The board may grant a nonrenewable temporary permit to an applicant for initial or renewed license or registration who submits to a criminal history record check as required by this chapter if the applicant has met all other licensure or registration requirements in accordance with subsection 2 of section 43-12.1-09. The board may not share with, or disclose to, the interstate commission of nurse licensure compact administrators any contents of a nationwide criminal history record check."

FIRST READING OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

HCR 3019: A concurrent resolution directing the United States Department of the Interior to exercise nondiscrimination in public land management and return the land no longer required for the Pick-Sloan Missouri Basin Project dam at Lake Sakakawea to the citizens of the United States.

Was read the first time and referred to the Energy and Natural Resources Committee.
