- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-04-11 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to clearly displaying letters and numbers on motor vehicle plates and the display of
- 3 number plates on a motorcycle or trailer.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-04-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

## 7 **39-04-11.** Display of number plates and tabs.

8 Except as Unless otherwise specifically provided by law, a personan individual may not 9 operate or drive a vehicle on the apublic highwayshighway of this state unless the vehicle has a 10 distinctive number assigned to it which by the department, and two number plates, bearing 11 the distinctive number conspicuously displayed, horizontally and in an upright position, one on 12 the front and one on the rear of the vehicle, each securely fastened, except number plates 13 assigned to a motorcycle, trailer, or house trailer must be attached to the rear thereof of the 14 house trailer. Number plates assigned to a motorcycle or trailer must be attached to the rear of 15 the motorcycle or trailer and may be displayed vertically. When only one number plate is 16 furnished for an apportioned vehicle licensedregistered under the international registration plan 17 as authorized in section 39-19-04, truck tractor, or semitrailer, the plate must be attached to the 18 front of the apportioned vehicle or truck tractor and the rear of the semitrailer. The bottom of 19 each number plate must be at a height of not less than twelve inches [30.48 centimeters] above 20 the level surface upon which the vehicle stands. Each plate must be mounted in a visible 21 manner that does not cover any words, letter, or number clearly displays the distinctive number 22 assigned to the vehicle and the name of the state on the plate. As far as is reasonably possible, 23 the plates must at all times be kept free and clear of mud, ice, or snow so as to be clearly visible 24 and all number plates, markers, or evidence of registration or licensing except for the current

- 1 year must be removed from the vehicle. All vehicle license plates issued by the department
- 2 continue to beare the property of the state of North Dakotadepartment for the period for which
- 3 the plates are valid. An annual registration tab or sticker for the current registration year must be
- 4 displayed on each number plate, in the area designated by the department for the tab or sticker,
- 5 in those years for which tabs or stickers are issued in lieu of number plates.
