- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 19-02.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to specialty pharmacy services; to provide a penalty; and to provide for
- 3 application.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 19-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
6 and enacted as follows:

7 Specialty pharmacy services and patient access to pharmaceuticals - Pharmaceuti

8 benefits managers - Penalty.

13			<u>(1)</u>	Is not available for order or purchase by a retail community pharmacy and	
14				long-term care pharmacy, regardless of whether the drug is meant to be	
15				self-administered; and	
16			<u>(2)</u>	Requires special storage and has distribution or inventory limitations not	
17				available at a retail community pharmacy or long-term care pharmacy.	
18	1	<u>d.</u>	<u>"Thi</u>	rd-party payer" has the same meaning as in section 19-03.6-01.	
19	<u>2.</u>	<u>Alf</u>	reque	sted by a plan sponsor contracted payer, a pharmacy benefits manager or	
20	1	<u>thir</u>	d-part	y payer that has an ownership interest, either directly or through an affiliate or	
21		<u>sub</u>	sidiar	y, in a pharmacy shall disclose to athe plan sponsor contracted payer any

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1	<u>3.</u>	A pharmacy benefits manager or a pharmacy benefits manager's affiliates or					
2		subsidiaries may not own or have an ownership interest in a patient assistance					
3	I	program and a mail order specialty pharmacy, unless the pharmacy benefits manager,					
4		affiliate, or subsidiary agrees to fair competition, no self-dealing, and no interference					
5		with prospective economic advantage and establishes a firewall between the					
6		administrative functions and the mail order pharmacynot participate in a transaction					
7		that benefits the pharmacy benefits manager, affiliate, or subsidiary instead of another					
8		person owed a fiduciary duty.					
9	<u>4.</u>	A pharmacy benefits manager or third-party payer may not require pharmacy					
10		accreditation standards or recertification requirements to participate in a network					
11		which are inconsistent with, more stringent than, or in addition to the federal and state					
12		requirements for licensure as a pharmacy in this state.					
13	<u>5.</u>	A licensed pharmacy or pharmacist may dispense any and all drugs allowed under					
14		that license.					
15	<u>6.</u>	A pharmacy benefits manager or other third-party payer that violates this section is					
16		guilty of a class B misdemeanor for each violation occurrence.					
17	SECTION 2. APPLICATION. This Act applies to contracts and agreements in effect on and						
18	after the effective date of this Act.
