1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the commissioner of

2 university and school lands; to provide for transfers; to provide for distributions from permanent

3 funds; to create and enact a new section to chapter 44-04 of the North Dakota Century Code,

4 relating to the exempt records for the value of property paid to the state abandoned property

5 office; to amend and reenact section 57-62-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the

6 timing of grant recommendations; to provide for a legislative management study; and to declare

7 an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
10 as may be necessary, are appropriated from special funds derived from the state lands
11 maintenance fund and the oil and gas impact grant fund in the state treasury, to the
12 commissioner of university and school lands for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
13 commissioner of university and school lands, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and
14 ending June 30, 2017, as follows:

13	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION LINE ITEM TRANSFERS. Upon approval of the board of						
14	university and school lands, the commissioner of university and school lands may transfer						
15	between the various line items in section 1 of this Act, including transfers from the contingencies						
16	line item to all other line items. The commissioner shall notify the office of management and						
17	budget of each transfer made pursuant to this section.						
18	SECTION 4. DISTRIBUTIONS TO STATE INSTITUTIONS. Pursuant to article IX of the						
19	Constitution of North Dakota, the board of university and school lands shall distribute during the						
20	biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, the following amounts, from the						
21	permanent funds managed for the benefit of the following entities:

6	SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 44-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
7	and enacted as follows:			

- 8 Value of property paid or delivered to the administrator of the state abandoned
- 9 property office Exempt record.
- 10 <u>A record of the value of property paid or delivered to the administrator of the state</u>
- 11 <u>abandoned property office under section 47-30.1-17 is an exempt record.</u>
- 12 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 57-62-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 13 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 14 57-62-05. Powers and duties of energy infrastructure and impact office director.
- 15 The energy infrastructure and impact office director shall:
- Develop a plan for the assistance, through financial grants for services and facilities, of
 counties, cities, school districts, and other political subdivisions in coal development
 and oil and gas development impact areas.
- Establish procedures and provide proper forms to political subdivisions for use in
 making application for funds for impact assistance as provided in this chapter.

Make grants disbursements to counties, cities, school districts, and other taxing 22 districts for grants awarded by the board of university and school lands pursuant to 23 chapter 15-01, as provided in this chapter and within the appropriations made for such 24 purposes. In determining the amount of impact grants for which political subdivisions 25 are eligible, consideration must be given to the amount of revenue to which such 26 political subdivisions will be entitled from taxes upon the real property of coal and oil 27 and gas development plants and from other tax or fund distribution formulas provided 28 by law.
- 29 4. Receive and review applications for impact assistance pursuant to this chapter.
- 30 5. Make recommendations, not less than once each calendar quarter, to the board of
 31 university and school lands on grants to counties, cities, school districts, and other

1 political subdivisions in oil and gas development impact areas based on identified 2 needs, and other sources of revenue available to the political subdivision. 3 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - FEDERAL LEGISLATION 4 **REGARDING OAHE DAM.** During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall 5 consider studying progress on the passage of federal legislation to return excess lands to the 6 operation of the Oahe Dam in Emmons and Morton Counties, and to the state of North Dakota 7 pursuant to section 1 of House Bill No. 1456, as approved by the sixty-fourth legislative 8 assembly. The legislative management shall seek the input and assistance of representatives of 9 Morton and Emmons Counties, as well as the army corp of engineers, in advancing the study 10 and developing recommendations to achieve the passage of federal legislation. The legislative 11 management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation 12 required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly. 13 **SECTION 8. EMERGENCY.** Section 5 of this Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
