- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 16.1-08.1-03.1, 16.1-08.1-03.13, and
- 2 16.1-08.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to contributions to and expenditures of
- 3 campaigns for initiated or referred measures.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 16.1-08.1-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 16.1-08.1-03.1. Contributions statement required of persons and measure committees circulating or promoting passage or defeat of initiated or referred measure.
 - 1. Any person or measure committee, as described in section 16.1-08.1-01, that is soliciting or accepting a contribution for the purpose of aiding or opposing the circulation or passage of a statewide initiative or referendum petition or measure placed upon a statewide ballot by action of the legislative assembly at any election shall file a statement in accordance with this subsection if the person has received any contribution in excess of one hundred dollars. The statement must include the name and mailing address of each person that contributed in excess of one hundred dollars to the person, the amount of each reportable contribution, and the date each reportable contribution was received. The statement must include
 - 2. Any person or measure committee that is soliciting or accepting a contribution for the purpose of aiding or opposing the circulation or passage of a statewide initiative or referendum petition or measure placed upon a statewide ballot by action of the legislative assembly at any election shall file a statement with the secretary of state on the first business day of each week which includes the name and mailing address of each recipient of an expenditure exceeding one hundred dollars in the aggregate, the amount of each reportable expenditure, and the date the expenditure was made.

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- If a person or measure committee that is soliciting or accepting a contribution for the purpose of aiding or opposing the circulation or passage of a statewide initiative or referendum petition or measure placed upon a statewide ballot by action of the legislative assembly at any election receives any contribution of two hundred dollars in the aggregate, the person or committee shall file with the secretary of state a statement listing the name and street address of that contributor within seventy-two hours of the receipt of the contribution.
 - A person or measure committee as described in section 16.1-08.1-01 whichthat is 2.4. soliciting or accepting a contribution for the purpose of aiding or opposing the circulation or passage of a statewide initiative or referendum petition or measure placed upon a statewide ballot by action of the legislative assembly may not accept a contribution of more than one hundred dollars from an out-of-state person or political committee unless the contribution is accompanied by a certified statement from the contributor listing the name, address, and amount contributed by each person that contributed more than one hundred dollars of the contribution. The certified statement from the out-of-state contributor must indicate if no person contributed in excess of one hundred dollars of the out-of-state person's or political committee's overall contribution. The certified statement must also list the occupation, employer, and principal place of business for each individual who contributed more than one hundred dollars of the contribution. The person soliciting or accepting a contribution for the purpose of aiding the circulation of a statewide initiative or referendum petition or of promoting passage or defeat of a statewide initiated or referred measure shall include this statement with the contribution statement required to be filed under subsection 1.
 - 5. A person, political action committee, or measure committee that is soliciting or accepting a contribution for the purpose of aiding or opposing the circulation or passage of a statewide initiative or referendum petition or measure placed upon a statewide ballot by action of the legislative assembly at any election may not accept contributions exceeding fifty percent of its aggregate contributions during any reporting period from out-of-state persons and may not accept more than thirty percent of its aggregate contributions during any reporting period from any individual contributor.

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- 1 The statement required of a person or measure committee under subsection 1 must 3.6. 2 be filed with the secretary of state no later than the thirty-second day before the date 3 of the election in which the measure appears or would have appeared on the ballot 4 complete from the beginning of that calendar year through the fortieth day before the 5 date of the election. A complete statement for the entire calendar year for each 6 statement required to be filed under this section must be filed no later than the 7 thirty-first day of January of the following year. Even, even if athe person required to 8 report according to this section has not received any contributions in excess of one 9 hundred dollars during the reporting period, the person shall file a statement as-10 required by this chapter. A statement filed according to this section during the reporting 11 period must show the following:
 - The gross total of all contributions received and expenditures made in excess of one hundred dollars;
 - The gross total of all contributions received and expenditures made of one hundred dollars, or less; and
 - c. The cash on hand in the filer's account at the start and close of the reporting period.
 - **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 16.1-08.1-03.13 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 16.1-08.1-03.13. Contribution statements required of initiated or referendum petition sponsoring committees Statement of petition sponsors.
 - At the time the sponsoring committee for an initiated or referendum petition requests approval of the secretary of state to circulate petitions for the purpose of placing a measure on the ballot, the committee also shall submit a statement disclosing the contributions received and the expenditures made relating to the petition.
 - 2. If a sponsoring committee receives any contribution of two hundred dollars in the aggregate, the committee shall file with the secretary of state a statement listing the name and street address of that contributor within seventy-two hours of the receipt of the contribution.
 - 3. A sponsoring committee shall file a statement with the secretary of state on the first business day of each week which includes the name and mailing address of each

- recipient of an expenditure, the amount of each expenditure, and the date the
 expenditure was made.
 - 4. At the time the sponsoring committee for an initiated or referendum petition submits signed petitions to the secretary of state, the committee also shall submit a complete statement disclosing the contributions received and expenditures made relating to the petition.
 - 3.5. If December thirty-first falls between the date the secretary of state approves the petition for circulation and the date the signed petitions are submitted to the secretary of state, a complete statement for the calendar year shall be filed no later than the thirty-first day of January of the following year.
 - 4.6. The sponsoring committee also shall file a complete statement for the calendar year in which the measure or referendum appeared or was to appear on the ballot and any other calendar year not covered by this section in which a contribution was received or an expenditure was made. This statement shall be filed no later than the thirty-first day of January of the following year.
 - 6-7. A sponsoring committee may not accept a contribution of more than one hundred dollars from an out-of-state person or political committee unless the contribution is accompanied by a statement from the contributor listing the name, address, and amount contributed by each person that contributed more than one hundred dollars of the contribution. The statement from the out-of-state contributor must indicate if no person contributed in excess of one hundred dollars of the out-of-state person's or political committee's overall contribution. The statement must also list the occupation, employer, and principal place of business for each individual who contributed more than one hundred dollars of the contribution.

- 8. A sponsoring committee may not accept contributions exceeding fifty percent of its
 aggregate contributions from out-of-state persons and may not accept more than thirty
 percent of its aggregate contributions from any individual contributor.
 - 9. Except for the statements required of under subsections 2 and 3, the statements required under this section must include:

1 The gross total of all contributions received and expenditures made in excess of 2 one hundred dollars; 3 b. The gross total of all contributions received and expenditures made of one 4 hundred dollars or less; 5 The cash on hand in the filer's account at the start and close of the reporting C. 6 period: 7 The name and mailing address of each person that contributed in excess of one d. 8 hundred dollars to the sponsoring committee: 9 e. The amount of each reportable contribution; The date each reportable contribution was received; 10 f. 11 The name and mailing address of each recipient of an expenditure exceeding g. 12 one hundred dollars in the aggregate; 13 h. Within one hundred eighty days after the approval of a petition to initiate or refer a 16 measure or to recall an official or after the submission of a petition to convene a grand 17 jury as provided under section 29-10.1-02, the sponsoring committee or the individual 18 responsible for submission of the petition shall file a statement with the secretary of 19 state which discloses whether petition circulators have been or will be paid for the 20 circulation of petitions and which lists the total amount of money paid or which is 21 expected to be paid to circulators. 22 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-08.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 23 amended and reenacted as follows: 24 16.1-08.1-04. Supplemental statement required on large contributions received after 25 original statement - Filing time. 26 If any candidate, political party, or political committee receives contributions in excess of 27 five hundred dollars in the aggregate within the thirty-nine days immediately preceding any 28 election from any individual contributor, that candidate, political party, political committee, or 29 person shall make and file a supplemental statement in the same form as required by section 30 16.1-08.1-02, 16.1-08.1-03, 16.1-08.1-03.1, 16.1-08.1-03.3, 16.1-08.1-03.8, 16.1-08.1-03.9,

16.1-08.1-03.10, 16.1-08.1-03.11, or 16.1-08.1-03.12 stating the name and street address of the

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- 1 contributor and the aggregated amount of the contribution and file the statement in the
- 2 appropriate office within forty-eight hours of the receipt of the contribution.
