| 1 | A concurrent resolution requesting the Legislative Management to study the current juvenile |
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| 2 | justice process, levels of collaboration among various service systems, implementation of |
| 3 | dispositional alternatives, and methods for improving outcomes for juveniles involved in the |
| 4 | process. |
| 5 | WHEREAS, within the judicial branch, the juvenile court system is responsible for the |
| 6 | adjudication and disposition of allegations that a juvenile is deprived, unruly, or has committed a |
| 7 | delinquent act; and |
| 8 | WHEREAS, in addition to the juvenile court process, other entities are involved in |
| 9 | addressing juvenile justice issues, including the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation |
| 10 | through the Division of Juvenile Services, the Department of Human Services, regional human |
| 11 | service centers, and a wide variety of treatment providers; and |
| 12 | WHEREAS, an effective resolution of juvenile justice issues must address recidivism, |
| 13 | improve service access, efficiently use system resources, and collaborate with other service |
| 14 | systems to identify the spectrum of needs of a juvenile involved in the system; and |
| 15 | WHEREAS, the current juvenile justice process has not been reviewed in almost thirty |
| 16 | years; and |
| 17 | WHEREAS, the current process poses concerns for ensuring the most effective use of |
| 18 | probation services, access to adequate support services, the potential for unwarranted |
| 19 | institutional placements, and the need to distinguish between deprived juveniles and unruly and |
| 20 | delinquent juveniles with respect to dispositions and service access. |
| 21 | NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE |
| 22 | HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN: |
| 23 | That the Legislative Management consider studying the current juvenile justice process, the |

appropriate age when a juvenile is considered capable of committing a criminal offense, levels

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- 1 of collaboration among various service systems, implementation of dispositional alternatives,
- 2 and methods for improving outcomes for juveniles involved in the process; and
- 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Management report its findings and
- 4 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
- 5 the Sixty-sixth Legislative Assembly.
