1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state water

- 2 commission; to amend and reenact section 61-02-79 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 3 relating to the authorization of a Bank of North Dakota line of credit; to provide for Red River

4 valley water supply requirements; to provide an exemption; to provide for a report to the

- 5 legislative management; to provide conditions on appropriations; to provide statements of
- 6 legislative intent; and to declare an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 9 as may be necessary, are appropriated from special funds derived from federal funds and other 10 income, to the state water commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state 11 water commission, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 12 30, 2021, as follows:

17	committees of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the					
18	period beginning with the effective date	of this Act, and er	nding June 30, 2021.			
19	SECTION 3. EXEMPTION - GRANTS - WATER-RELATED PROJECTS - CARRYOVER					
20	AUTHORITY. Section 54-44.1-11 does not apply to funding for grants or water-related projects					
21	included in the project carryover, water supply - grants, rural water supply - grants, Fargo area					
22	flood control including the Fargo Moorhead diversion, Mouse River flood control, flood control					
23	projects other than Fargo area flood control including the Fargo Moorhead diversion, and					
24	general water - grants line items in section 1 of this Act. However, this exclusion is only in effect					
25	for two years after June 30, 2021. Any unexpended funds appropriated from the resources trust					
26	fund after that period has expired must be transferred to the resources trust fund and any					
27	unexpended funds appropriated from the water development trust fund after that period has					
28	expired must be transferred to the water development trust fund.

30	APPROVAL. In addition to the amounts	appropriated in s	ection 1 of this Act, an	y additional		

31 amounts in the resources trust fund and water development trust fund which become available

1 are appropriated, subject to budget section approval, to the state water commission for the 2 purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and 3 ending June 30, 2021. Before approving any request, the budget section shall determine: 4 Approving additional appropriations will not negatively affect the sixty-seventh 1. 5 legislative assembly's ability to address water-related needs; 6 2. The proposed use of the additional income complies with legislative intent; and 7 3. The proposed use of the additional income will not result in future funding 8 commitments. 9 SECTION 5. CONDITION ON FARGO AREA FLOOD CONTROL LINE ITEM. The 10 \$66,500,000 appropriated to the state water commission for Fargo area flood control including 11 the Fargo Moorhead diversion in section 1 of this Act for the period beginning with the effective 12 date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2021, may be used only for Fargo area flood control 13 projects including the Fargo Moorhead area diversion, and the appropriation of those funds is 14 conditioned on having no other funds appropriated in section 1 being expended on Fargo area 15 flood control including the Fargo Moorhead diversion. This condition does not prohibit the use of 16 funds appropriated for project carryover in section 1 of this Act for Fargo area flood control 17 projects, subject to section 7 of this Act. 18 SECTION 6. CONDITION ON OTHER SECTION 1 LINE ITEMS. The \$593,320,273 19 appropriated to the state water commission for salaries and wages, operating expenses, capital 20 assets, water supply - grants, rural water supply - grants, Mouse River flood control, flood 21 control projects other than Fargo area flood control including the Fargo Moorhead diversion, 22 and general water - grants in section 1 of this Act for the period beginning with the effective date 23 of this Act, and ending June 30, 2021, may be used only for salaries and wages, operating 24 expenses, capital assets, water supply - grants, rural water supply - grants, Mouse River flood 25 control, flood control projects other than Fargo area flood control including the Fargo Moorhead 26 diversion, and general water - grants, respectively, and the appropriation of those funds is 27 conditioned on the funds not being expended on Fargo area flood control projects including the 28 Fargo Moorhead diversion. 29 SECTION 7. CONDITION ON PROJECT CARRYOVER FUNDS. The \$308,333,818

appropriated to the state water commission for project carryover in section 1 of this Act for the
period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2021, may be used

1	only for project carryover, and the appropriation of those funds is conditioned on having no					
2	more than the amount the state water commission approved for Fargo area flood control					
3	includin	including the Fargo Moorhead diversion by April 1, 2019, expended from the project carryover				
4	funds o	funds on Fargo area flood control including the Fargo Moorhead diversion.				
5	SE	CTION 8. CONDITION ON APPROPRIATIONS. The \$66,500,000 appropriated to the				
6	state wa	state water commission for Fargo area flood control including the Fargo Moorhead diversion in				
7	section 1 of this Act and the amount the state water commission approved for Fargo area flood					
8	control including the Fargo Moorhead diversion by April 1, 2019, which amount is included in					
9	project carryover funds appropriated in section 1 of this Act, may not be used for any work					
10	under Plan B for the Fargo Moorhead diversion project; except for constructing or repairing					
11	levees and dikes and purchasing land, easements, and options or rights of first refusal to					
12	purchase land, necessary for flood control; until:					
13	1.	The federal court injunction on Plan B is modified to allow construction of Plan B to				
14		continue;				
15	2.	The Congress of the United States appropriates federal funds for construction of				
16		Plan B;				
17	3.	The state engineer approves the mitigation plan for Plan B;				
18	4.	The office of state engineer issues all necessary permits the state engineer requires				
19		for Plan B; and				
20	5.	The Minnesota state legislature appropriates funds for construction of Plan B.				
21	SE	CTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - FARGO FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT FUNDING. It				
22	is the in	tent of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly that the state provide a portion of the local				
23	cost-share of Fargo flood control projects, including constructing a federally authorized Fargo					
24	flood control project, and that total Fargo flood control project funding to be provided by the					
25	state not exceed \$703,000,000, which includes \$120,000,000 originally designated for Fargo					
26	interior flood control. It is the intent of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly that the \$332,500,000					
27	yet to be designated by the state for the Fargo flood control project be made available in equal					
28	installments over the next five bienniums, beginning July 1, 2019.					
29	SECTION 10. FARGO FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT DOWNSTREAM IMPACT					
30	MITIGA	TION. The Fargo Moorhead metropolitan flood risk management project operations may				
31	not cause a downstream federal emergency management agency accredited flood protection					

1 system in North Dakota to lose its accreditation. The metropolitan flood diversion authority shall 2 take reasonable measures to mitigate downstream impacts to accredited flood protection 3 systems, existing as of April 1, 2019, located in North Dakota bordering the Red River resulting 4 from the operations of the Fargo Moorhead diversion. For purposes of this section, negative 5 downstream impacts to accredited flood protection systems are caused when the water surface 6 profile passing through such systems is raised by more than one-tenth of one foot for the one 7 hundred year event or when the ability of the accredited flood protection system to protect 8 against a two hundred year or five hundred year event is compromised. The metropolitan flood 9 diversion authority shall collaborate with the state engineer and accredited flood protection 10 systems in North Dakota to implement this requirement. 11 SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - MOUSE RIVER FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT

12 **FUNDING.** Except for funding provided during bienniums prior to the 2017-19 biennium, it is the 13 intent of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly that the state provide no more than \$193,000,000 of 14 state funding for Mouse River flood control projects within the city limits of Minot. It is the intent 15 of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly that the \$193,000,000 be made available during the 16 2017-19, 2019-21, 2021-23, and 2023-25 bienniums. It is the intent of the sixty-sixth legislative 17 assembly that of the \$193,000,000, the state provide \$57,713,284 during the 2017-19 biennium 18 and that the \$135,286,716 yet to be designated by the state for the Mouse River flood control 19 projects, within the city limits of Minot, be provided during the 2019-21, 2021-23, and 2023-25 20 bienniums.

21 SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - RED RIVER VALLEY WATER SUPPLY

22 **PROJECT - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT - APPLICATION.** It is the intent of 23 the sixty-sixth legislative assembly that the state water commission provide, in the form of a 24 grant, up to \$13,000,000, to the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District for the Red River 25 valley water supply project, to initiate construction of phase one prioritized project features 26 identified in accordance with subsections 2 and 3 of section 14 of this Act, for the period 27 beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2021. The Garrison Diversion 28 Conservancy District shall report on a regular basis to the legislative management's water 29 topics overview committee during the 2019-20 interim regarding the progress of the Red River 30 valley water supply project. The provisions of section 13 of this Act do not apply to the funding 31 referenced in this section.

2	It is the intent of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly that the state water commission provide no		
3	more that	an \$30	0,000,000 to the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District for the Red River valley
4	water su	pply	project during the 2019-21 biennium and 2021-23 biennium and that the state
5	funding l	be pro	ovided at a sixty percent state cost-share.
6	SECTION 14. RED RIVER VALLEY WATER SUPPLY PROJECT - REPORT TO		
7	LEGISL	ΑΤΙν	E MANAGEMENT - BUDGET SECTION APPROVAL. Any funding received by the
8	Garrison	ı Dive	rsion Conservancy District from the state water commission for the Red River
9	valley wa	ater s	upply project during the 2017-19 biennium and the biennium beginning July 1,
10	2019, ar	nd end	ding June 30, 2021, is subject to the following requirements:
11	1.	Any	funding received for the completion of the planning and permitting process of the
12		Red	River valley water supply project must result in the following accomplishments:
13		a.	The completed Red River valley water supply plan document, which will be the
14			basis and justification for project construction, must include alternative selection,
15			water supply needs, projected project costs, easement acquisitions,
16			environmental regulation compliance to include issuance of a final national
17			pollutant discharge elimination system permit, and acquisition of all other state
18			and federal permits required for the construction of any project features intended
19			to be constructed with funding provided during the 2017-19 biennium and the
20			2019-21 biennium;
21		b.	A signed bureau of reclamation water service contract agreeing to a minimum of
22			one hundred sixty-five cubic feet per second over a minimum of forty years or
23			equivalent to ensure an adequate water source for the project's needs;
24		C.	Prioritized project features for phase one construction; and
25		d.	A recommendation of funding options for all phases of the Red River valley water
26			supply project.
27	2.	The	state water commission shall review any associated appeals or litigation before
28		relea	asing any funds for the project.
29	3.	Any	funding received to initiate construction of phase one prioritized project features
30		iden	tified in subsection 1 may be spent and construction of phase one may begin only
31		after	the budget section receives and approves certification from the state water

- commission and the state engineer that all items listed in subsection 1 have been
 accomplished.
- Quarterly progress reports on the Red River valley water supply project from the
 Garrison Diversion Conservancy District to the water topics overview committee of the
 legislative management, during the 2019-21 interim.

6 SECTION 15. AMENDMENT. Section 61-02-79 of the North Dakota Century Code is

7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 61-02-79. Bank of North Dakota - Line of credit.

9 The Bank of North Dakota shall extend a line of credit not to exceed seventy-five million

- 10 dollars at a rate of one and one-half percent over the three month London interbank offered
- 11 rate, but may not exceed three percent to the state water commission. The state water
- 12 commission shall repay the line of credit from funds available in the resources trust fund, water
- 13 development trust fund, or other funds, as appropriated by the legislative assembly. The state
- 14 water commission may access the line of credit, as necessary, to provide funding as authorized
- by the legislative assembly for water supply projects approved before June 30, 20192021, and
- 16 flood control projects that have approval for funding before June 30, 20192021.
- 17 SECTION 16. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
