- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision a of subsection 3 of section 49-23-04 of the
- 2 North Dakota Century Code, relating to markers of excavation sites.for an Act to amend and
- 3 reenact section 49-23-01 and subsection 3 of section 49-23-05 of the North Dakota Century
- 4 <u>Code, relating to the removal of marking materials at excavation sites.</u>

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subdivision a of subsection 3 of section 49-23-04 of the North		
7	Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:		
8	a. An operator, within forty-eight hours, or any extension of that period, after		
9	receiving an excavation notice from the center, excluding Saturdays, Sundays,		
10	and holidays, unless otherwise agreed to between the excavator and operator,		
11	shall locate and mark or otherwise provide the approximate horizontal location of		
12	the underground facilities of the operator. Within ten days following excavation,		
13	the operator shall remove any markers placed by the operator to locate the		
14	underground facilities of the operator.		
15	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 49-23-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
16	amended and reenacted as follows:		
17	49-23-01. Definitions.		
18	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:		
19	1. "Abandoned" means no longer in service and physically disconnected from a portion		
20	of the facility or from any other facility that is in use or still carries services.		
21	2. "Board" means the board of directors of the nonprofit corporation governing the		
22	notification center under section 49-23-03.		
23	3. "Careful and prudent manner" means excavating within twenty-four inches [60.96		
24	centimeters] of the outer edges of an underground facility located manually and

1		marked by the owner or operator by stakes, paint, or other customary manner, and
2		supporting and protecting the uncovered facility.
3	4.	"Damage" means:
4		a. Substantial weakening of structural or lateral support of an underground facility;
5		b. Penetration, impairment, or destruction of any underground protective coating,
6		housing, or other protective device; or
7		c. Impact with or the partial or complete severance of an underground facility to the
8		extent that the facility operator determines that repairs are required.
9	5.	"Emergency" means a sudden, unexpected occurrence, involving a clear and
10		imminent danger, and demanding immediate action to prevent or mitigate loss of, or
11		damage to, life, health, property, or essential public services.
12	6.	"Emergency responder" means a fire department, a law enforcement officer, or other
13		emergency rescue service.
14	7.	"Excavation" means any operation in which earth, rock, or other materials in or below
15		the ground is moved or otherwise displaced by means of hand or power tools, power
16		equipment, or explosives and includes grading, trenching, digging, ditching, drilling,
17		augering, tunneling, boring, scraping, and cable or pipe plowing and driving. The term
18		does not include:
19		a. Opening a grave in a cemetery.
20		b. Plowing, cultivating, planting, harvesting, and similar operations in connection
21		with agricultural activities, unless any of these activities disturbs the soil to a
22		depth of eighteen inches [45.72 centimeters] or more.
23		c. Gardening and landscaping unless it disturbs the soil to a depth of twelve inches
24		[30.48 centimeters] or more.
25		d. Normal maintenance of roads and streets if the maintenance does not change
26		the original grade and does not involve the road ditch.
27		e. Normal repair and maintenance of track and track bed by a railroad on its own
28		right of way.
29	8.	"Excavator" means a person who conducts excavation.
30	9.	"Holiday" means New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents' Day, Good
31		Friday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans' Day,

1		Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. When a holiday falls on a Saturday, it is
2		observed on the preceding Friday as if the Friday were the holiday, and when a
3		holiday falls on a Sunday, it is observed on the following Monday as if the Monday
4		were the actual holiday.
5	10.	"Local governmental unit" means a county, township, or city.
6	11.	"Locate" means an operator's markings of an underground facility showing the
7		approximate horizontal location, including all lines, line direction, intersections, tees,
8		and lateral facilities.
9	12.	"Nonprofit corporation" means a corporation established under chapter 10-33.
10	13.	"Notification center" means a center that receives notice from an excavator of planned
11		excavation or any other request for location and transmits this notice to a participating
12		operator.
13	14.	"Tangible marking materials" means any material perceptible by touch used to mark
14		the location of an underground facility, including flags, stakes, poles, or other materials
15		inserted into or affixed to the ground. The term does not include paint, chalk, or other
16		liquid ink-based materials applied to the ground.
17	15.	_"Operator" means a person who owns or operates an underground facility, including a
18		master meter operator with underground facilities, or a state or local governmental
19		entity. The department of transportation is considered an operator for the department's
20		facilities buried on the department's rights of way. A person is not considered an
21		operator solely because the person is an owner or tenant of real property where
22		underground facilities are located if the underground facilities are used exclusively to
23		furnish services or commodities on that property.
24	<del>15.<u>16.</u></del>	"Underground facility" means an underground line, pipeline, cable, facility, system, and
25		its appurtenances used to produce, store, convey, gather, transmit, or distribute
26		communications, data, electricity, power, television signals, heat, gas, oil, petroleum
27		products, carbon dioxide, water, steam, sewage, hazardous liquids, and other similar
28		substances. Privately owned and operated underground facilities which do not extend
29		beyond the boundary of the private property are excluded.

2		movement, riot, accident, damage to a subsurface installation requiring immediate		
3		repair, or sabotage.

5	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 49-23-05 of the North Dakota Century		
6	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:			
7	3.	Assume ownership of materials used to mark the facility, use reasonable efforts to		
8		maintain markings during excavation, and when possible remove all tangible marking		
9		materials used to mark the facility upon completion of the excavation.
