The bill changes dates relating to the resident and nonresident muskrat trapping season.

This bill as currently written will shorten the length of the nonresident muskrat trapping season and set an end date for the resident season.

Last year we sold 69 NR Reciprocal Trapping licenses which cost \$350. If this bill were to pass, we believe that the number would be significantly reduced to approx. 15 licenses being sold. We estimate that NR licenses would be reduced by \$18,900 (54 x \$350) per year; total for biennium is \$37,800. The proposed bill would not take effect until the 2016 season. Therefore, only 1 year in the 15-17 biennium will be affected.
