- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-02.4, 15.1-21-02.5, 15.1-21-02.6, and
- 2 15.1-21-02.8 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to eligibility for the North Dakota
- 3 career and technical education scholarship and the North Dakota academic scholarship for high
- 4 school students enrolled in dual-credit courses.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 15.1-21-02.4. North Dakota career and technical education scholarship.

9 Any resident student who graduates from a high school during or after the 2010-11 school

10 year and; any resident student who completes a program of home education supervised in

11 accordance with chapter 15.1-23 during or after the 2012-13 school year: and any resident high

12 school student enrolled in a science, mathematics, English, or computer science dual-credit or

13 <u>early entry course for which college credit is earned</u> is eligible to receive a North Dakota career

14 and technical education scholarship provided the student:

- Completed four units of English language arts from a sequence that includes literature,

1 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is

2 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 15.1-21-02.6. North Dakota scholarship - Amount - Applicability.

- 4 1. The state board of higher education shall provide to any student certified as а. 5 being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either a North Dakota 6 academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and technical education 7 scholarship in the amount of seven hundred fifty dollars for each semester during 8 which the student is enrolled full time at an accredited institution of higher 9 education in this state, maintains a cumulative grade point average of 2.75, and 10 maintains progress toward degree completion. For a resident high school student 11 enrolled in a dual-credit course for which college credit is earned, the state board 12 of higher education shall provide a North Dakota academic scholarship in an 13 amount equal to the tuition rate for the number of college credits equivalent to the 14 dual-credit course in which the student is enrolled. The amount may not exceed 15 the highest tuition rate for an equivalent college credit at an institution of higher 16 education under the control of the state board of higher education. 17 b. The state board of higher education shall provide to any student certified as 18 being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either a North Dakota 19 academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and technical education 20 scholarship in the amount of five hundred dollars for each quarter during which 21 the student is enrolled full time at an accredited institution of higher education in 22 this state, maintains a cumulative grade point average of 2.75, and maintains 23 progress toward degree completion. For a resident high school student enrolled 24 in a dual-credit course for which college credit is earned, the state board of 25 higher education shall provide a North Dakota academic scholarship in an
- 26 amount equal to the tuition rate for the number of college credits equivalent to the
- 27 <u>dual-credit course in which the student is enrolled. The amount may not exceed</u>
 28 the highest tuition rate for an equivalent college credit at an institution of higher
- 29 education under the control of the state board of higher education.
- 30 2. The state board shall monitor each scholarship recipient to ensure that the student
 31 meets the academic and other requirements of this section. Upon determining that a

1		reci	pient student has failed to meet the requirements of this section, the board shall
2		pro	vide notification to the student within ten days.
3	3.	A st	udent is not entitled to receive more than six thousand dollars under this section,
4		<u>inclı</u>	uding payments for dual-credit or early entry courses.
5	4.	The	state board of higher education shall forward the scholarship directly to the
6		insti	tution in which the student is enrolled. If the student is a resident high school
7		<u>stuc</u>	ent currently enrolled in a dual-credit course for which college credit is earned and
8		the	student meets the requirements of subsections 8 and 11 of section 15.1-21-02.5,
9		the	state board of higher education shall forward the scholarship directly to the
10		<u>insti</u>	tution of higher education through which the dual-credit course was offered to the
11		<u>stuc</u>	lent.
12	5.	a.	(1) This section does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive
13			semesters.
14			(2) This section does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive
15			quarters.
16		b.	A scholarship under this section is valid onlyin any semester or quarter in which a
17			resident high school student is enrolled in a dual-credit course for which college
18			credit is earned and for six academic years after the student's graduation from
19			high school and<u>.</u> The scholarship may be applied to a graduate program.
20	6.	Asc	holarship under this section is available to any eligible resident student who fulfills
21		the	requirements of section 15.1-21-02.4 or 15.1-21-02.5 and who:

3			number of credits after each semester or quarter term disbursement to qualify for
4			the subsequent disbursement:
5			(1) Twenty-four credits after disbursement two;
6			(2) Thirty-nine credits after disbursement three;
7			(3) Fifty-four credits after disbursement four;
8			(4) Sixty-nine credits after disbursement five;
9			(5) Eighty-four credits after disbursement six; and
10			(6) Ninety-nine credits after disbursement seven.
11	SEC		4. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.8 of the North Dakota Century Code is
12	amende	d and	reenacted as follows:

15			average as determined by the state board of higher education at the conclusion
16			of a semester is below 2.75, the board shall grant an exception and provide the
17			North Dakota scholarship to which the student would otherwise be entitled for the
18			next semester in which the student is enrolled full time or enrolled in a dual-credit
19			course for which college credit is earned while in high school. The exception
20			provided by this section is applicable to a student only one time.
21		b.	If a student's cumulative grade point average as determined by the state board of
22			higher education at the conclusion of a semester is below 2.75 for a second time,
23			the student is no longer eligible to receive any additional North Dakota academic
24			or career and technical education scholarships.
25	2.	a.	Notwithstanding section 15.1-21-02.6, if a student's cumulative grade point
26			average as determined by the state board of higher education at the conclusion
27			of a quarter is below 2.75, the board shall grant an exception and provide the
28			North Dakota scholarship to which the student would otherwise be entitled for the
29			next quarter in which the student is enrolled full time or enrolled in a dual-credit
30			course for which college credit is earned while in high school. The exception
31			provided by this section is applicable to a student only one time.

- 1 b. If a student's cumulative grade point average as determined by the state board of
- 2 higher education at the conclusion of a quarter is below 2.75 for a second time,
- 3 the student is no longer eligible to receive any additional North Dakota academic
- 4 or career and technical education scholarships.
