SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.3-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-12.3-01. Student loan repayment programs - Health care professionals.

The health council shall administer student loan repayment programs, as established by this chapter, for health care professionals willing to provide services in areas of this state that have a defined need for such services <u>or willing to provide</u> <u>services as otherwise provided under this chapter</u>.

 - c. The health care professional's education and experience;
 - d. The health care professional's date of availability and anticipated term of availability; and
 - e. The health care professional's willingness to accept medicare and medicaid assignments, if applicable.
- 2. In Except as otherwise provided under this chapter, in selecting health care professionals for participation in the program the health council shall require that the individual:
 - a. Is physically present at and provides services on a full-time basis to an entity that meets the requirements of section 43-12.3-04; or
 - b. (1) Is physically present at and provides services on at least a halftime basis to an entity that meets the requirements of section 43-12.3-04;
 - (2) Provides telehealth services to a second entity that meets the requirements of section 43-12.3-04; and
 - (3) Verifies that the services provided under paragraphs 1 and 2 are equal to the full-time requirement of subdivision a.

- 3. In selecting health care professionals for participation in a program, the health council may consider an individual's:
 - a. Length of residency in this state; and
 - b. Attendance at an in-state or an out-of-state institution of higher education.

43-12.3-06. Student loan repayment program - Contract.

- 1. The health council shall enter into a contract with a selected health care professional. The health council shall agree to provide student loan repayments on behalf of the selected health care professional subject to the requirements and limitations of this section.

 - (1) The loan repayment must be equal to twenty thousand dollars per year; and
 - (2) The matching funds must equal fifty percent of the amount required in paragraph 1.
 - b. For a clinical psychologist:
 - (1) The loan repayment must be equal to twelve thousand dollars per year; and
 - (2) The matching funds must equal twenty-five percent of the amount required in paragraph 1.
 - c. For an advanced practice registered nurse or a physician assistant:
 - (1) The loan repayment must be equal to four thousand dollars per year; and
 - (2) The matching funds must equal ten percent of the amount required in paragraph 1.
 - d. (1) For a behavioral health professional:
 - (a) The loan repayment must be equal to four thousand dollars per year; and
 - (b) The matching funds must equal ten percent of the amount required in subparagraph a.
 - (2) For purposes of this subdivision, a behavioral health professional means an individual who practices in the behavioral health field and is:
 - (a) A licensed addiction counselor;
 - (b) A licensed professional counselor;
 - (c) A licensed social worker;
 - (d) A registered nurse; or
 - (e) A specialty practice registered nurse.
 - e. For a nursing program faculty student:

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- (1) The loan repayment may not be more than two thousand dollars per year;
- (2) For purposes of this subdivision, a qualified nursing faculty student:
 - (a) Must be a member of a nursing program faculty at an institution of higher education located in this state who advanced that faculty member's education through a master's degree or doctorate degree;
 - (b) Must have been employed full-time as a nursing program faculty member at an institution of higher education located in this state while pursuing the advanced degree; and
 - (c) Following completion of the advanced degree, shall continue full-time employment as a nursing program faculty member at an institution of higher education located in this state; and
- (3) This loan repayment program is not subject to private or public entity participation under sections 43-12.3-03 and 43-12.3-04 and subsection 2 of section 43-12.3-05.
- 2. a. Payments under this section must be made on behalf of the health care professional directly to the Bank of North Dakota or to another participating lending institution.
 - b. Except as otherwise provided, payments under this section may be made only at the conclusion of each twelve month period of service.
 - c. Prorated payments may be made only if:
 - (1) The repayment of the loan requires less than a full annual payment;
 - (2) The health care professional is terminated or resigns from hisor herthat professional's position; or
 - (3) The health care professional is unable to complete a twelvemonth period of service due to the individual's death, a certifiable medical condition or disability, or a call to military service.

AIRPORT CONSTRUCTION. The Bank of North Dakota shall provide a letter of credit to a city, in the northwest corner of the state with a population over twenty thousand residents, which is constructing an airport and is subject to the bonding requirements under section 52-04-06.1. The letter of credit shall cover the length of the construction term not to exceed five years. The Bank of North Dakota shall charge a one-time fee of no more than three quarters of one percent of the total amount of the letter of credit. The city obtaining the letter of credit assumes all liability for the letter of credit, the fee to be paid to the Bank of North Dakota, and any other requirements under section 52-04-06.1."
