>c. Extraction of primary teeth;</u>
- d. Simple, nonsurgical extractions of periodontally diseased permanent teeth with
- 21 tooth mobility of +3 to +4 as long as the teeth are not impacted, fractured,
- 22 <u>unerupted, or in need of sectioning for removal;</u>
- e. Pulpotomy on primary teeth;

1 Preparation and placement of a preformed crown, placement of a temporary 2 crown, recementing of a permanent crown, and placement and removal of space 3 maintainers; 4 Fabrication of an athletic mouth guard and soft occlusal guard; g. 5 Pulp vitality testing and indirect and direct pulp capping on primary and <u>h.</u> 6 permanent teeth; 7 Application of desensitizing medication or resin; 8 Tissue conditioning and soft reline; į. 9 Tooth reimplantation and stabilization of reimplanted teeth; <u>k.</u> 10 I. A brush biopsy; 11 Repair of a defective prosthetic device; <u>m.</u> 12 Administration of nitrous oxide analgesia; <u>n.</u> 13 Emergency palliative treatment of dental pain and performing management of <u>0.</u> 14 dental trauma, including a minor surgical care extraction and suturing; and 15 Referrals. <u>p.</u> 16 <u>2.</u> "Advanced practice dental hygienist" means an individual certified by the board to 17 practice advanced practice dental hygiene under the general supervision of a dentist 18 and in accordance with a collaborative management agreement. 19 "Dental assistant" means an individual who provides dental assistance under the <u>3.</u> 20 supervision of a dentist and within the scope of practice established by rule and 21 section 43-20-13. 22 2.4. "Dental hygiene" means the removal of accumulated matter from the natural and 23 restored surfaces of teeth and from restorations in the human mouth; the polishing of 24 such surfaces; and the topical application of drugs to the surface tissues of the mouth 25 and to the surface of teeth, if such acts are performed under the direct, indirect, or 26 general supervision of a dentist. 27 "Dental hygienist" means an individual licensed by the board to practice dental <u>5.</u> 28 hygiene. 29 3.6. "Qualified dental assistant" means an individual registered as a qualified dental 30 assistant to provide dental assistance as established by rule.

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- 1 4.7. "Registered dental assistant" means an individual registered as a registered dental assistant to provide dental assistance as established by rule.
- 3 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-20-01.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is 4 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-20-01.2. Dental hygienist licensing- <u>Advanced practice dental hygienist</u> certification.

- 1. An individual seeking to practice dental hygiene or advanced practice dental hygiene in this state shall apply to the executive director of the board on forms prescribed by the board. The application must be verified under oath to the effect that all of the statements contained in the application are true to the applicant's own knowledge, and must be received by the executive director of the board at least thirty days before the board meeting at which the application is considered. The applicant shall enclose with the application a recent autographed picture of the applicant and an application fee established by the board by rule.
- 2. The board may grant a license to practice dental hygiene to an applicant who has met all of the following requirements:
- 4. <u>a.</u> The applicant is a graduate of a dental hygiene school accredited by the American dental association's commission on dental accreditation.
- 2. <u>b.</u> The applicant has passed an examination administered by the joint commission on national dental examinations.
 - 3. c. The applicant has passed a clinical competency examination administered by a regional dental testing service or a licensing jurisdiction approved by the board by rule.
- 4. d. The applicant has passed, within one year of making application, a written examination on the laws and rules governing the practice of dentistry in this state.
 - 5. <u>e.</u> Grounds for denial of the application under section 43-20-05 do not exist.
- 27 <u>6. f.</u> The applicant has met any requirement for licensure established by the board by rule.
- 3. The board may issue a certificate to practice advanced practice dental hygiene to an
 applicant who has met all of the following requirements:
 - <u>a.</u> The applicant is a dental hygienist, in good standing.

- 3. If the renewal application, renewal fee, and proof of completion of continuing
 education are not received by December thirty-first of the odd-numbered year, the
 license or certificate expires and the dental hygienist may not practice dental hygiene
 or the advanced practice dental hygienist may not practice advanced practice dental
 hygiene.
 - 4. Within sixty days after December thirty-first of the odd-numbered year, an expired license <u>or certificate</u> may be renewed by submitting the renewal application, renewal fee, proof of completion of continuing education, and a late fee established by the board by rule.
 - 5. If the renewal application, renewal fee, proof of completion of continuing education, and late fee are not received within sixty days after December thirty-first of the odd-numbered year, the license or certificate may not be renewed, and the dental hygienist mustor advanced practice dental hygienist shall apply for and meet the requirements for licensure in order to be granted a license or certificate.
 - 6. The board may extend the renewal deadlines for a dental hygienist <u>or advanced</u>

 <u>practice dental hygienist</u> providing proof of medical or other hardship rendering the dental hygienist <u>or advanced practice dental hygienist</u> unable to meet the deadline.
 - 7. The board may audit continuing education credits. Each licensee and certificate holder shall maintain certificates or records of continuing education activities for three years. Upon receiving notice of an audit from the board, a licensee or certificate holder shall provide satisfactory documentation of attendance at, or participation in, the continuing education activities listed on the licensee's or certificate holder's continuing education form. Failure to comply with the audit is grounds for nonrenewal of or disciplinary action against the licenselicensee or certificate holder.

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-20-02.1. Conviction not bar to licensure or certification - Exceptions.

Conviction of an offense does not disqualify a <u>personan individual</u> from licensure <u>or certification</u> under this chapter unless the board determines that the offense has a direct bearing upon a <u>person'san individual's</u> ability to serve the public as a dental hygienist <u>or advanced</u>

1 43-20-05. Licenses and registrations - Denial and discipline.

- 2 The board may deny an application for or take disciplinary action against a dental
- 3 hygienist's license, an advanced practice dental hygienist's certificate, or a registered or
- 4 qualified dental assistant's registration, upon any one or more of the following grounds:
- Gross immorality or unprofessional conduct, which includes knowingly failing to
 comply with commonly accepted national infection control guidelines and standards.
- 7 2. Failure, neglect, or refusal to renew a license biennially.
- 8 3. Nonobservance or violation of this chapter, or of any board rule adopted under this chapter.
- 4. Gross incompetency in the practice of dental hygiene <u>or advanced practice dental</u>
 hygiene.
- 5. Conviction of an offense determined by the board to have a direct bearing on the individual's ability to serve the public as a dental hygienist <u>or advanced practice dental hygienist</u>, or a registered or qualified dental assistant, or the board determines, following conviction for any offense, that the individual is not sufficiently rehabilitated under section 12.1-33-02.1.
- Been adjudged mentally ill and not judicially restored by the regularly constituted
 authorities.
- 7. Abused, is dependent on, or addicted to the use of alcohol or drugs.
- Engaged in fraud or deceit in obtaining a dental hygiene license, advanced practice
 dental hygienist, or dental assisting registration.
- 9. Disclosed confidential information.
- 23 10. Received a fee for the referral of patients to a dentist or dental hygienist.
- Used unethical measures to draw dental patronage from the practice of anotherlicensee.
- 26 12. Fraudulently prescribed or dispensed drugs or medications.
- 27 13. Knowingly submitted misleading, deceptive, untrue, or fraudulent information on a claim form, bill, or statement to a third party.
- Advised or directed patients to dental laboratories or dental laboratory technicians for
 a dental service or advised or directed patients to deal directly with laboratories or
 dental laboratory technicians.

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- 1 15. Violated the code of ethics adopted by the board by rule.
- Had a registration, certificate, or license suspended, revoked, or disciplined in another jurisdiction.
- Failed to report to the board in writing within sixty days a violation of this chapter or chapter 43-28.
- 6 18. Practiced outside the scope of practice established by the board by rules and this chapter.
- The procedure to be followed for taking disciplinary action must be the same as the procedure required by section 43-28-18.2.
- SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 12 **43-20-08.** Unlawful to practice without license or registration.
- A person may not practice dental hygiene <u>or advanced practice dental hygiene</u> or practice as a registered or qualified dental assistant in the state, without first obtaining from the board a license, <u>certificate</u>, or registration. A person may not practice as a dental assistant outside the scope of practice established by the board by rule and section 43-20-13.
- 17 **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-20-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 19 43-20-10. State board of dental examiners Authority Duty.
 - The board has the power and it is its duty to enforce the provisions of this chapter. The board has the power tomay make such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with this chapter, as may, in its judgment, be necessary for the proper enforcement of this chapter, and the examination of dental hygienists, advanced practice dental hygienists, and registered and qualified dental assistants for their conduct and practice. For purposes of this chapter, the board has the powers set forth in section 43-28-06.
- 26 **SECTION 9. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-20-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 43-20-11. Practice of dental hygiene supplemental to practice of dentistry.
- The practice of dental hygiene is hereby declared to be and advance practice dental hygiene
 are supplemental and auxiliary to the practice of dentistry in North Dakota. All particulars,
 requirements, regulations, control, and provisions of chapter 43-28 apply with equal force

- 1 wherein and so far as they may be to the extent the provisions are applicable to the practice of
- 2 dental hygienists and advanced practice dental hygienists, except as otherwise provided for in
- 3 this chapter.

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- 4 **SECTION 10. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-20-12.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 5 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 43-20-12.2. Notice to board of change of address.
 - A licensed dental hygienist, certified advanced practice dental hygienist, registered dental assistant, or qualified dental assistant shall notify the executive director of the board of dental examiners of any new address within thirty days of the address change. The notice required under this section must be given by certified mail, return receipt requested. A licensed dental hygienist, advanced practice dental hygienist, registered dental assistant, or qualified dental assistant may not practice in this state for more than thirty days after the change of address without complying with this section.
- SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-12.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 43-20-12.3. Supervised administration of anesthesia Board rules.
 - A licensed dentist may delegate to a dental hygienist licensed by the board the administration of block and infiltration anesthesia to a patient who is at least eighteen years old. The dental hygienist must be under the direct supervision of a dentist and the dental hygienist must complete the educational requirements as required by the commission on dental accreditation and approved by the board. An advanced practice dental hygienist may administer block and infiltration anesthesia under the general supervision of a dentist and the procedure must be in accordance with the collaborative management agreement. The board shall adopt rules to implement this section.
 - **SECTION 12.** Section 43-20-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
 - 43-20-14. Advanced practice dental hygienist Collaborative management agreement.
 - 1. An advanced practice dental hygienist may not practice advanced practice dental hygiene unless the advanced practice dental hygienist is participating within a collaborative management agreement with a supervising dentist. A supervising dentist shall provide or arrange for another dentist or specialist to provide any services

1 needed by the advanced practice dental hygienist's patient which exceed the 2 authorized scope of practice of the advanced practice dental hygienist. 3 A collaborative management agreement entered between a dentist and an advanced 4 practice dental hygienist must: 5 Address any limitation on services established by the supervising dentist, the <u>a.</u> 6 level of supervision required for various services or treatment settings, practice 7 protocols, recordkeeping, managing medical emergencies, quality assurance, 8 administering and dispensing medications, and supervision of dental assistants 9 and dental hygienists; 10 <u>b.</u> Include specific written protocols to govern situations in which the advanced 11 practice dental hygienist encounters a patient requiring treatment that exceeds 12 the authorized scope of practice of the advanced practice dental hygienist. 13 Be signed and maintained by the supervising dentist and the advanced practice <u>C.</u> 14 dental hygienist; and 15 Be submitted to the board upon request of the board. 16 To the extent authorized by the supervising dentist in the collaborative management <u>3.</u> 17 agreement and provided the supervising dentist is available for consultation by 18 telephone or other means of electronic communication, an advanced practice dental 19 hygienist may practice advanced practice dental hygiene procedures authorized under 20 this chapter in a practice setting where the supervising dentist is not onsite and has 21 not previously examined the patient. 22 SECTION 13. Section 43-20-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted 23 as follows: 24 43-20-15. Advanced practice dental hygienist - Drugs. 25 An advanced practice dental hygienist may not prescribe any drug. Within the parameters 26 of the collaborative management agreement, within the practice of advanced practice dental 27 hygiene, and with the authorization of the supervising dentist, an advanced practice dental 28 hygienist may provide, dispense, and administer the following drugs: analgesics, 29 antiinflammatories, and antibiotics. An advanced practice dental hygienist may not provide, 30 dispense, or administer a narcotic drug.

- SECTION 14. Section 43-28-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 3 **43-28-02.1. Tribal sovereignty.**
- This section reaffirms the sovereignty of native American tribes in the state. The legislative
- 5 <u>assembly recognizes that in accordance with federal law, a native American tribe in this state</u>
- 6 may authorize a dental provider, who is licensed, certified, or otherwise sanctioned by another
- 7 jurisdiction to provide dental services, to provide dental services on that Indian reservation.
- 8 **SECTION 15. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-28-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 **43-28-06**. Powers of board.
- 11 The board may:

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- Adopt and enforce reasonable rules to govern its proceedings and to carry out this
 chapter.
 - 2. Examine applicants for <u>licenses licensure</u>, <u>certification</u>, or registration to practice dentistry, dental hygiene, <u>advanced practice dental hygiene</u>, or dental assisting in this state, either by direct examination or by accepting the results of national or regional dental testing services in which the board participates or which the board recognizes.
 - 3. Issue, suspend, revoke, limit, cancel, restrict, and reinstate licenses <u>and certificates</u> to practice dentistry, <u>advanced practice dental hygiene</u>, or dental hygiene and the biennial certificates of registration upon any grounds authorized by this chapter or rules adopted by the board.
 - 4. Issue subpoenas to require the attendance of witnesses and the production of documentary evidence and may administer oaths. Any member or executive officer of the board may administer oaths to witnesses, or issue subpoenas, but all subpoenas so issued must be attested by the secretary who shall affix the seal of the board thereto.
 - Employ and compensate an executive director, attorneys, investigative staff, and clerical assistants and may perform any other duties imposed upon the board by this chapter.
 - Establish minimum continuing professional education requirements for dentists, dental hygienists, <u>advance practice dental hygienists</u>, and dental assistants.

4	located in a dentist shortage area;
5	<u>b.</u> The reduction in waiting times for needed dental services;
6	<u>c.</u> The decreased travel time for patients;
7	d. The impact on emergency room usage for dental care; and
8	e. The costs and savings to the public health care system.
9	3. During the 2015-16 interim, the board shall report to the administrative rules
10	committee on the status of implementation of this Act and the status of any
11	administrative rules necessitated under this Act. Until this Act is fully implemented and
12	the board has adopted rules necessitated under this Act, at each meeting of the
13	administrative rules committee held during the 2015-16 interim, the administrative

- 2. The board shall develop an evaluation process that focuses on assessing the impact of advanced practice dental hygienists in terms of patient safety, cost-effectiveness, and access to dental services. The process must focus on the following outcome measures:
 - a. The number of new patients served, their insurance status, and whether they are located in a dentist shortage area;
 - b. The reduction in waiting times for needed dental services;
 - c. The decreased travel time for patients;
 - d. The impact on emergency room usage for dental care; and
 - e. The costs and savings to the public health care system.
- 3. During the 2015-16 interim, the board shall report to the administrative rules committee on the status of implementation of this Act and the status of any administrative rules necessitated under this Act. Until this Act is fully implemented and the board has adopted rules necessitated under this Act, at each meeting of the administrative rules committee held during the 2015-16 interim, the administrative rules committee shall receive a report from the board on the status of implementation of this Act.

SECTION 18. APPLICATION. The board may wait to develop rules necessary to implement and enforce this Act until August 1, 2016, if the board by majority vote determines that additional information necessary to protect the public interest will become available before the date. However, the board shall work diligently to adopt rules to implement this Act.
