1 A BILL ~~for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 53-06.1 of the North Dakota~~  
 2 ~~Century Code, relating to electronic pull tabs; and to amend and reenact section 53-06.1-01,~~  
 3 ~~subsection 4 of section 53-06.1-01.1, subsection 1 of section 53-06.1-06, subsection 5 of~~  
 4 ~~section 53-06.1-11, and section 53-06.1-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the~~  
 5 ~~use of electronic pull tabs and electronic pull tab devices.~~ for an Act to amend and reenact  
 6 section 53-06.1-01, subsection 4 of section 53-06.1-01.1, subsection 1 of section 53-06.1-06,  
 7 subsection 5 of section 53-06.1-11, and section 53-06.1-14 of the North Dakota Century Code,  
 8 relating to the use of electronic pull tabs and electronic pull tab devices.

9 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

10 ~~SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.~~ Section 53-06.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
 11 amended and reenacted as follows:  
 12 ~~53-06.1-01. Definitions.~~  
 13 ~~As used in this chapter:~~  
 14 ~~1. "Adjusted gross proceeds" means gross proceeds less cash prizes, cost of~~  
 15 ~~merchandise prizes, gaming tax, and federal excise tax imposed under section 4401~~  
 16 ~~of the Internal Revenue Code [26 U.S.C. 4401].~~  
 17 ~~2. "Charitable organization" means an organization whose primary purpose is for relief of~~  
 18 ~~poor, distressed, underprivileged, diseased, elderly, or abused persons, prevention of~~  
 19 ~~cruelty to children or animals, or similar condition of public concern.~~  
 20 ~~3. "Civic and service organization" means an organization whose primary purpose is to~~  
 21 ~~promote the common good and social welfare of a community as a sertoma, lion,~~

2 is under common control with another organization. Control exists when an

5 the authority or ability to directly or indirectly direct or cause the direction of the  
6 management or policies of another organization.

8 use in the conduct of games.
- 9 ~~6.~~ "Educational organization" means a nonprofit public or private elementary or  
10 secondary school, two-year or four-year college, or university.
- 11 ~~7.~~ "Electronic pull tab device" means a device, approved by the attorney general, which  
12 upon the insertion of cash, dispenses and displays an electronic pull tab in which the  
13 player may win credits that can be redeemed for cash or used to purchase more pull  
14 tabs. The term does not include a device that directly dispenses coins, cash, tokens,  
15 or anything else of value other than a credit ticket voucher.
- 16 ~~8.~~ "Eligible organization" means a veterans, charitable, educational, religious, fraternal,  
17 civic and service, public safety, or public-spirited organization domiciled in North  
18 Dakota or authorized by the secretary of state as a foreign corporation under chapter  
19 10-33, incorporated as a nonprofit organization, and which has been regularly and  
20 actively fulfilling its primary purpose within this state during the two immediately

18 devices, and bingo card marking devices; to ensure that net proceeds are used for  
19 educational, charitable, patriotic, fraternal, religious, or public spirited uses; to protect  
20 and promote the public interest; to ensure fair and honest games; to ensure that fees  
21 and taxes are paid; and to prevent and detect unlawful gambling activity.

30 the attorney general may allow an employee of an alcoholic beverage establishment to  
31 provide limited assistance to an organization.

7           bingo card, or fifty-fifty raffle system may only sell, market, or distribute the  
8           manufacturer's pull tab dispensing device and processing chip encoded with

17          gaming equipment or prize may be sold or leased at an excessive price.

19          and bingo cards, raffle board, punchboard, sports pool board, calcutta board, and  
20          series of paddlewheel ticket cards sold or otherwise provided to a licensed  
21          organization and shall purchase the stamps from the attorney general for thirty-five  
22          cents each. Ten cents of each stamp sold by the attorney general, up to thirty-six  
23          thousand dollars per biennium, must be credited to the attorney general's operating

- 11 b. If twenty-one and paddlewheels are not conducted but pull tabs is conducted  
12 involving either a jar bar or dispensing device, or ~~both~~ electronic pull tab device,  
13 or any combination, the monthly rent may not exceed four hundred dollars.

7 duplicate a manufacturer's processing chip encoded with proprietary software. No  
8 gaming equipment or prize may be sold or leased at an excessive price.

9 3. A licensed distributor shall affix a North Dakota gaming stamp to each deal of pull tabs  
10 and bingo cards, raffle board, punchboard, sports pool board, calcutta board, and  
11 series of paddlewheel ticket cards sold or otherwise provided to a licensed  
12 organization and shall purchase the stamps from the attorney general for thirty-five  
13 cents each. Ten cents of each stamp sold by the attorney general, up to thirty-six  
14 thousand dollars per biennium, must be credited to the attorney general's operating  
15 fund to defray the costs of issuing and administering the gaming stamps.

16 4. A licensed organization, organization that has a permit, licensed manufacturer, or  
17 North Dakota wholesaler of liquor or alcoholic beverages may not be a distributor or  
18 stockholder of a distributor. A distributor may not be a stockholder of a manufacturer.

19 5. In addition to the license fee, the attorney general may require advance payment of  
20 any fee necessary to pay the cost of a record check of an applicant according to  
21 subdivision c of subsection 5 of section 53-06.1-06.

22 6. A licensed manufacturer may not refuse to sell deals of pull tabs, paper bingo cards, or  
23 gaming equipment to a licensed distributor unless:

- 24 a. A specific deal of pull tabs is sold on an exclusive basis;
- 25 b. The manufacturer does not sell deals of pull tabs, paper bingo cards, or gaming  
26 equipment to any distributor in the state;
- 27 c. A gaming law or rule prohibits the sale;
- 28 d. The distributor has not provided the manufacturer with proof of satisfactory credit  
29 or is delinquent on any payment owed to the manufacturer; or
- 30 e. The distributor has not met the manufacturer's standard minimum order quantity  
31 and freight terms.
