- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 29-29 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to prohibiting entry onto private land without permission.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 29-29 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

5 and enacted as follows:

- 6 <u>Law enforcement entry onto private land without permission prohibited Exception.</u>
- As used in this section, "law enforcement officer" has the meaning provided in section.

- 9 <u>2.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law and subject to subsection 3, a law
- 10 <u>enforcement officer may not entersearch buildings or private land unless the law</u>
- 11 <u>enforcement officer receives permission from the landowner or a lessee of the land.</u>
- 12 <u>3.</u> <u>A law enforcement officer may enter private land without permission if:</u>
- 13a.Probable cause exists that a violation of law has occurred, is occurring, or is14about to occur;
- 15 <u>b.</u> <u>A search warrant has been issued; or</u>
- 16 <u>c.</u> <u>Responding to an emergency situation, accident, or other threat to public safety.</u>
- 17 <u>4.</u> Any property or contraband seized by a law enforcement officer in violation of
- 18 <u>subsection 2 may not be used as evidence against a defendant in any criminal</u>
- 19 proceeding.
