1	A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 39-21 of the North Dakota
2	Century Code, relating to requiring mud flaps on certain vehicles; to amend and reenact
3	sections 39-06.1-09 and 39-21-44.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to moving
4	violations and preventing sifting or leaking loads; and to provide a penalty.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:
6	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7	amended and reenacted as follows:
8	39-06.1-09. Moving violation defined.
9	For the purposes of sections 39-06.1-06 and 39-06.1-13, a "moving violation" means a
10	violation of section 39-04-22, subsection 1 of section 39-04-37, section 39-04-55, 39-06-01,
11	39-06-14, 39-06-14.1, 39-06-16, 39-08-20, 39-08-23, 39-08-24, 39-09-01, 39-09-01.1,
12	39-09-04.1, or 39-09-09, subsection 1 of section 39-12-02, section 39-12-04, 39-12-05,
13	39-12-06, 39-12-09, <u>39-21-44.1</u> , <u>section 3 of this Act.</u> 39-21-45.1, 39-24-02, or 39-24-09, except
14	subdivisions b and c of subsection 5 of section 39-24-09, or equivalent ordinances; or a
15	violation of the provisions of chapter 39-10, 39-10.2, or 39-21, or equivalent ordinances, except
16	subsection 5 of section 39-10-26, section 39-21-44, and subsections 2 and 3 of section
17	39-21-46, and those sections within those chapters which are specifically listed in subsection 1

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 39-21-44.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is

39-21-44.1. Vehicle to be constructed to prevent sifting or leaking loads - Covers or

No vehicle An individual may be driven or moved not operate a vehicle on any highway

- from dropping, sifting, leaking, or otherwise escaping therefrom, except that sand may
 be dropped for the purpose of securing traction, or water or other substance may be
 sprinkled on a roadway in cleaning or maintaining the roadway. No personwithin or on
 the vehicle.
 - 2. An individual may not operate on any highway any vehicle with any load unless the load and any covering thereonon the vehicle is securely fastened so as to prevent saidthe covering or load from becoming loose, detached, or in any manner a hazard to other users of the highway.
 - 3. An individual may not operate a commercial motor vehicle hauling soil, sand, rocks, rock chips, gravel, silica, trash, or garbage, on a public road or highway unless the load is covered and secured with a close-fitting tarpaulin or other appropriate cover, or a device designed to reasonably ensure the cargo will not drop, blow, leak, or otherwise escape.
 - 4. This section does not apply to:
 - a. Sand being dropped for the purpose of securing traction, or water or other
 substance being sprinkled on a roadway in cleaning or maintaining the roadway;
 - b. Farm vehicles carrying agricultural products locally from a harvest site, or to or from a farm;
 - c. The operation of highway maintenance vehicles engaged in removing snow or ice from the roadway; or
 - d. A vehicle owned or operated by the state or a political subdivision.
 - **SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 39-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Mud flaps required.

1. A commercial motor vehicle registered for over ten thousand pounds [4535.92 kilograms] must be equipped with mud flaps for the rear wheels when operated on a public road or highway. The mud flaps must be wide enough to cover the full tread width of the tire being protected, and must be constructed of a rigid material or a flexible material of a sufficiently rigid character to provide adequate protection when the vehicle is in motion.

- 1 2. This section does not apply to farm implements or to a vehicle not required to be
