4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-13-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 15.1-13-10. Criteria for teacher licensure.
- The board shall establish by rule the criteria for teacher licensure and the process for
 issuing teaching licenses. The criteria must include considerations of character,
 adequate educational preparation, and general fitness to teach.
 - The board may not require a teacher who graduated from an accredited teacher education program on or before September 1, 1980, to earn any college credits in native American or other multicultural courses as a condition of licensure or license renewal.
- This section does not affect the validity of teaching certificates in effect on July 31, 2001.
 - 4. This section does not affect the qualifications for career and technical education certificates, as otherwise established by law.
 - 5. The board shall grant an initial license to an individual who:
- 20 <u>a. Possesses a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution;</u>
- b. Passes a criminal history record check required by section 15.1-13-14; and
- 22 <u>c. Successfully completes the American board for certification of teacher</u>
 23 <u>excellence</u>an alternative teacher certification program operated by a nonprofit

3	(1) Operates in at least five states;		
4	(2) Has operated an alternative teacher certification program for at least ten		
5		<u>years; and</u>	
6		(3) Requires applicants to pass a subject area and pedagogy examination,	
7		known as the professional teaching knowledge examination, to receive	
8		certification.	
9	<u>6.</u>	An individual who obtains an initial license under subsection 5 is authorized to teach	
10	1	the subject and educational levels for which the individual has successfully completed	
11		the American board for certification of teacher excellence alternative teacher	
12		certification program described under subsection 5.	
13	7.	Upon completing two years of teaching under an initial license issued under	
14		subsection 5, the licensee is eligible to apply for a five-year renewal license if the	
15		individual:	
16		a. Completes the program's clinical experience program and the North Dakota	
17		teacher support system approved mentor program;	
18		b. Meets the requirements of section 15.1-13-35 within two years of initial licensure;	
19		<u>and</u>	
20		c. Meets the requirements of human resources and cultural directives required	
21		coursework within two years of initial licensure which includes Native American	
22		studies, cultural diversity, strategies for creating learning environments that	
23		contribute to positive human relationships, and strategies for teaching and	
24		assessing diverse learners.	
25	8.	An individual who obtains an initial or renewal license is authorized to teach in the	
26	subject areas of:		
27	-	a. Elementary education;	
28		b. English language arts;	
29		c. United States and world history;	
30		d. Mathematics;	
31		e. General science;
