- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 43-37 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to licensure of speech-language pathology assistants; to amend and
- 3 reenact sections 43-37-02, 43-37-03, 43-37-04, 43-37-04.1, 43-37-05, 43-37-06, 43-37-08,

4 43-37-09, 43-37-13, and 43-37-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the state board

- 5 of examiners on audiology and speech-language pathology and the regulation of
- 6 speech-language pathology assistants; to repeal section 43-37-01 of the North Dakota Century
- 7 Code, relating to legislative intent; to provide a penalty; and to provide an effective date.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-37-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

10 amended and reenacted as follows:

11 **43-37-02. Definitions.**

- 12 As used in this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
- 13 1. "Audiologist" means a person who practices an individual licensed by the board to
- 14 practice audiology and who holds out to the public by any title or description of
- 15 services incorporating the words audiologist, hearing clinician, hearing therapist, or
- 16 any similar title or description of service. A person may not use the term "audiologist"
- in a personal reference unless all the requirements of this chapter pertaining to
 audiology are met.
- "Audiology" means the application of principles, methods, and procedures of
 measurement, testing, evaluation, prediction, consultation, counseling, instruction,
 habilitation, or rehabilitation related to hearing and disorders of hearing including
 vestibular testing, for the purpose of evaluating, identifying, preventing, ameliorating,
 or modifying such disorders and conditions in individuals or groups of individuals.

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1	3.	"Board" means the state board of examiners on audiology and speech-language			
2		pathology.			
3	4.	"Habilitation" and "rehabilitation" include hearing aid evaluation and recommendation,			
4		auditory training, and speech reading.			
5	5.	"Person""Licensee" means a human beingan audiologist, speech-language			
6		pathologist, or speech-language pathology assistant.			
7	6.	"Speech-language pathologist" means a person who practicesan individual licensed			
8		by the board to practice speech-language pathology and meets all requirements of this-			
9		chapter pertaining to speech-language pathology.			
10	7.	"Speech-language pathology" means the application of principles, methods, and			
11		procedures for measurement, testing, evaluation, identification, prediction, counseling,			
12		or instruction related to the development and disorders of speech, language, voice,			
13		cognitive-communication, swallowing, and augmentative alternative communication for			
14		the purpose of identifying, evaluating, preventing, managing, habilitating or			
15		rehabilitating, ameliorating, or modifying such disorders and conditions in individuals			
16		or groups of individuals.			
17	<u>8.</u>	"Speech-language pathology assistant" means an individual licensed by the board to			
18		assist in the practice of speech-language pathology.			
19	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-37-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
20	amende	d and reenacted as follows:			
21	43-3	87-03. License required - Exceptions.			
22	<u>1.</u>	A person may not practice audiology or speech-language pathology, assist in the			
23		practice of speech-language pathology, or represent that the person is an audiologist			
24		or, speech-language pathologist <u>, or speech-language pathology assistant</u> in this state			
25		unless licensed annually in accordance with this chapter. However, this			
26	<u>2.</u>	A person may not hold out to the public by any title, abbreviation, or description of			
27		services incorporating the words audiologist, hearing clinician, hearing therapist,			
28		speech-language pathologist, speech-language pathologist assistant, or any similar			
29		title, abbreviation, or description of service unless licensed in accordance with this

- 31 <u>3.</u> <u>This</u> chapter does not prevent or restrict:

1 1. A physician or surgeon from engaging in the practice of medicine in this state. <u>a.</u> 2 2. <u>b.</u> A hearing aid specialist from engaging in testing of hearing and other practices 3 and procedures used solely for the fitting and selling of hearing aids in this state 4 as provided in chapter 43-33. 5 3. Any person licensed in this state by any other law from engaging in the <u>C.</u> 6 profession or occupation for which licensed. 7 4. A personAn individual who holds a valid credential as a speech-language d. 8 pathologist or teacher of the hearing-impaired, issued by the department of public 9 instruction, or a personan individual employed as an audiologist or 10 speech-language pathologist by the government of the United States, if such-11 personthat individual performs speech-language pathology or audiology services 12 solely within the confines or under the jurisdiction of the governmental or state 13 educational organization by which employed. However, such person may, without 14 obtaining a license under this chapter, that individual may consult with or 15 disseminate that person'sindividual's research findings and other scientific 16 information to individuals practicing speech-language pathologistspathology or 17 audiologistsaudiology outside the jurisdiction of the organization by which that 18 personindividual is employed. 19 5. The activities and services of a personan individual pursuing a course of study <u>e.</u> 20 leading to a degree in speech-language pathology, communication disorders, or 21 audiology at a college or university if such the activities and services constitute a 22 part of a supervised course of study and such personthat individual is designated 23 an audiology, communication disorder, or speech-language pathology intern, an 24 audiology, communication disorder, or speech-language pathology trainee, or by 25 any other such titlestitle clearly indicating the training status appropriate to the 26 level of training. 27 6. The activities and services of persons fulfilling the requirements of subsection 3 of 28 section 43-37-04. 29 7. f. The performance of audiology or speech-language pathology services in this 30 state by any personan individual not a resident of this state who is not licensed 31 under this chapter if such the services are performed for no more than five days in

1 any calendar year and in cooperation with an audiologist or speech-language 2 pathologist licensed under this chapter. 3 8. <u>g.</u> Any personAn individual holding a valid credential as a teacher of the 4 hearing-impaired issued by the council on education of the deaf from engaging in 5 the practice of habilitation and rehabilitation of individuals who are 6 hearing-impaired persons. 7 9. Any personAn individual possessing a valid certificate as a certified audiometric h. 8 technician recognized by the state board as meeting council for accreditation in 9 occupational hearing conservation standards appendix II or its equivalent from 10 providing audiometric testing if such service is performed in cooperation with 11 either an audiologist licensed under this chapter or a licensed physician. 12 10. <u>i.</u> Any personAn individual providing hearing screening services as part of a public 13 service project solely intended for the purposes of identification of hearing 14 impairment if such services are performed in cooperation with an audiologist 15 licensed under this chapter who is directly responsible for: 16 (1) The training of said personthis individual; a. 17 (2) The administration of hearing screening procedures; b. 18 C. (3) The interpretation of testing results; and 19 (4) Assuring appropriate referral and followup of the identified population. d. 20 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-37-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 21 amended and reenacted as follows: 22 43-37-04. Eligibility for licensure. 23 To be eligible for licensure by the board as an audiologist or, speech-language pathologist, 24 or speech-language pathology assistant, an applicant shall meet all the following requirements: 25 1. Be of good moral character. 26 2. Possess an appropriate degree from an educational institution recognized by the 27 board. 28 An applicant for a speech-language pathologist license shallmust possess at a. 29 least a master's degree in speech-language pathology. 30 b. An applicant for an audiologist license shallmust possess at least a doctorate 31 degree in audiology.

2			least a bachelor's degree in speech-language pathology or communication

4	3.	Submit evidence showing qualifications prescribed by rules of the board.				
5	4.	Pass an examination approved by the board within Within one year of application an

10	SEC	ECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-37-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
11	amende	ded and reenacted as follows:				
12	43-3	3-37-04.1. Licensing of out-of-state practitioners.				
13	1.	The	board may adopt rules establishing licensure requirements for applicants who			
14		holo	d a current license in good standing to practice as an audiologist or,			
15		spe	ech-language pathologist <u>, or speech-language pathology assistant</u> in a state or			
16		juris	diction other than this state and who are not the subject of a pending disciplinary			
17		acti	on in any state or jurisdiction.			
18	2.	Not	withstanding section 43-37-04, as it relates to the licensure eligibility of an			
19		out-	of-state audiologist or , speech-language pathologist, <u>or speech-language</u>			
20		path	nology assistant, the board's rules may allow for:			
21		a.	Waiver of the examination requirement if the applicant meets the requirements			
22			established by the board.			
23		b.	Consideration of education and experience in order to meet the education			
24			requirements.			
25	SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 43-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is created					
26	and enacted as follows:					
27	<u>Spe</u>	ech-	language pathology assistant - Supervising speech-language pathologist.			
28	A speech-language pathology assistant is licensed by the board to work under the					
29	supervision of a speech-language pathologist. A speech-language pathology assistant's scope					
30	of practice is limited to tasks the supervising speech-language pathologist delegates. The					
31	supervising speech-language pathologist shall assess the speech-language pathology					

1	assistant's training and skills in determining which tasks may be delegated. The supervising				
2	speech-language pathologist shall limit the delegated tasks to specific components of a speech				
3	and language program as set forth in treatment plans developed by the supervising speech-				
4	language pathologist.				
5	SEC	CTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-37-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
6	amended and reenacted as follows:				
7	43-37-05. Board of examiners on audiology and speech-language pathology.				
8	1.	The board of examiners on audiology and speech-language pathology is hereby			
9		established.			
10	2.	The board must beis composed of eight members appointed by the governor.			
11		Appointees must be residents of this state for at least one year immediately preceding			
12		their appointment and, except for the consumer member, must be engaged in			
13		rendering services to the public, in teaching, or in research in audiology or			
14		speech-language pathology for at least three years preceding their appointment. Two			
15		board members must be audiologists, four must be speech-language pathologists, one			
16		must be an otolaryngologist, and one must be a consumer.			
17	3.	Each board member shall hold office for three years and until a successor is appointed			
18		and qualified. The terms must be arranged so that no more than four terms expire on			
19		July first of each year. The governor shall fill vacancies for an unexpired term. No-			
20		personAn individual may not serve more than two successive terms.			
21	4.	The board shall meet at least twice each calendar year. Special meetings may be			
22		convened at the call of the chairman or at the written request of any three board			
23		members.			
24	5.	Five members of the board constitute a quorum. When an application for licensure is			
25		received, one member of the quorum must be engaged in the profession for which a			
26		license is sought. In the case of an application for licensure as a speech-language			
27		pathology assistant, a speech-language pathologist must be a member of the quorum.			
28	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-37-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
29	amended and reenacted as follows:				

- 1 **43-37-06.** Powers and duties of the board.
- 2 The board may employ personshire employees to assist the board in carrying out itsthe
- 3 <u>board's</u> duties under this chapter and <u>may</u> adopt rules for:
- 4 1. LicensingAnnual licensure.
- 5 2. Licensing fees not to exceed one hundred dollars per year.
- 6 3. Ethical standards of conduct.
- 7 4. Continuing competency and education.
- 8 5. License suspension<u>f</u> or revocation.
- 9 6. Carrying out the purposes of this chapter.
- 10 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 43-37-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 11 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 12 **43-37-08.** Compensation of board members.
- 13 Board members shallare entitled to receive compensation per day in the amount provided
- 14 for members of the legislative management under section 54-35-10 and shallare entitled to be
- 15 reimbursed for mileage and travel expenses necessarily incurred in the conduct of board
- 16 business at the same rate as state employees.
- 17 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 43-37-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 18 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 19 **43-37-09.** License examination.
- A separate examination must beis required for licensure in speech-language pathology
 or audiology. Any personAn individual may be licensed in both areas if that
 personindividual meets the respective gualifications of each area
- 22 personindividual meets the respective qualifications of each area.
- 2. The speech-language pathology examination and the audiology examination are
- examinations offered by organizations approved by the board. The board shall
- 25 maintain proof that all licensees have passed the required examination. The
- examination is not required for renewal of licenses, except as required by board rules.
- 27 SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-37-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 28 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 29 **43-37-13**. Suspension and revocation of licenseDisciplinary actions.
- The board may refuse to issue or renew a license, or may suspend, or revoke a
 license, or take other disciplinary action against a license if the licensee or

22	SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 43-37-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
23	amended and reenacted as follows:					
24	43-37-18. Penalty.					
25	Any person whothat violates this chapter is guilty of a class A misdemeanor.					
26	SECTION 12. REPEAL. Section 43-37-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.					
27	SECT		N 13. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective January 1, 2018.
