Bismarck, December 6, 2016

The House convened at 9:00 a.m., with Speaker Bellew presiding.

The prayer was offered by Pastor Rich Wyatt, Living Hope Nazarene, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present except Representatives Rick C. Becker, Kreidt, Marschall, Paur, Schatz, Schmidt, Schobinger, Simons, and Zubke.

A guorum was declared by the Speaker.

MOTION

REP. VIGESAA MOVED that a committee of three be appointed to notify the Governor and the Senate that the House is organized and ready to transact business, which motion prevailed. Speaker Devlin appointed Reps. Brabandt, Rohr, and O'Brien to the committee.

ANNOUNCEMENT

SPEAKER BELLEW ANNOUNCED that the House would stand at ease to receive the Senate for a Joint Session.

JOINT SESSION

SPEAKER BELLEW CALLED the Joint Session to order and introduced Jim Smith, Director of the Legislative Council, for his report. Director Smith also gave the report of the Chairman of Legislative Management as Chairman Holmberg was absent due to snow.

John Bjornson, Legal Division Director of the Legislative Council, gave a presention on legislative ethics and laws and rules governing the activities and conduct of public officials.

ANNOUNCEMENT

SENATOR POOLMAN ANNOUNCED that a committee of three including Sens. Vedaa, Poolman, and Piepkorn had notified the Governor and the House that the Senate is organized and ready to transact business.

MOTION

REP. VIGESAA ANNOUNCED that there would be a short recess before the House would reconvene and moved that the Joint Session be dissolved, which motion prevailed.

THE HOUSE RECONVENED pursuant to recess taken, with Speaker Bellew presiding.

SPEAKER BELLEW CALLED upon House Majority Leader Carlson and Minority Leader Mock who gave their remarks on legislative ethics.
