1	A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 16.1-09-05 of the North Dakota Century Code,
2	relating to publishing and preserving statements of interests.for an Act to provide for a
3	legislative management study of statements of interests.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-09-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
6	amended and reenacted as follows:
7	— 16.1-09-05. Powers and duties of the secretary of state and county and city auditors.
8	1. The secretary of state, or the county or city auditor, when appropriate shall:
9	1. <u>a.</u> Accept and file any statement submitted pursuant to this chapter.
10	2. <u>b.</u> Make statements filed available for public inspection and copying during regular-
11	office hours. A reasonable fee may be charged to cover the cost of copying.
12	Proceeds from any fees charged must be deposited in the general fund of the
13	appropriate governmental entity.
14	3. <u>c.</u> Preserve statements filed under this chapter for the term of office to which the
15	person making disclosure is elected or appointed or until a new statement is filed
16	and preserve statements filed pursuant to this chapter by those candidates who-
17	are not elected or appointed for a period of one yearat least ten years after the
18	date of receipt.
19	2. The secretary of state shall make each statement filed under this chapter with the
20	secretary of state available on the internet to the public free of charge within fourteen
21	days after filing.
22	SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - STATEMENTS OF INTERESTS.
23	During the 2017-18 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the purpose

and content of statements of interests and the forms and information required to be filed,

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including the appropriate financial interests and other necessary content. The study must include consideration of whether supplementary statements or updates of information are necessary and a determination as to who is required to file statements of interest and who should be filing statements of interest. The study also must include a review of filing deadlines and consideration of how long records should be retained. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-sixth legislative assembly.
