1 A BILL for an Act to establish a statewide human trafficking commission.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

3 SECTION 1.

4 <u>Human trafficking commission.</u>

5	<u>1.</u>	The	attorney general may establish a human trafficking commission, comprised of
6		<u>des</u>	ignees from state, local, and tribal agencies which have contact with victims or
7		per	petrators, nongovernmental organizations that represent or work with victims, and
8		othe	er organizations and individuals, including victims, whose expertise would benefit
9		<u>the</u>	commission. The attorney general may establish the commission by appointing an
10		<u>exis</u>	ting statewide coalition.
11	<u>2.</u>	The commission shall:	
12		<u>a.</u>	Develop a coordinated and comprehensive plan to provide victims with services;
13		<u>b.</u>	Collect and evaluate data on human trafficking in this state and submit an annual
14			report to the attorney general, governor, and legislature;
15		<u>C.</u>	Promote public awareness about human trafficking, victim remedies and
16			services, and trafficking prevention;
17		<u>d.</u>	Create a public-awareness sign that contains the national human trafficking
18			resource center hotline information, and any state or local hotlines that the
19			coalition deems appropriate;
20		<u>e.</u>	Coordinate training on human trafficking prevention and victim services for state
21			and local employees who may have recurring contact with victims or
22			perpetrators;

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1	<u>f.</u>	Coordinate training on human trafficking investigation and prosecution with the
2		North Dakota state's attorney's association, the North Dakota peace officers
3		standards and training board, and state and local law enforcement agencies; and
4	<u>g.</u>	Conduct other appropriate activities.
