- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 23-02.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to issuance of a certified copy of a fetal loss; and to amend and reenact
- 3 section 23-02.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to definitions in the Heath
- 4 Statistics Act.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 23-02.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

## 8 **23-02.1-01. Definitions.**

9 As used in this chapter:

- 1. "Authorized representative" means a person that has the legal authority to act on
   behalf of the person named on a record, including a personal representative or
   guardian.
- 13 2. "Certified" means a copy of the original record on file with the state department of
  14 health which is signed and sealed by the state registrar or deputy state registrar.
- 3. "Dead body" means a lifeless human body or parts of such body or bones thereof from
  the state of which it may reasonably be concluded that death recently occurred.
- 17 4. "Electronic birth registration system" means the electronic birth registration system18 maintained by the state department of health.
- 19 5. "Electronic death registration system" means the electronic death registration system20 maintained by the state department of health.
- 8. "Facts of death" means the demographic and personal information pertaining to anindividual's death.
- 7. "Fetal death" or "birth resulting in stillbirth" means death occurring before the complete
  expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of human conception. The death is

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1		indicated by the fact that after such expulsion or extraction the fetus does not breathe
2		or show any evidence of life such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical
3		cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles.
4	8.	"Filing" means the presentation of a record, report, or other information provided for in
5		this chapter of a birth, death, fetal death, adoption, marriage, divorce, or other event
6		as specified by the state health officer for registration by the state registrar.
7	9.	"Final disposition" means the burial, interment, cremation, removal from the state, or
8		other disposition of a dead body or fetus.
9	10.	"Health statistics" means data derived from records of birth, death, fetal death,
10		marriage, divorce, or other records relating to the health of the populace or the state of
11		the environment.
12	11.	"Institution" means any establishment, public or private, which provides inpatient
13		medical, surgical, or diagnostic care or treatment, or nursing, custodial, or domiciliary
14		care to two or more individuals unrelated by blood, or to which individuals are
15		committed by law.
16	12.	"Live birth" means the complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of
17		human conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, which after such
18		expulsion or extraction, breathes or shows any other evidence of life such as beating
19		of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary
20		muscles, whether or not the umbilical cord has been cut or the placenta is attached.
21	13.	"Medical certification" means the medical information pertaining to an individual's
22		death, including the cause and manner of death.
23	14.	"Miscarriage of birth" means the expulsion of a fetus from the womb, spontaneously or
24		as a result of an accident, before twenty weeks gestation.
25	<u>15.</u>	"Personal or real property interests" means ownership or other legal rights or duties
26		concerning personal or real property.
27	<del>15.<u>16.</u></del>	"Physician" means an individual authorized or licensed to practice medicine or
28		osteopathy under chapter 43-17.
29	<del>16.<u>17.</u></del>	"Registration" means the acceptance by the state registrar and incorporation into
30		official records, reports, or other records provided for in this chapter, of birth, death,

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- fetal death, marriage, divorce, or other records as may be determined by the state
   health officer.
- 3 <u>17.18.</u> "Relative" means an individual's current or surviving spouse, a parent or legal
  4 guardian, a child, a grandparent, or a grandchild. The state registrar may require proof
  5 of the relationship.
- 6 18.19. "Subregistrar" means a funeral director or other suitable individual from a licensed
  7 funeral home who is appointed by the state registrar for the purpose of issuing
  8 burial-transit permits.
- 9 <u>19.20.</u> "System of health statistics tabulation and analysis" includes the tabulation, analysis,
  10 and presentation or publication of statistical data derived from health statistics.
- 11 20.21. "System of vital records registration" includes the registration, collection, preservation,
  12 amendment, and certification of birth, death, fetal death, marriage, divorce, or other
- records as may be determined necessary by the state health officer or the state healthofficer's designee.
- 15 SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 23-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created16 and enacted as follows:
- 17 <u>Fetal loss.</u>
- 18 The state registrar may issue a certified copy of a fetal loss to an individual who
- 19 experiences a documented miscarriage of birth, if the individual provides to the state registrar a
- 20 completed fetal loss request form established by the state department of health which is signed
- 21 by the mother or the father and a letter signed by a hospital, physician, or other medical
- 22 attendant documenting proof of pregnancy and fetal loss.
