SENATE BILL NO. 2085

(At the request of the North Dakota Board of Massage)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subdivision to subsection 2 of section 12-60-24 and
- 2 section 43-25-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to criminal history record checks
- 3 for massage therapists; and to amend and reenact sections 43-25-05, 43-25-09, 43-25-10,
- 4 43-25-14, and 43-25-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to massage therapist
- 5 licensure.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 SECTION 1. A new subdivision to subsection 2 of section 12-60-24 of the North Dakota
- 8 Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 9 The North Dakota board of massage for applicants, licensees, or investigations
 10 under chapter 43-25, except that criminal history checks need not be made
 11 unless required by the board.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

14 43-25-05. Board of massage - Terms.

15 The governor shall appoint a board of massage, to consist of five members. Three of the 16 members of the board must be massage therapists who are licensed in this state and actively 17 practicing massage in this state for at least the previous three years. The members must be 18 appointed for three years, staggered so that the term of one member expires each year. Two 19 additional members, who may not be massage therapists or immediate family members of a 20 massage therapist, nor have a direct and substantial financial interest in massage therapy, must 21 be appointed as consumer members for two-year terms, staggered so that the term of one 22 member expires each year. Each member of the board holds office until that member's 23 successor is appointed and gualified. Any member appointed to a term beginning after June 30, 24 2013, may only serve for a total of six consecutive years, after which that member may not be

1 reappointed unless a period of two years has passed since that member last served on the

2 board.

3 Within one month after appointment of a new member, the board shall meet at some

4 convenient place within the state and shall annually elect a president, vice president, and

5 secretary-treasurer. The secretary-treasurer must be bonded in the sum of one thousand dollars

6 for the faithful discharge of the secretary-treasurer's duties.

7 SECTION 3. Section 43-25-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted
8 as follows:

9 <u>43-25-08.1. Criminal history record checks.</u>

10 The board may require any applicant or licensee under this chapter to submit to a statewide

11 and nationwide criminal history record check. The nationwide criminal history record check must

12 be conducted in the manner provided by section 12-60-24. All costs associated with obtaining a

13 <u>background check are the responsibility of the applicant or licensee.</u>

14 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is

15 amended and reenacted as follows:

16 **43-25-09. License - Display - Renewal - Renewal fee.**

17 1. Each license must be conspicuously displayed at the place of practice.

- On or before January first of each year, each licensed massage therapist shall pay to
 the secretary-treasurer of the board a renewal fee of one hundred dollars or a lesser
 amount established by the board.
- Continuing education of at least thirty-twotwenty-four continuing education hours, or
 equivalent college credits, including at least three hours of ethics, submitted every two
 years is a further requirement for renewal of the license. The board may accept

continuing education attained by remote means. No more than twelvenine hours of a
 licensee's renewal hours may be by remote means. To qualify as continuing

education, the remote education must be board-approved for content and suitability.

- a. Odd-numbered licensed individuals report their continuing education in
 odd-numbered years and even-numbered licensed individuals report their
 continuing education in even-numbered years, based on the calendar year.
- 30 b. This subdivision applies for the Licensed individuals during their initial licensure

period. Individuals licensed on or before May thirty-first of their initial year, who-

1		would normally are not required to report hours of continuing education, based on-			
2		their license number being odd or even, would need to report at least sixteen			
3		hours. Those not required to submit continuing education that initial January first			
4		would report at least twenty-four hours by the following January first. Individuals			
5		licensed after May thirty-first of their initial year, who would normally report hours-			
6		of continuing education, based on their license number being odd or even would-			
7		not be required to report that cycle, but would report at least forty-eight hours for-			
8		the next cycle. Those not required to submit continuing education hours that			
9		initial January first would report at least sixteen hours by the following January-			
10		first. Thereafter, initialthe licensees would follow the normal renewal reporting-			
11		cycleshall report continuing education pursuant to subdivision a.			
12		c. The board may grant an individual waiver based on health issues or other good			
13		cause deemed sufficient by the board.			
14	4.	If the board reasonably believes a massage therapist or applicant is inhas a physical			
15		or mental condition jeopardizing the health of those who seek relief from the individual,			
16		the board may require the individual to have a physicalan appropriate examination by			
17		a competent medicalqualified examiner approved by the board. If the individual has			
18		had or has any communicable disease sufficient to disqualify the applicant to practice			
19		massage in the state, the board shall deny a license until the individual furnishes due			
20		proof of being physically and mentally competent and sound.			
21	5.	A holder of an expired license may within one year from the date of its expiration have			
22		the license renewed upon payment of the required renewal fee. The board may			
23		require production of a new certificate of physical examination and evidence of any			
24		required continued educational hours being completed.			
25	6.	All licenseholders must be designated as licensed massage therapists and may not			
26		use any title or abbreviation without the designation "massage therapist".			
27	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
28	amended and reenacted as follows:				
29	43-25-10. Disciplinary actions - Complaints.				
30	1.	The license of a massage therapist may be denied, revoked, suspended, or placed on			
31		probation for any of the following grounds:

1		a.	The licensee is guilty of fraud in the practice of massage or fraud or deceit in	
2			admission to the practice of massage.	
3		b.	The licensee has been convicted of an offense determined by the board to have	
4			a direct bearing upon a person's ability to serve the public as a massage	
5			therapist, or, following conviction of any offense, the person is not sufficiently	
6			rehabilitated under section 12.1-33-02.1. The conviction of an offense includes	
7			conviction in any jurisdiction in the United States of any offense, which if	
8			committed within this state would constitute an offense under this state's laws.	
9		C.	The licensee is engaged in the practice of massage under a false or assumed	
10			name, or is impersonating another practitioner of a like or different name.	
11		d.	The licensee is addicted to the habitual use of intoxicating liquors, or other legal	
12			or illegal drugs, to the extent the licensee is compromised or impaired from	
13			performing the professional duties of a massage therapist or is under the	
14			influence while assessing, treating, or seeing a client.	
15		e.	The licensee is guilty of untrue, fraudulent, misleading, or deceptive advertising,	
16			the licensee prescribes medicines, drugs, or the licensee infringes on any other	
17			licensed profession.	
18		f.	The licensee is guilty of gross negligence in the practice of massage, or is guilty	
19			of employing, allowing, or permitting any unlicensed person to perform massage	
20			in the licensee's establishment.	
21		g.	The licensee has violated this chapter or any rule adopted by the board.	
22	2.	A lic	ensee who violates this chapter or any rule adopted by the board may be	
23		asse	essed a civil penalty of up to onetwo hundred dollars.	
24	3.	A co	mplaint may be submitted to the board by any person or on its own motion. A	
25		com	plaint maymust be signed by the complainant. The president may initiate an	
26		inve	stigation of the complaint and report to the board.	
27	4.	Any	hearing regarding a disciplinary action or a denial of a license must be held	
28		purs	suant to chapter 28-32.	
29	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
30	amended and reenacted as follows:

43-25-14. Compensation of board members - Clerks.

The board members shall receive compensation for an in-person meeting in an amount to
 be established by rule not to exceed one hundred dollars per day or prorated for partial days the
 member is actually engaged in the performance of <u>other meetings and</u> official duties and
 payment for mileage and travel expenses as provided in sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09.
 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **43-25-18**. Reciprocity.

- 9 1. Any person who has been duly licensed and is in good standing in another state to 10 practice massage in a state that meets required educational hours and requirements 11 in this state, and who has been lawfully and continuously engaged in licensed practice 12 for two years or more immediately before filing of an application to practice in this 13 state, and who submits to the board a duly attested certificate from the examining 14 board of the state in which registered licensed, certifying to the fact of 15 registrationlicensure and being a person of good moral character and of professional 16 attainments, may upon paying a fee of one hundred fifty dollars or a lesser fee set by 17 the board be granted a license to practice in this state without being required to take 18 an examination.
- An applicant for licensure by reciprocity who has been duly licensed and is in good
 standing to practice massage in a state with substantially similar licensure standards
 as determined by the board and who has been lawfully and continuously engaged in
 licensed practice for five years or more immediately before filing of an application to
 practice in this state, may be granted a license by the board without being required to
 take an examination if the applicant otherwise meets all of the requirements of
 subsection 1.
